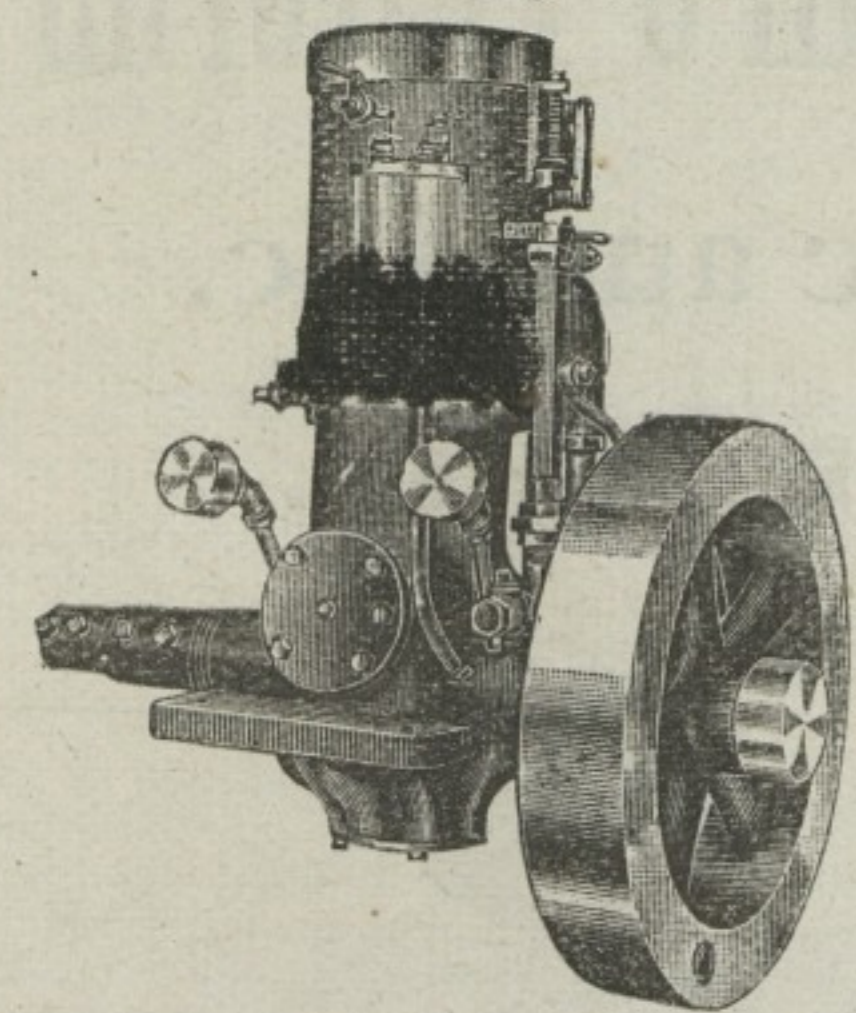
An extract from an address made by the Comptroller of the Currency at the meeting of the American Bankers' Association held in Chicago September 14th, 1909:
