### THE DEFEAT OF MR. HADAWAY.

The greatest regret we have in this campaign is the defeat of Walter H. Hadaway for Clerk of the Court. No man in the history of the county ever made a more gallant fight for nomination than did Mr. Hadaway, and when it is known that he came within 27 votes of defeating both Mr. Dixon and Dr. Barwick, it can be seen how popular Mr. Hadaway is in the county. We do not hesitate to say that had the doubtful vote been left alone in this contest, not only would Mr. Hadaway have been nominated by a majority of more than 200, but the entire Anti-Organization ticket including the delegates to the State Convention would have been nominated by a big majority. A change of 14 votes in any district in the county would have nominated Mr. Hadaway, and those who watched the vote in the First Precinct of the Fourth District in Chestertown on Saturday are convinced that there were enough "doubtfuls" "cinched" to have defeated Mr. Hadaway. It is only because of the absence of convincing proof that the TRANSCRIPT does not expose this high handed business. Mr. Hadaway has gained a great victory. He nominated his running mates, but was himself defeated. His home district, the grand old Fifth, paid as grand a tribute to him as was ever paid to any man in the county, by giving him the greatest majority ever given to a candidate in his home district—191. He is stronger to-day with the people of the county than ever before, not only because of the method by which his opponent won, but because he made a clean, honest and manly fight, and though defeated he has carried his friends to victory, and has pledged his allegiance to the ticket. All honor to Mr. Hadaway. The county needs the services of such men as he, and though he has been defeated, yet he is victor, and the people of old Kent will yet reward him and his district people, who stood by him so loyally.

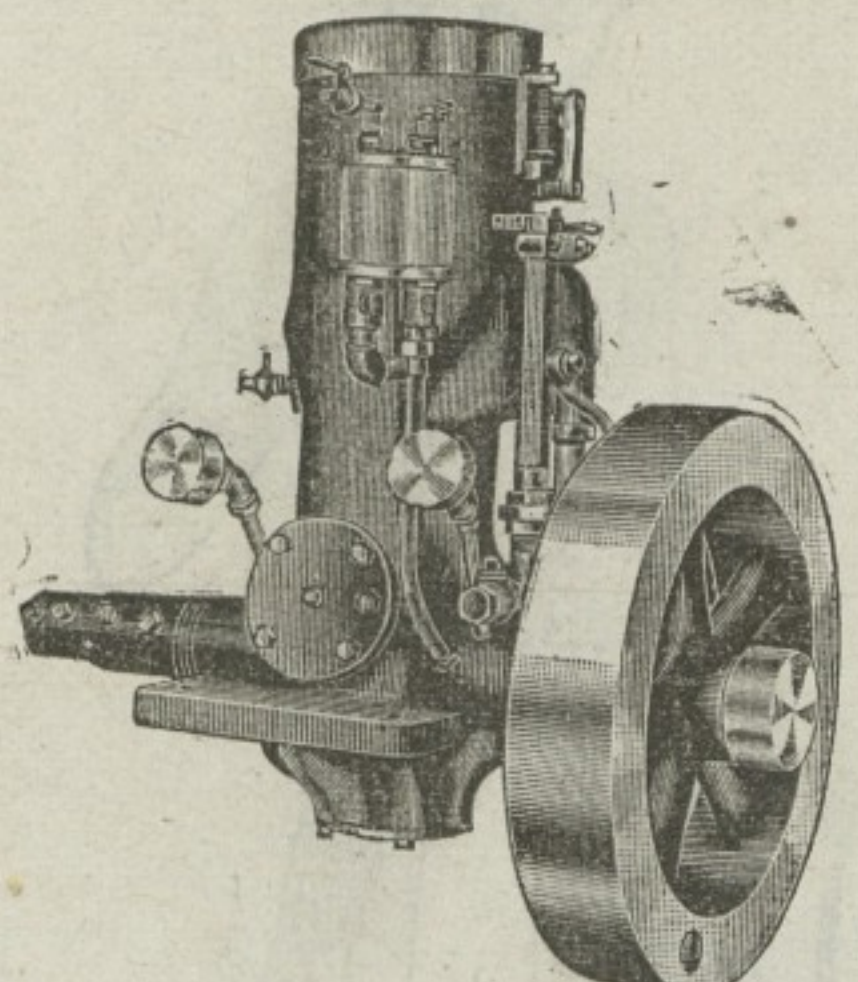
