MARYLAND'S WHEAT CROP.

It is Said to be One-Third
Short of Average.

The harvesting of the wheat crop in Maryland is over. There is general disappointment at the yield. It is said to have fallen short about one-third of the average yield. This is an old story repeated. A year ago the wheat harvest in Maryland fell below the average by one-third.

The falling off in the wheat yield is a serious problem to Maryland farmers, and, incidentally, to the banks in the country towns and in other centres of rural activities. The shortage also means a serious loss to the dealers in fertilizers.

The center of wheat production in Maryland is Frederick county. It is also the center of wheat production in the United States. More wheat is raised in Frederick county than in any other area of the same size in the whole world.

Because of the wheat yield in Frederick county the banks of Frederick have taken a leading place in the United States as depositories. In fact, it is said that there is more money on deposit in the national and savings banks in Frederick than in any other city of its size in the United States.

These deposits have their origin in the wheat harvest. The loss in the wheat yield will, therefore, mean a reduction in bank deposits, not only in Frederick, but also in other banks throughout the State.

It will also mean a loss to prominent men of Maryland who are engaged in agricultural pursuits. State Senator Arthur P. Gorman, who is tilling the farm of his father in Howard county, near Laurel, devoted over one-third of his 300 acres in wheat. It is readily apparent that Mr. Gorman will not be a winner on his wheat crop this year. Last year Maryland wheat was afflicted with a blight. A parasite made its appearance in the bins, and farmers had to dispose of their crop at about a dollar a bushel. If they had been able to hold their wheat they would have realized better prices. In all Maryland to-day there are not 1000 bushels of old wheat.

At present prices old wheat would command one-third more than was paid less than a year ago. But there was the blight a year ago. There was the absolute necessity of immediate sale to prevent the spread of the blight.—Baltimore American.

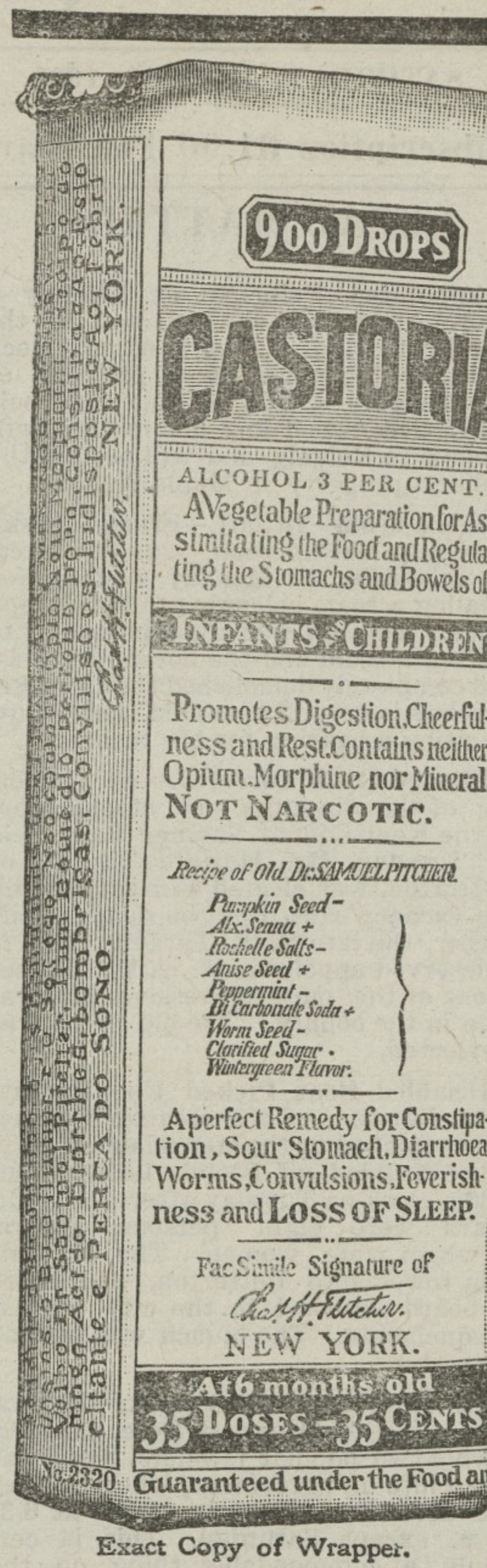
