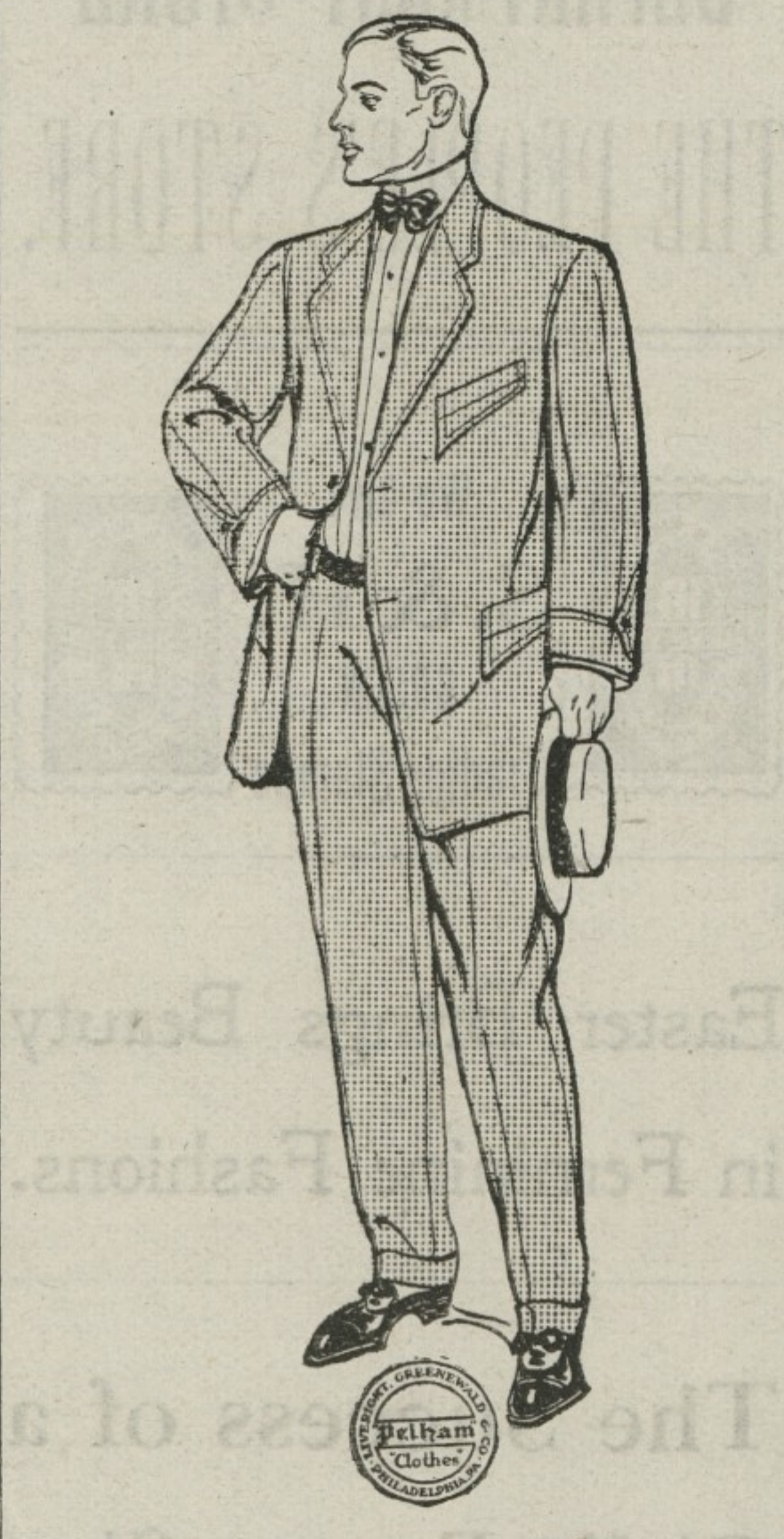

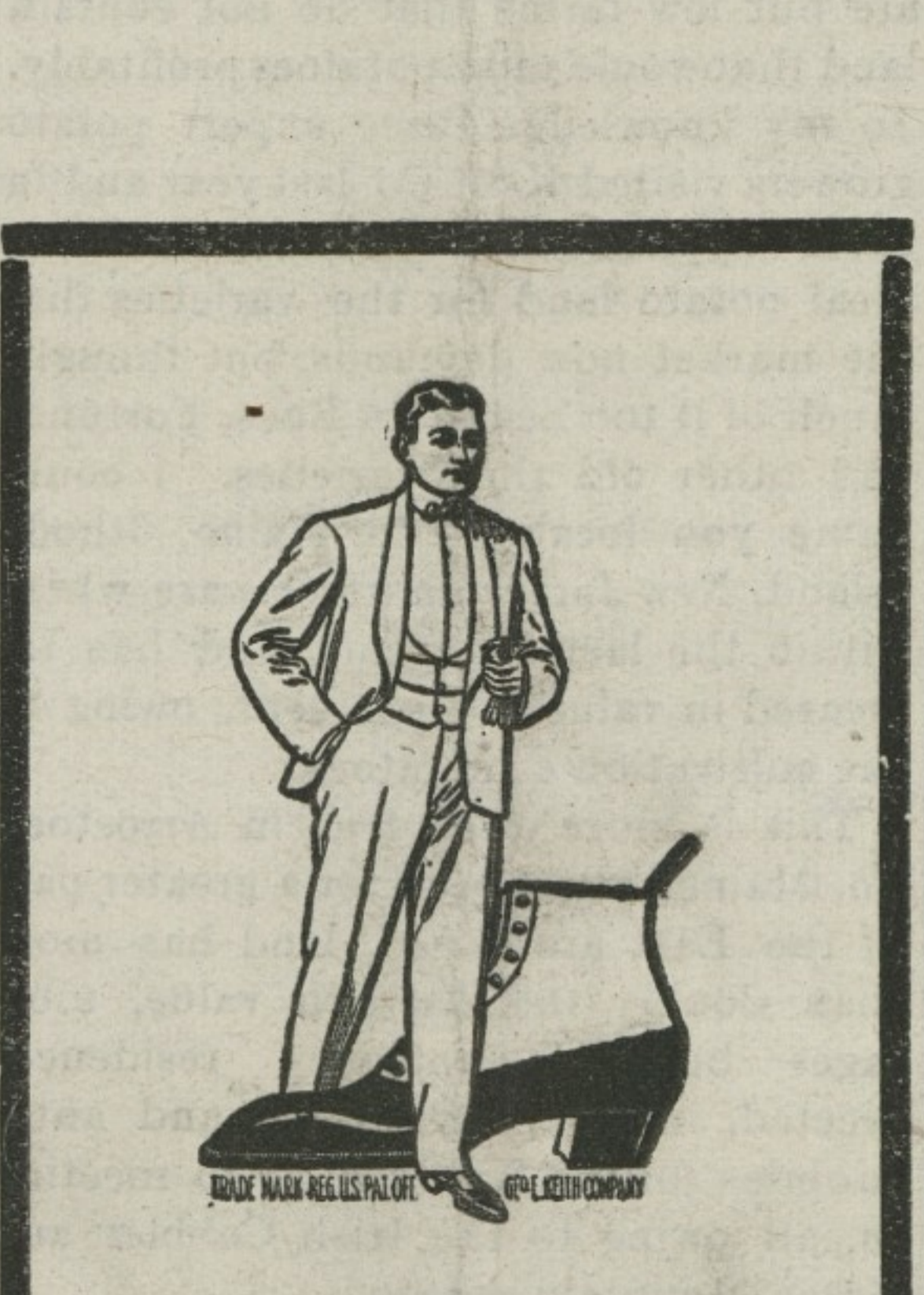

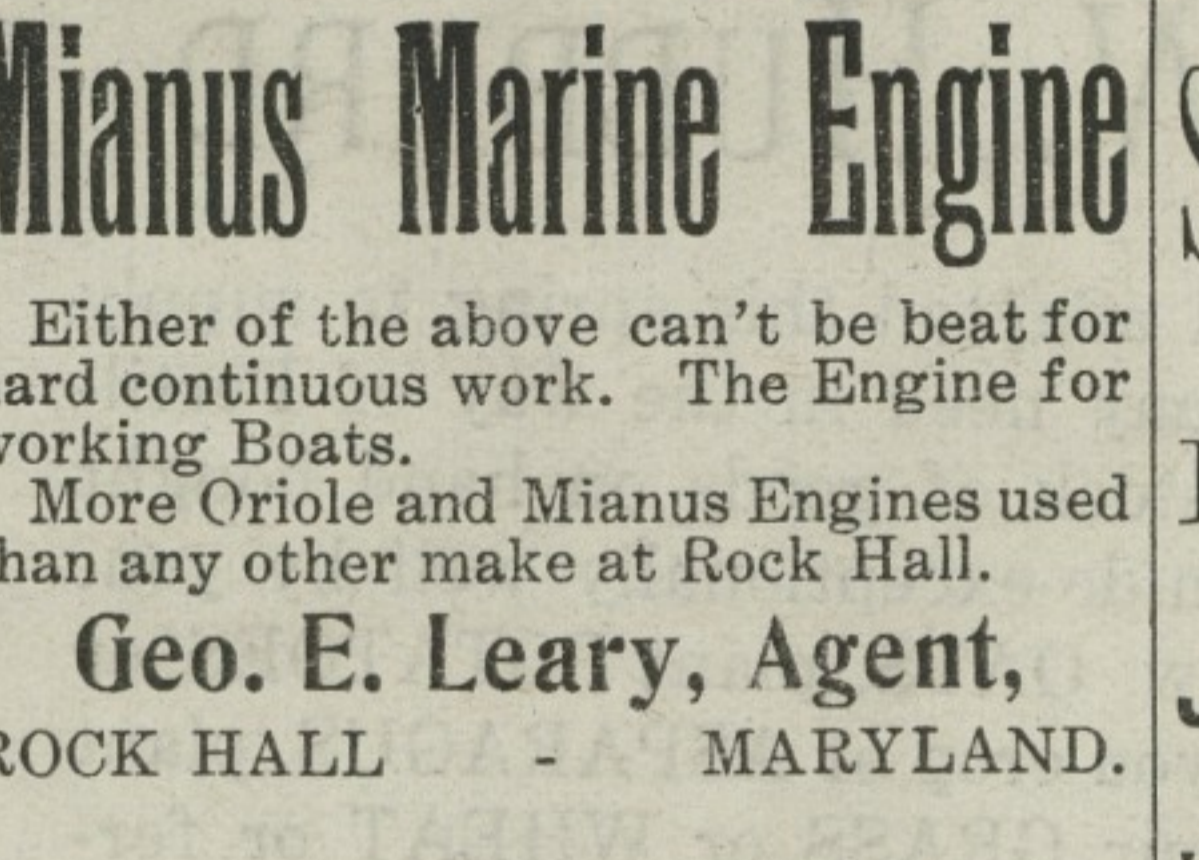
Mrs. Newman's Will.

All the household effects, jewelry, etc., are to be divided equally among the heirs. Thomas A. Murray, Esq., of Baltimore, is named as the executor without bond. The will bears the date of November 4th, 1908, and was witnessed by James W. Chapman, Jr., and George A. Salter, of Baltimore.
