RELIGIOUS MATTERS.

Rock Hall M. E. Sunday School will hold its annual picnic at Wilkinson Park, near Gratitude on August 19th.

Chestertown M. E. Church, Rev. Louis E. Barrett, D. D. pastor. Services next Sunday, August 8th, as follows: 10:30 A. M., preaching by the pastor, subject "Smooth Stones," 2:15 P. M. Sabbath School; 6:00 P. M. Junior League; 6:45 P. M., Vesper Service of one hour, spirited singing and short address by the pastor. Come and worship with us.

HOLINESS CAMP—A ten days' holiness camp is being held on Maple Avenue, Chestertown, Md., commencing August 6th, 1909. Five services daily. Missionaries from Africa and Japan will be present to assist in the work. A corps of talent from Cincinnati will also be present to add to the interest of the services. Many other workers will be present to assist in the work.

Rev. J. M. Sheridan, president of the Maryland Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church has accepted the degree of doctor of divinity conferred upon him by Adrian College, Adrian, Mich., the largest Methodist Protestant College in the West. There was no official ceremony, Dr. Sheridan merely sending his acceptance of the honor on being notified by the college authorities of their action. Dr. Sheridan and family have rented a cottage at Buckeystown for the Summer.

Rev. Francis E. Clark was re-elected President of the National Christian Endeavor Society, at the recent convention in Minneapolis. William Shaw of Boston, was elected Secretary. H. N. Latrop, Treasurer, Rev. R. P. Anderson, Superintendent of the Builders' Union, reported a site purchased for the new National Home in Boston, which will cost \$100,000, of which \$50,000 is in hand in cash. President Clark said the past year was the best the United Society had ever known.

At a congregational meeting of the People's Church, Friday evening, in Dover, trustees were elected for the term of three years, two years and one year as follows: Thomas J. Stevenson, Wm. J. Benson, Wesley Webb, Wm. H. Ridgeway, J. K. Eckert, John B. Hutton, James B. Keith. The articles of incorporation of the new church were filed, making the People's Church of Dover a regularly-organized and operative body. The charter gives to the minister, Rev. A. W. Lightburne, all the rights and privileges and offices of a minister of the gospel. The lot recently purchased by the church has been paid for. Plans for the new church have been accepted and work will shortly begin.

Ticket for Queen Annes.

The Democratic primaries held in Queen Annes county Saturday brought out about 1,400 voters. The most exciting contests were for nominations for the House of Delegates. Frank H. Phillips, John T. Roe and Samuel Roe won, defeating Charles W. Butler, John F. Godwin and Dudley G. Roe. For sheriff, W. P. Dalahay was the winner in a triangular fight. For county commissioners, there were contests in the Third and Fifth districts. Wm. G. Roe won in the Third over John W. Perry. In the Fifth J. H. Carter was defeated by James Rhodes. The full list nominated is as follows: G. John Merrick, First district; A. C. Newman, Second; Wm. G. Roe, Third; W. H. Hopkins, Fourth; James Roe, Fifth; Chas. W. Legar, Sixth, and H. Clay Hendrix, Seventh. For surveyor, S. Chester Coursey, was nominated without opposition. Messrs. John E. George, J. E. Kirwin and J. K. Brown were re-elected members of the State Central Committee.

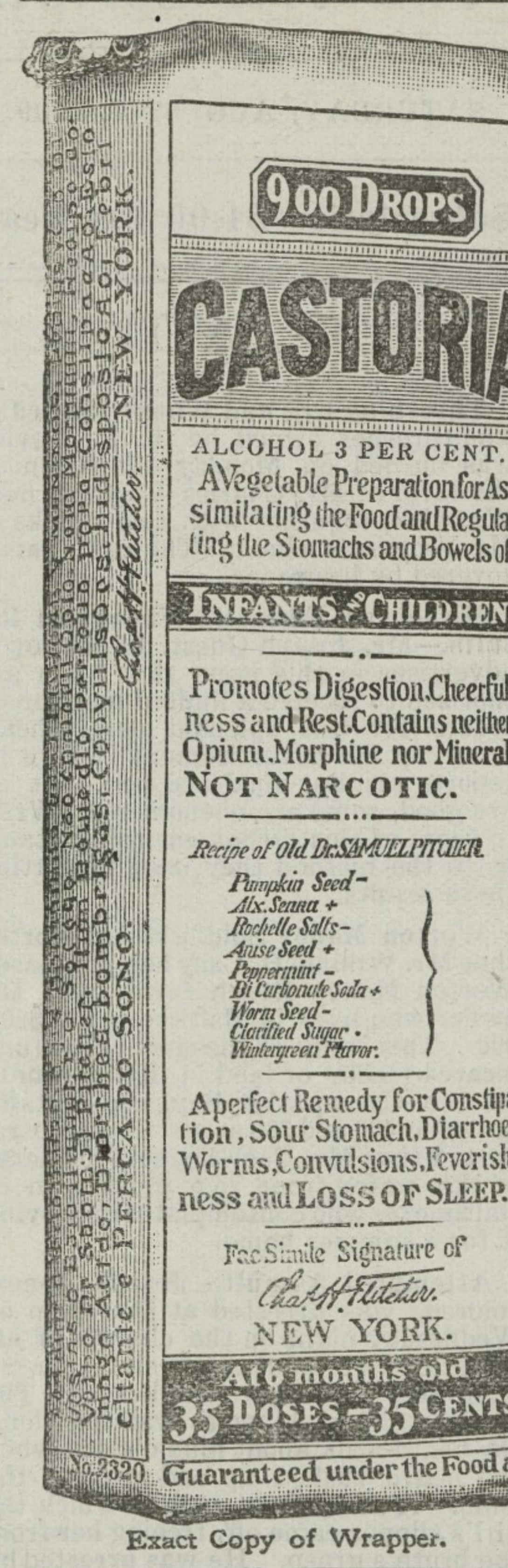
