**RUN OVER BY NEGRO.**  
Mrs. A. N. Staveley, of Lynch Meets With Serious Accident at Her Old Home.

Mrs. A. N. Staveley, wife of A. N. Staveley, of the well-known firm of Staveley & Bowers, Lynch's, was the victim recently of a serious accident. Mrs. Staveley was at her old home in Charles county for a visit with relatives and friends. She had not visited her old home for more than 20 years, and she was taking advantage of the visit to explore old nooks and beaten paths, which had been so familiar to her in her childhood days. It was while out for one of these walks that Mrs. Staveley was thrown with great force to the ground, sustaining a dislocation of the elbow and a fracture of the wrist. Mrs. Staveley was also otherwise hurt. She has returned to her home at Lynch, and is improving.

**Fish Bites.**

Fishing in Chester river and its tributaries has been extremely poor during the past two weeks. No one has caught any fish, and whether it is due to so much food, or whether the seine haulers have caught up all the fish, little and big, is the question. Prior to the last session of the Legislature seine hauling was prohibited in the month of July, and fishermen were not allowed to ship or catch fish of a given size. Now they can haul seine every day in the year and ship any kind of fish, little or big, and as a consequence, the real sport of hook and line fishing has about been destroyed.

A fisherman of Port Deposit one day last week caught a rock fish weighing 24 lbs., and measuring 46 inches in the Susquehanna river, above the town. He landed the big fellow with a small reel and line.

Capt. Chas. Bacon got into a school of taylor's off Toichester on Monday morning and caught the most of them in his pound. Some of them were shipped to Mr. R. Thompson, one of our merchants here, who retailed them at 40 cents per half dozen.

Thirteen fishermen, caring nothing for the suspicion attaching to the number, left Smyrna, Del., last week for a day's fishing for trout in Delaware Bay. They caught 134 fine fish, the high man catching 57. They returned home delighted with their success, and with no misgivings whatever about the unluckiness of the number 13.
