Fine Fruit Orchards.

The statistical report of State Entomologist, Prof. Thos. B. Symons, gives statistics for work of his department for the fiscal year, which closes on June 31, that are of vital interest to farmers throughout Maryland. In this table will be seen not only the number of trees, kinds of trees and amount of infestations in the various counties in which orchard inspections were made during the year, but the figures throw also an interesting light upon the fruit productiveness of the various counties and some surprising and significant comparisons. There are in Kent county 2,970 apple trees, 155,875 peach trees, 63,300 pear trees. The total apple trees in the State is 398,627, peach, 779,481; pear 163,792; other trees, 30,205; trees infested with scale 184,621. There are 5,180 infested trees in Kent county.

Hibernia School.

The Hibernia School held its Patron's Day Picnic Saturday, June 5th, on the school grounds. A large crowd was present and had a very enjoyable time. An Improvement Society was organized and the following officers appointed: President, Wm. T. Baxter; Vice-President, Mrs. Wm. M. 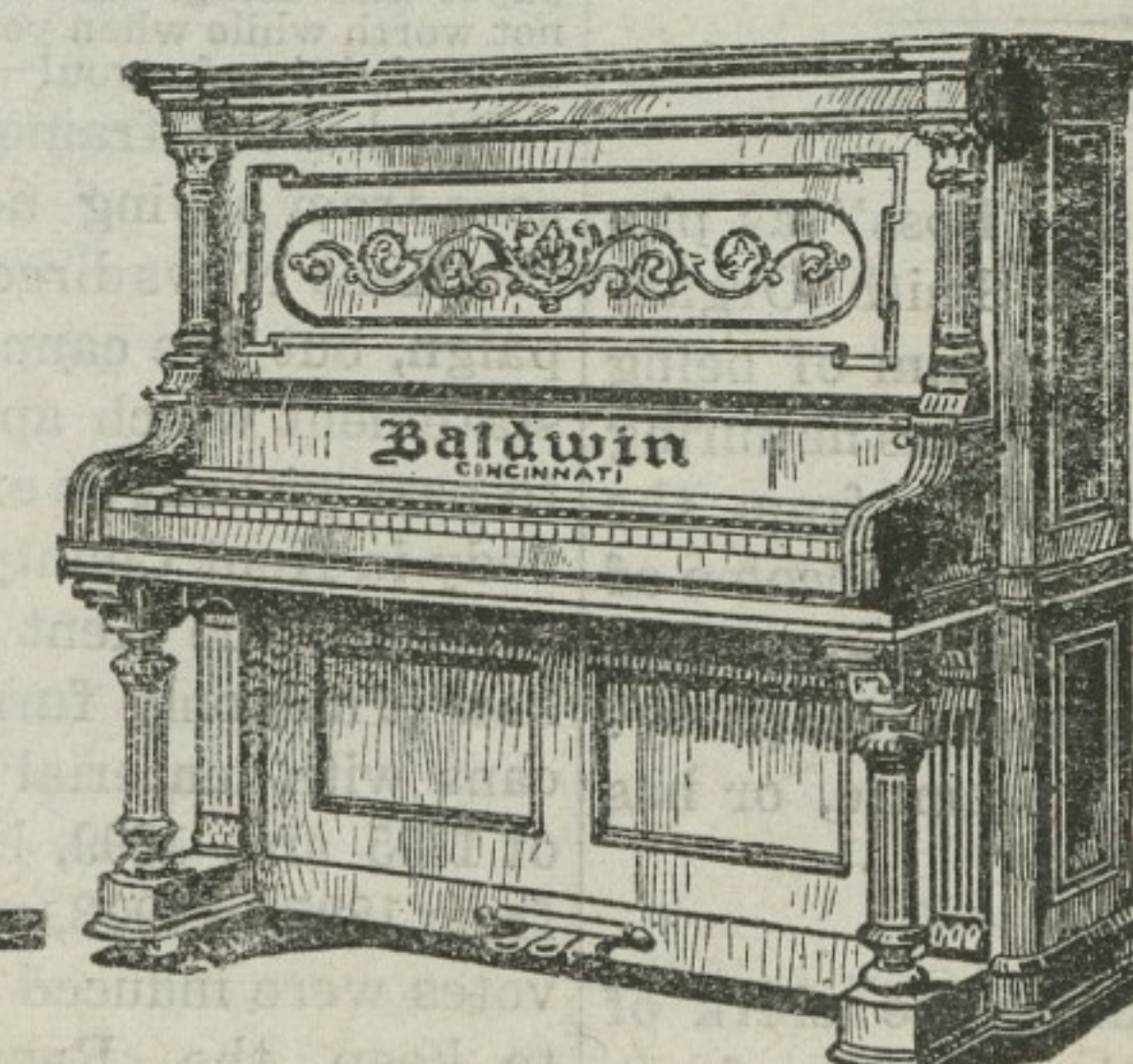
