Each man wore his coat buttoned up, strings were fastened round his cuffs, and trousers also if he had not on top boots. They had gaullets on their hands, their hats were on, and veils hanging down covered face and neck. A man would stick his fork into a piece of meat and pop it under the veil as quickly as possible. When drinking their coffee the men would hold the cup underneath the veil, first clearing out the bodies of the mosquitoes which possibly had been feeding upon the hairy miner close at hand.

"Not a word was uttered during that brief meal, for we were beaten down and cowed by the insects. The first words spoken were by a miner in pushing away his chair from the table. 'Oh, this God forsaken country!'

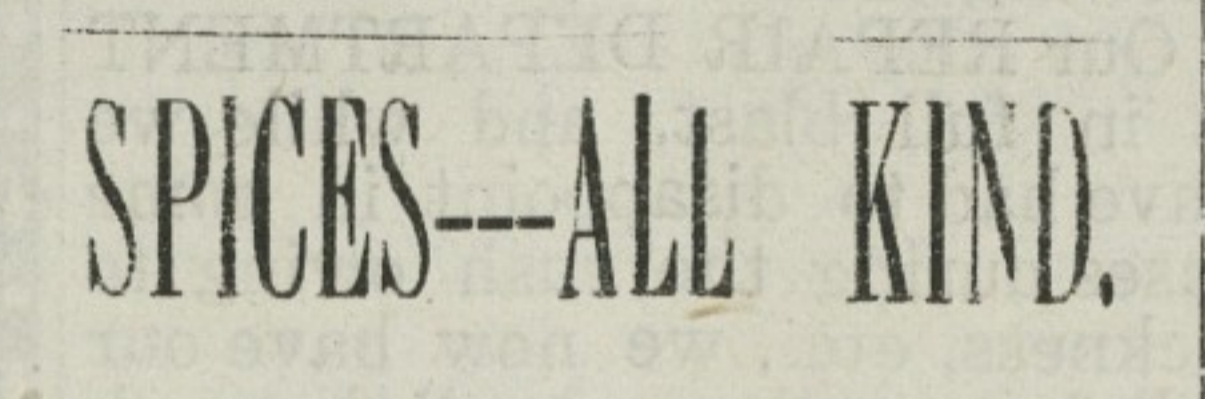
