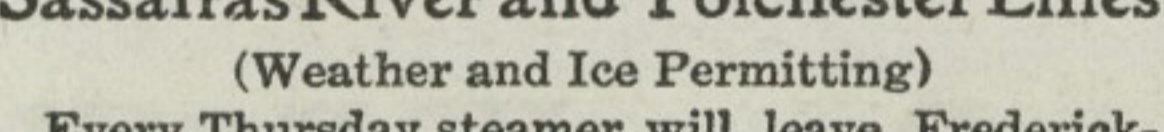

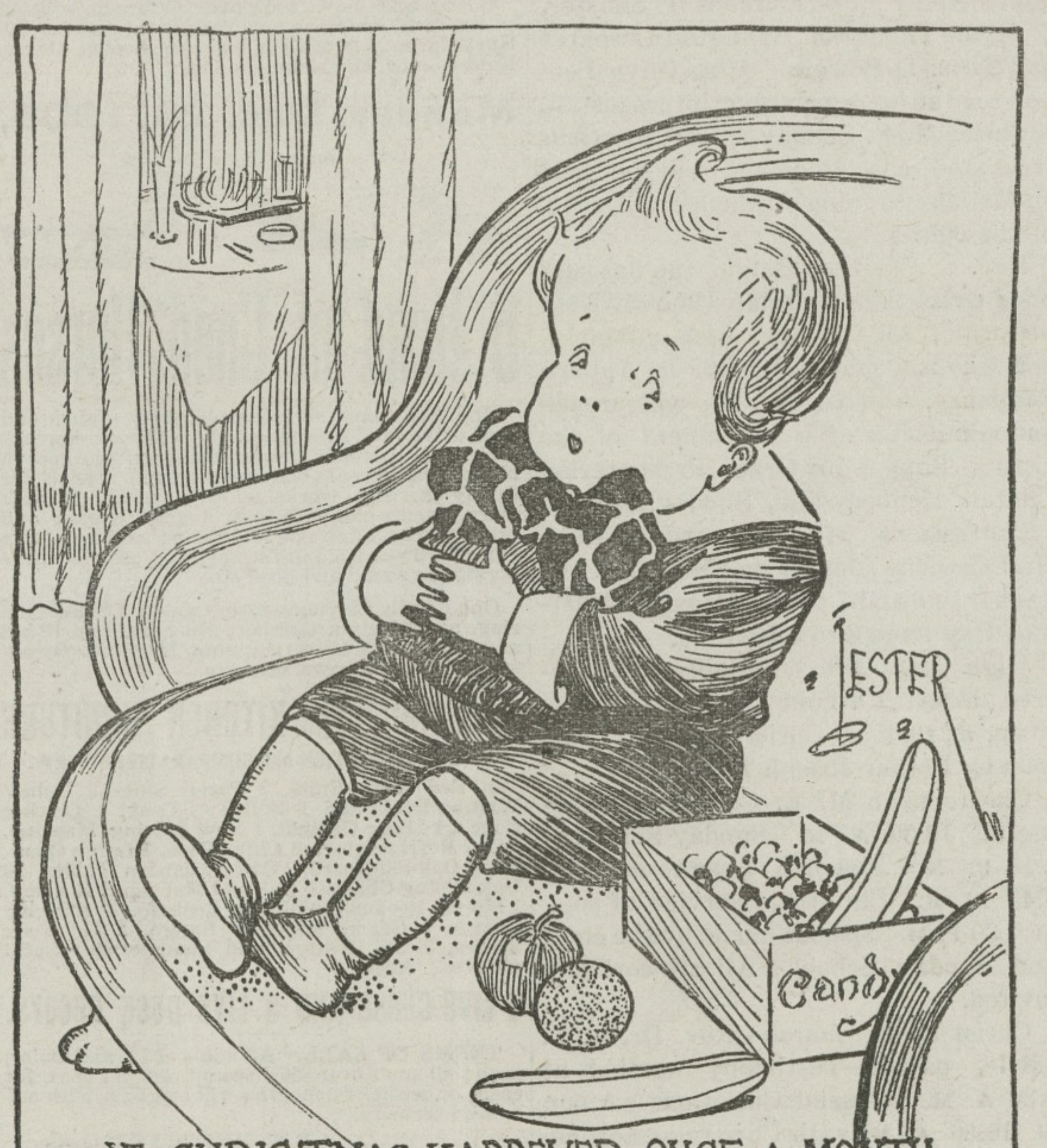

CHRISTMAS PIES.

