

Vachel Burgess, Dem., appointed Registrar of Voters in place of Edgar H. Strong, deceased, for Second Precinct of Fifth District.


W. W. Baldwin, Rep., appointed Registrar of Voters in place of R. Frank Eburn, resigned, for Second Precinct, Fourth District.
