GOOD WHEAT CROP.

Unless Unfavorable Conditions Arise, Yield Will Tax Granaries of the State.
Maryland's farmers will be richer by many millions at the end of the present summer than ever before, for Maryland's wheat crop, according to official reports, is a record-breaker, and with the present high prices Maryland's income from the wheat will break all records. While the cry of short crops is going up from the states west of the Alleghenies the Maryland farmer is laying low and watching his wheat fields blossoming forth into dollars that will not only allow him to pay off the mortgage, but will also allow him to buy automobiles and still have a surplus in the bank to carry over several hundred years should Nature turn her beaming countenance away from the Old Line State.

To come more directly to the point the wheat crop in Maryland this year is said to be one of the best in years, says the Baltimore News, and unless unfavorable conditions arise between now and harvest time the yield will be such as to test the granaries of the State to the limit of their capacity.
Reports from all sections show that growing wheat is in a most flourishing condition. According to figures furnished by Secretary Wroth of the Baltimore Chamber of Commerce, the average wheat crop produced by the farms of Maryland is about 16,000,000 bushels but that the indications this year are that the crop will reach anywhere from 16,000,000 bushels to 20,000,000 bushels, with the estimates favoring the latter figure. July delivery is quoted on the floor of the Baltimore Chamber of Commerce at \$1.13 and if this price holds out the wheat crop will net the farmers of the State away over \$20,000,000. In former years the slogan of the wheat farmers was "Dollars Wheat." Last year most of them got that price for their crops. With wheat at \$1.13 the growers are the most prosperous class in Maryland.
The crop report sent out by the Agricultural Department at Washington shows that throughout the country the wheat crop is short about 16 1/2 per cent of being a full crop. This shortage is made up principally of the failure of the crops in the States West of the Ohio river—the great wheat-raising country—to measure up to the standard. This shortage, it is urged will do much to enrich the Maryland farmer, as it is said, it will practically mean that the present high price for wheat will be maintained.

We would place a flag upon each a Bible with every Public School-house of our land, that all might learn these to be a beacon light in every storm which may threaten our destruction.