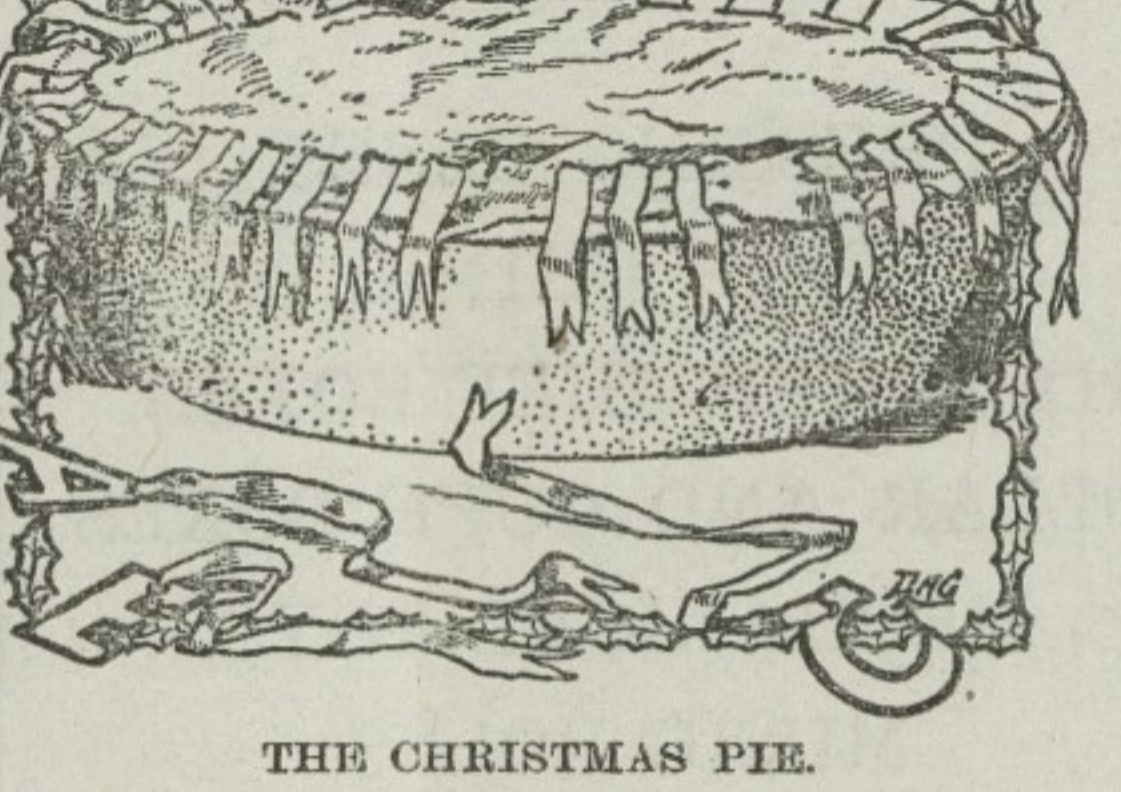
A Novel Sport for a Children's Party in Holiday Time.

Pictureque Method of Celebrating Yuletide by the Poles.

