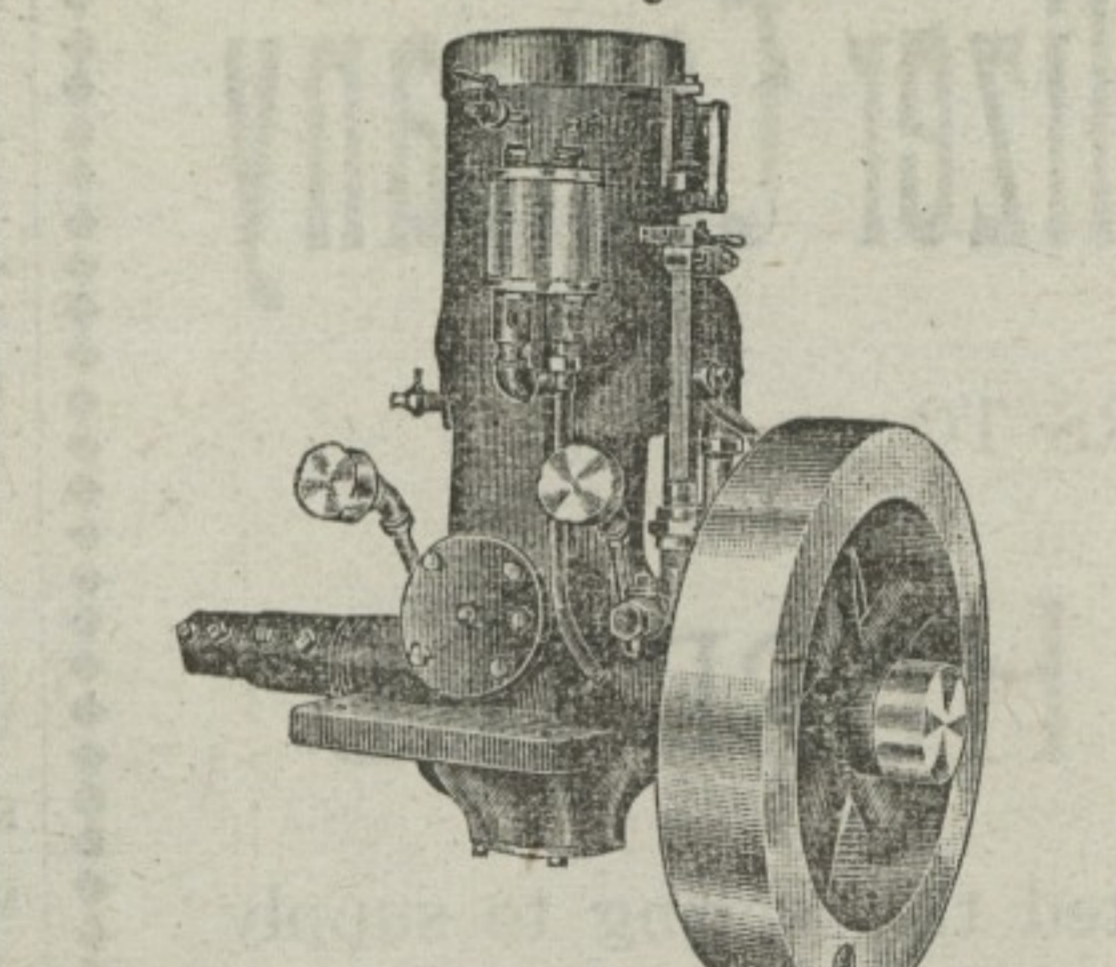
WEDDING BILLS.
