



The Treasurer's office in Court House will not be open on the above days.

The Treasurer's office in the Court House will be open every day except on the above dates from 10 A. M. to 3 P. M. for the receipt of Taxes. Tax-payers will please take notice that taxes will be due and payable Sept. 1st and that on all bills unpaid on January 1st, interest will be charged and collected from Sept. 1st. On the first day of January all taxes unpaid are declared by law to be a arrears, and delinquents will be warned that unless settlement in full be made before April 1st he claims against them will be warned that the records of the Treasurer of the county, who will proceed to seize and sell their property to pay the taxes due with charges and all costs of sale. OBJECTS AND PRINCIPLES

Jr. O. U. A. M.

FIRST—To maintain and promote the interests of Americans and shield them from the depressing effects of unrestricted immigration; to assist them in obtaining employment and to encourage them in business.

We would place a flag upon every man, woman and every Public School-house of our land, that all might learn these to be a beacon light in every storm which may threaten our destruction.

Proclamation.

WHEREAS, at the January Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, held in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and eight, an Act was passed proposing an amendment to Section 1 of Article I of the Constitution of the State which said Act is in the following words, to-wit:

CHAPTER 26.

AN ACT to amend Section one of Article one of the Constitution of the State, to provide for the submission of said Amendment to the qualified voters of this State for adoption or rejection.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, three fifths of all the members of the Senate and two thirds of all the members of the House of Delegates, that the following section be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Section one of Article one of the Constitution of the State, to-wit:

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, three fifths of all the members of the Senate and two thirds of all the members of the House of Delegates, that the following section be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Section one of Article one of the Constitution of the State, to-wit:

SECTION 1. All elections shall be by ballot, and every male citizen of the United States of the age of twenty-one years or upwards, who has been a resident of the State for two years and of the Legislative District of Baltimore City or of the county in which he may offer to vote for one year next preceding the election, and who, moreover, is duly registered as a qualified voter as provided in this Article, shall be entitled to vote, in the ward or election district in which he resides, at all elections hereafter to be held in this State, and in case any county or city shall be so divided as to form portions of different districts for the election of Representatives in Congress, Senators, Delegates or other officers, then to entitle a person to vote for such officer, he must have been a resident of that part of the electoral district in which he offers to vote, for one year next preceding the election; but a person who shall have acquired a residence in such county or city, entitling him to vote on any such election, shall be entitled to vote, in the election district from which he removed, until he shall have acquired a residence in the part of the county or city to which he has removed.

Every male citizen of the United States having the above prescribed qualifications of age and residence shall be entitled to be registered as a person who, on the first day of January in the year next preceding the election, or prior thereto, has previously voted, and if so, the State, county, ward or precinct in which he voted, and also the name of the officer for whom he voted, and the date of the election, and if he is a foreign born citizen of the United States, the date of his arrival in this State, and if he is a descendant of such last mentioned person, or third or fourth generation, the date of the adoption of the name of the person, or fifth; a person who, in the presence of the officers of registration, shall, in his own handwriting, with pen and ink, without any aid, suggestion or memorandum whatsoever, and without any writing or record addressed to him by any of the officers of registration, make application for registration, and shall file with the officers of registration, his name, age, date and place of birth, residence and occupation at the time and for the two years next preceding the election, his name and occupation or employers, if any, at the time and for the two years next preceding the election, and if he has previously voted, and if so, the State, county, ward or precinct in which he voted, and also the name of the officer for whom he voted, and the date of the election, and if he is a descendant of such last mentioned person, or third or fourth generation, the date of the adoption of the name of the person, or fifth; 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