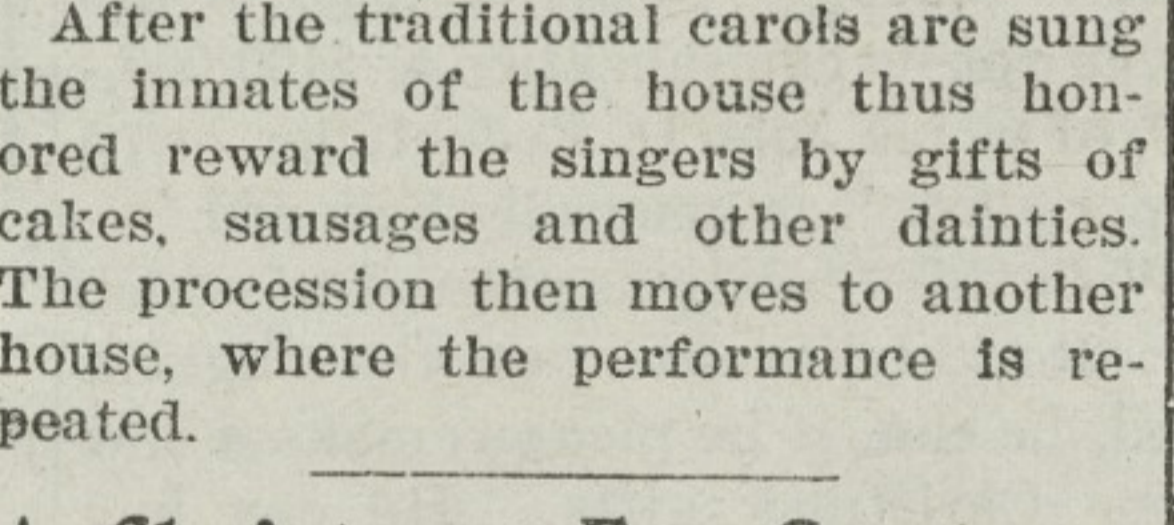

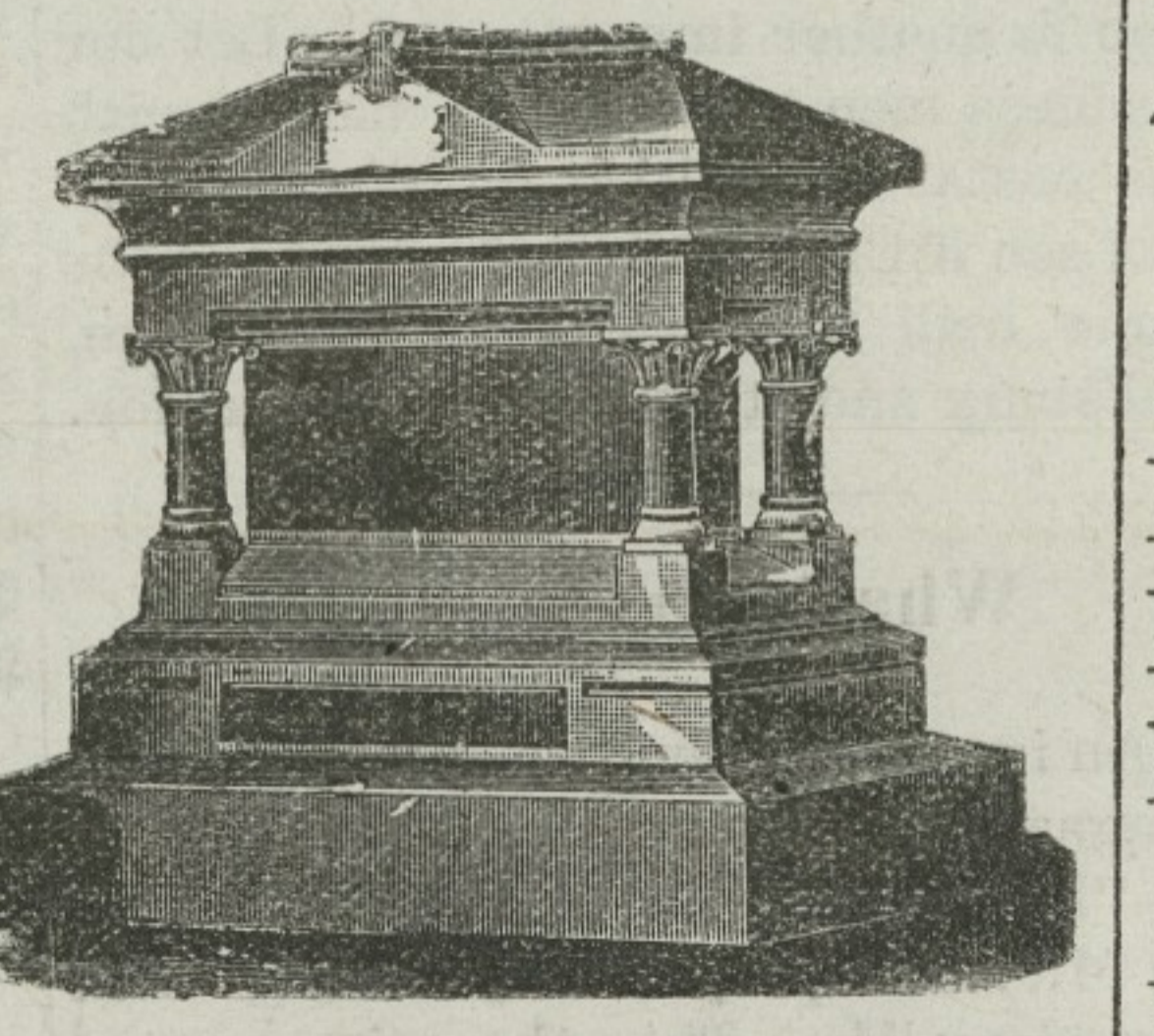
