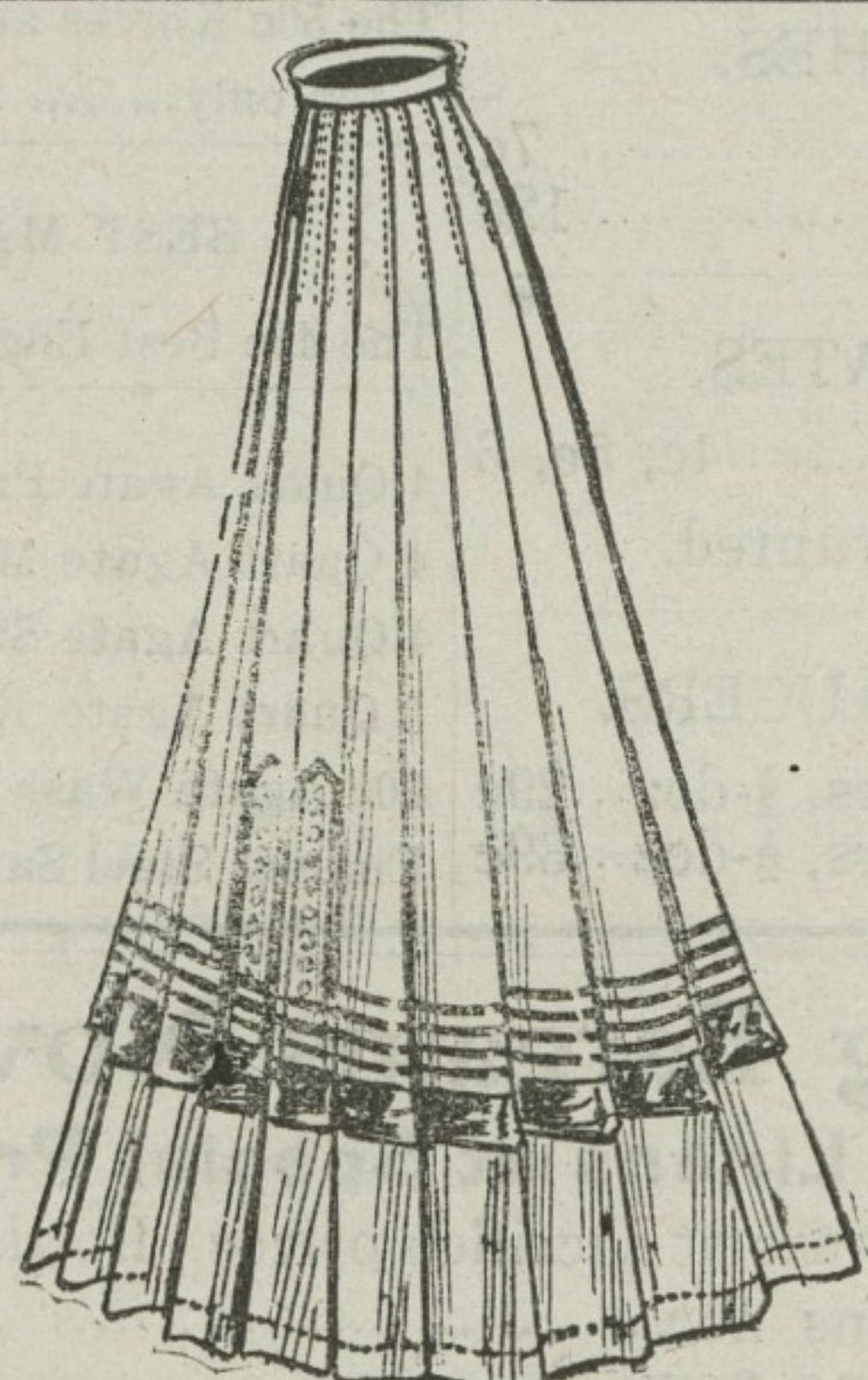

STATE BANKERS TO MEET

Annual Convention Will be at Blue Mountain House, June 22 to 24.

Bankers and bank employees in every part of the State are now making arrangements to attend the fourteenth annual convention of the Maryland Bankers' Association, which will be held at the Blue Mountain House, on June 22, 23 and 24. Between 200 and 300 delegates from Baltimore and from the many towns of the counties will be present to make the gathering one of the most auspicious in the history of the organization.

The program arranged for this session will be of unusual interest. The regular order of business will include reports from the respective committees on "Bank Stock Taxation" and the "Governor's Commission on Revision of the Banking Laws of the State." These reports will be presented at a timely occasion, for the legislature will convene this coming January. Some of those who are to speak are: Hon. E. W. Vreeland, congressman from New York; Mr. Lucius Teter, president of the Chicago Savings Bank and Trust Company; Mr. S. M. Hann, national bank examiner; Mr. J. Walter Oster, assistant cashier of the National Howard Bank; Mr. Hammond Urner, of Frederick, Md.; Mr. Harvey Cooper, of Denton, Md.; and Judge F. I. Duncan, of Towson, Md.

The entertainment feature has also been carefully looked after. On Wednesday evening Mr. Malcolm Shakelford, a humorist of New York, will give an entertainment. On Thursday evening the annual banquet will be held.

Mr. W. B. Copper, the efficient and popular cashier of the Second National Bank, of Chestertown, is president of the association, and will attend as a delegate from his bank. Harrison W. Vickers, Esq., is the other delegate. Messrs. Alday Clements, Allen A. Harris and Curtis E. Crane, represent the Chestertown Bank, and Mr. Wm. F. Russell, of the Kent County Savings Bank.
