The forthcoming journal of the convention of the diocese of Easton Protestant Episcopal Church, contains some interesting figures relative to the work in the Diocese as reported to the recent convention. It appears that there are 8,207 baptized members, and 8,994 parishioners. During the year 228 persons were baptized, 178 confirmed, and nearly 2,000 Sunday School scholars.

The different parishes contributed to the general church funds as follows: missions, \$1,968 11; general clergy relief, \$423 78; other objects, \$283 40. For Diocesan purposes contributions were made as follows: Convention fund, \$935 50; diocesan clergy relief, \$247; diocesan missions, \$1,546 21; Home for Friendless children, \$360.84 in cash and much other things such as clothing, provisions, etc.; other objects, \$202 90. The Diocese paid in salaries, \$19,351. (this amount is largely augmented from general mission fund); for current expenses, \$7306 59.

There was spent on repairs and improvement, \$7,555 96 for charities, \$1,000.00; Sunday School expenses, \$785 33; other parochial objects, \$1,563 73; paid on account of debts, interest, etc., \$3,370 39; Women's auxiliary, \$126 73. The total contributions by the parish amounted to \$50,186 22. The total value of church property is \$487,163 54.

The figures show a substantial increase both in the growth of the church and on the financial support of the church. Rev. E. C. Makosky, of West Baltimore M. P. Church, will preach at St. James and Lynch tomorrow, Sunday morning and afternoon.

Owing to the absence of Rev. J. M. Mitchell, of Galena, on his vacation there will be no morning service at Galena M. E. Church, tomorrow. Rev. A. P. Prettyman will preach in Sassafras M. E. Church in the morning and in Galena in the evening.

The Holiness Camp on Maple Avenue has been attracting large crowds during the week. Mrs. J. Harry Anthony sang a beautiful solo at the Epworth League services in the M. E. Church last Sunday evening.

Mrs. Wm. Smith will preside at the pipe organ in the M. E. Church during the absence of the regular organist, Miss Mabel Toulson.

