Queen Annes Real Estate. The following changes in real estate ownership important to Kent counties have been made during this month.

Proclamation.

WHEREAS, at the January Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, held in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and eight, an Act was passed proposing an amendment to Section 1 of Article 1 of the Constitution of the State which said Act is in the following words, to-wit:

CHAPTER 26. AN ACT to amend Section one of Article one, title, "Election Franchise," of the Constitution of this State, and to provide for the submission of said Amendment to the qualified voters of this State for adoption or rejection.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, three-fifths of all the members of the two Houses concurring, that the following section be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Section one of Article one, title, "Election Franchise," of the legal and qualified voters thereof, and if adopted by the legal and qualified voters of the State, it shall supersede and stand in the place and stead of Section one of said Article one.

Election for members of the General Assembly to be held in this State, submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof for their adoption or rejection, in pursuance of the directions contained in Article XIV of the Constitution of this State, and at said general election the vote on the said proposed amendment shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment," and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now prescribed by law, and immediately after said election due returns shall be made to the Governor of the State, as directed by said Article XIV of the Constitution.

Approved February 25, 1909. NOW, THEREFORE, I, AUSTIN L. CROTHERS, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, in pursuance of the provisions of Section 1 of Article XIV of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, do hereby order and direct that a copy of said Act proposing an amendment to Section 1 of Article 1 of the Constitution of the State, be published in at least two newspapers in each of the counties of the State and in three newspapers in the City of Baltimore, one of which shall be published in the German language, once a week for at least three months preceding the next general election, which election will be held on November 22, 1909, at which election the proposed amendment shall be submitted, in the form and manner prescribed by the General Assembly to the legal and qualified voters of the State, for their adoption or rejection.
