Miller, of Chestertown; Mrs. Seth Ellegood, of New York State, and Mrs. James Vansant, of Philadelphia. Funeral services were held yesterday afternoon at four o'clock at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. Arthur M. Brown, conducted by Rev. Dr. L. E. Barrett. Interment was in Chester cemetery. The pall-bearers were Messrs. Jas. W. Lambert, Jas. W. Chapman, Charles L. Dodd, Wm. H. Lambert, of Edward, W. Bradford Copper and M. A. Toulson. Undertaker Charles L. Dodd had charge of the funeral arrangements.

Miss Bertha M. Biddle, daughter of Mrs. Joseph Noland, died at the home of Mrs. A. H. Crest on High street on Wednesday of typhoid fever in the 20th year of her age. 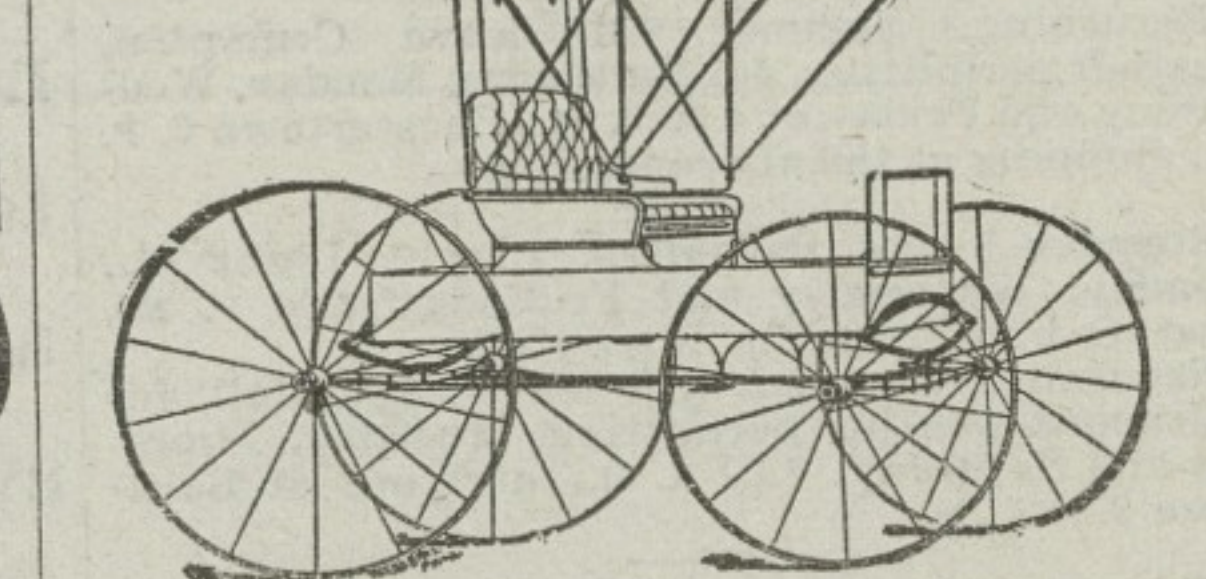