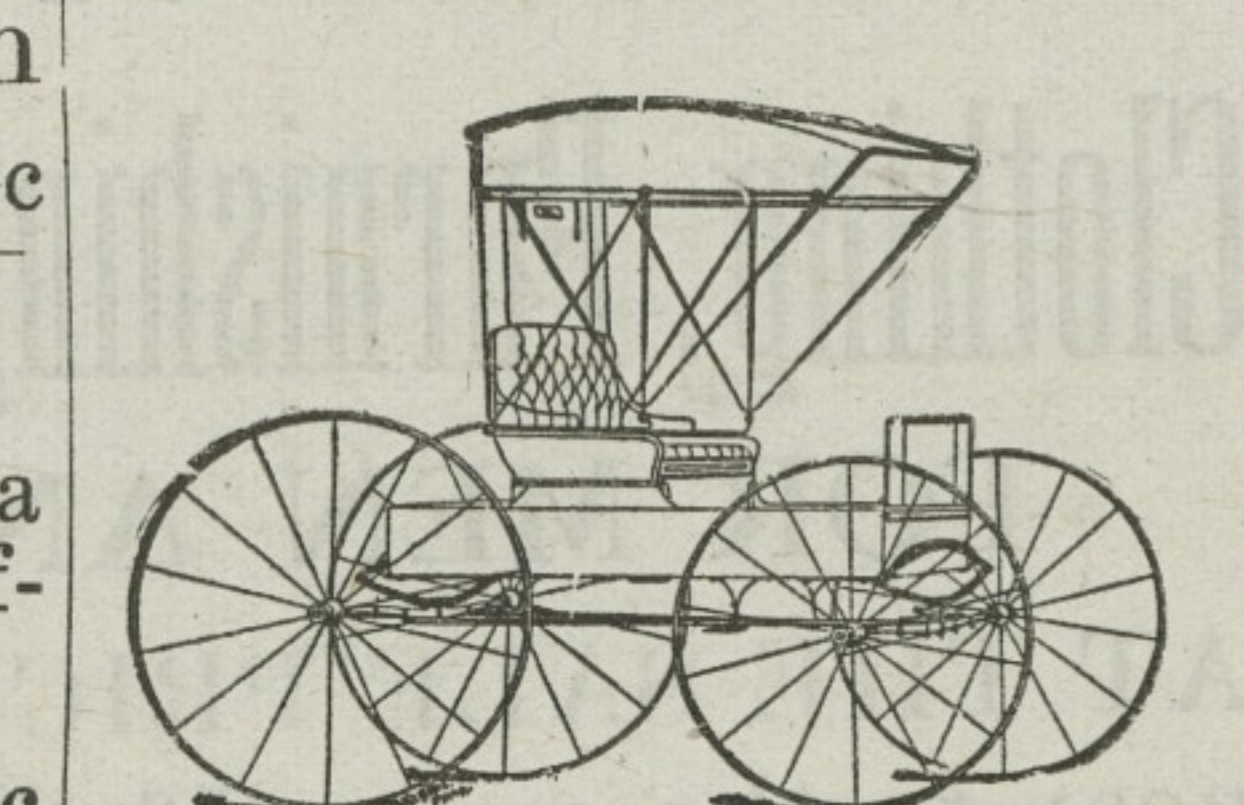

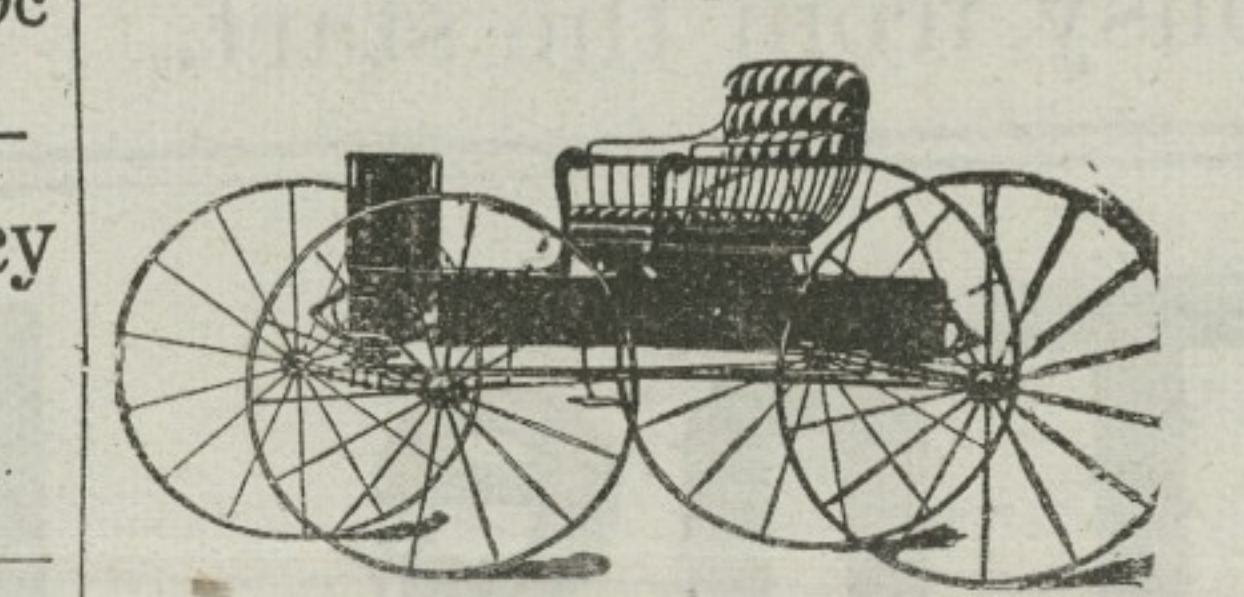

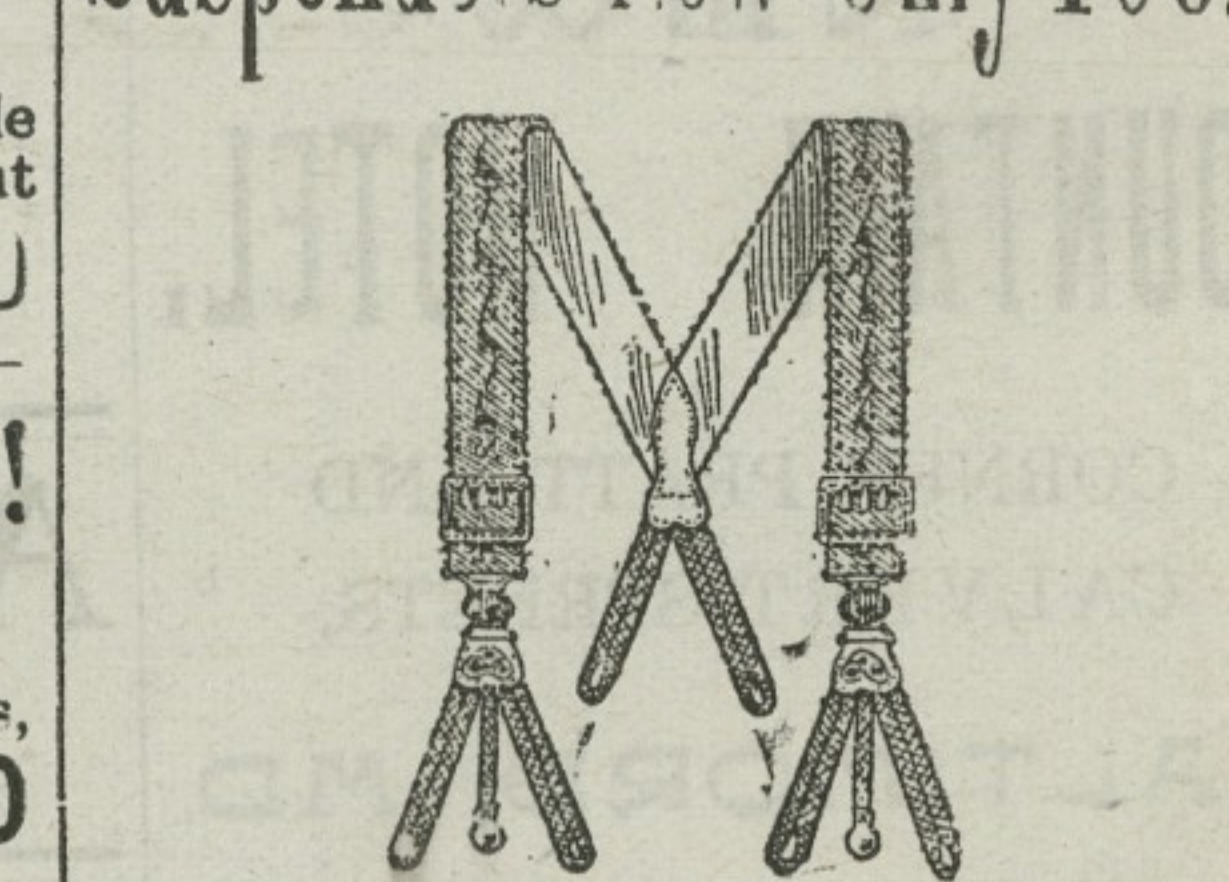
