## National and State Banks.

One of the most vital and important regulations of the National Banking Law is that which controls what is known as the "LEGAL RESERVE." It requires that 15 PER CENT. of all deposits shall be kept in the vaults of National Banks or in the hands of approved reserve agents. National Banks cannot count as a part of this reserve any funds in the hands of other banks unless these banks are especially strong, that is, banks which are DESIGNATED BY THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT as those in which other banks may hold their deposits.

The law requires NO RESERVE to be kept by any State Bank. Therein lies the difference. The following statement of the deposits of the three banks of Chestertown shows what reserves these banks, under the 15 PER CENT. requirement of the National Banking Law, ought to have and what reserve is actually held by each of these three banks.

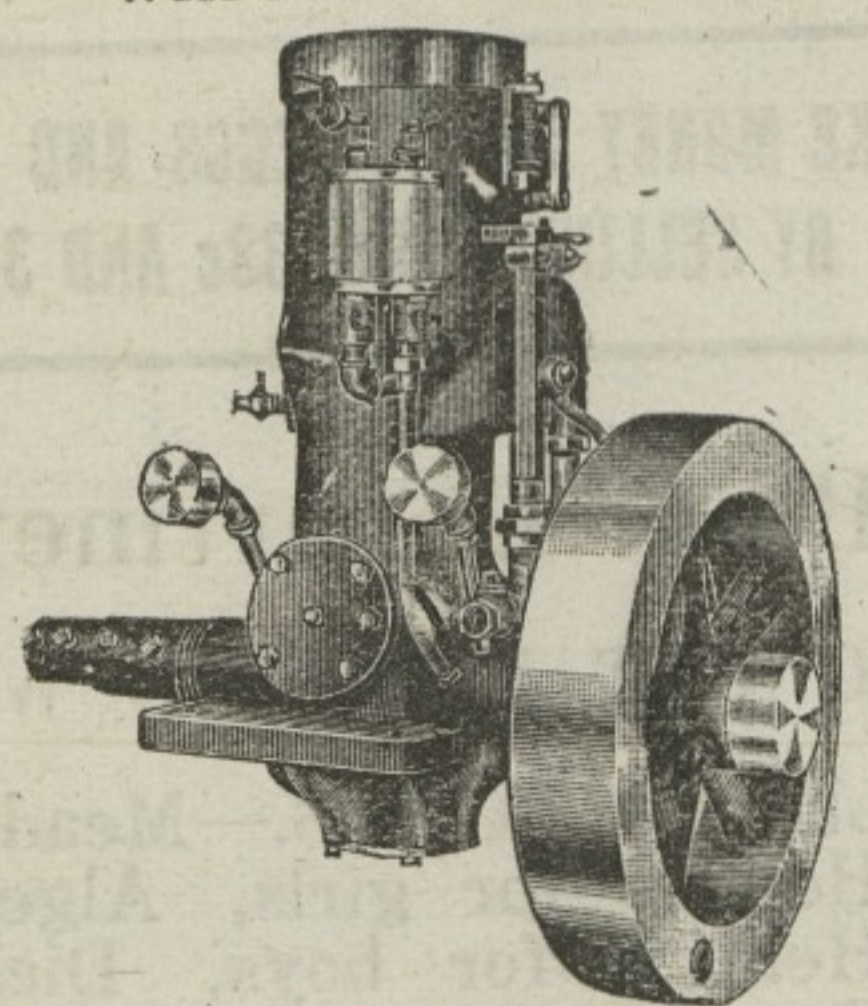

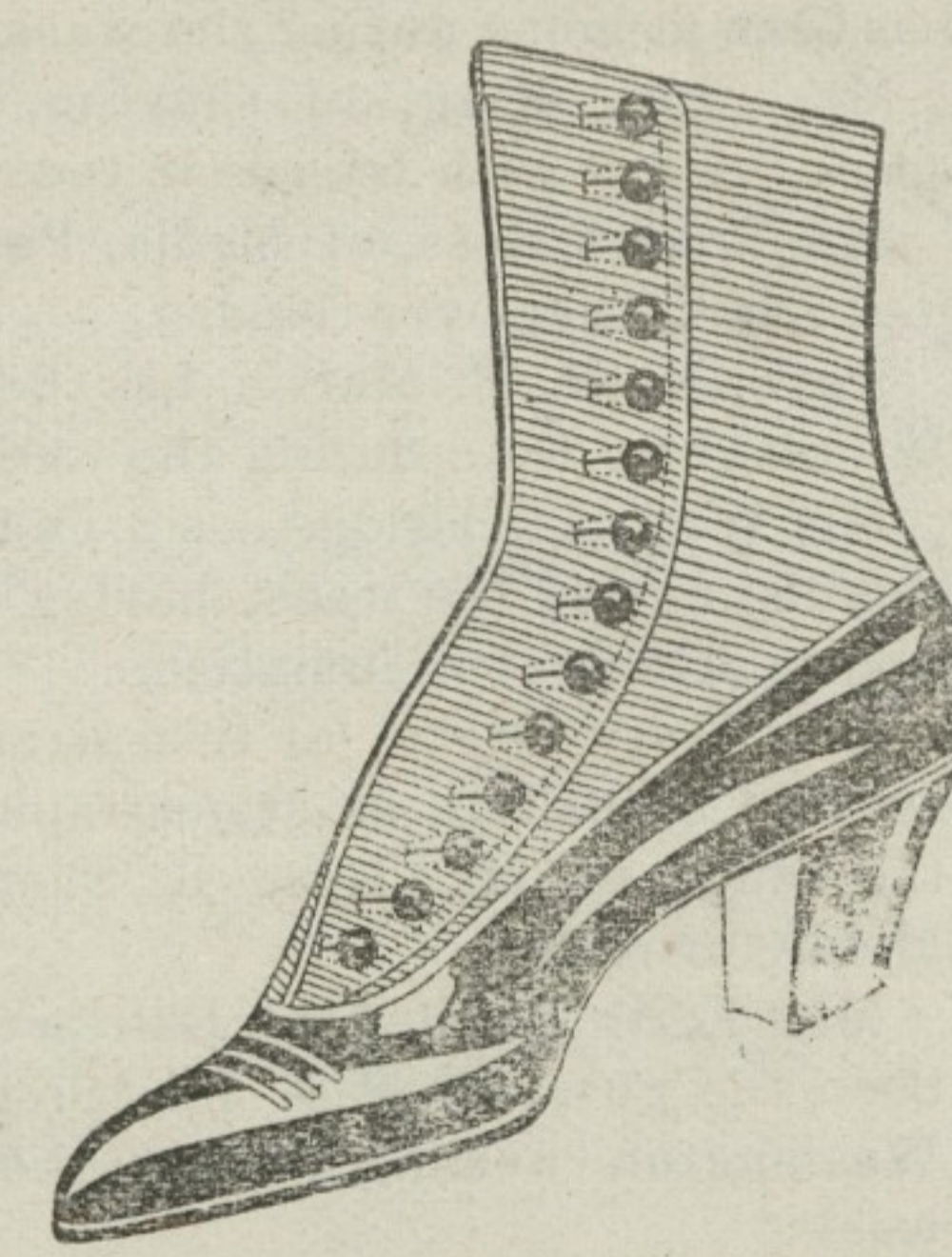

## IN CHURCH CIRCLES.

Chestertown M. E. Church—Rev. L. E. Barrett, D. D., pastor. Services next Sunday, Feb. 6, as follows: 10.30 A. M., preaching by the pastor; 2.15 P. M., Sabbath school and pastor's bible class; 7 P. M., union meeting of church and congregation—song service and a short sermon by the pastor; Junior League Friday evening at 6.30. All invited to any and all of these services.

As a prelude to his sermon on Sunday morning last, Rev. Dr. Barrett called attention to the State wide local option bill now before the Legislature, and urged every voter to write to our Senator and Delegates at Annapolis requesting them to vote for this bill. He stated that every American citizen should stand square for the great American doctrine of majority rule. The rum element will oppose it, but the intelligent moral sentiment of the people of the State is behind it.

Miss Emma Knight led the Christian Workers' Service in Christ M. P. Church last Sunday evening and read a splendid paper on "Trials and Temptations, and How to Bear Them." Miss Agnes Estes read the scripture lesson and Miss Anna Smyth read an appropriate poem. The music was inspiring, being accompanied by Mr. James Bacchus, piano, Miss Margherita Dodd, organist, and Mr. Arthur Bacon, cornet.

Rev. Dr. F. T. Little preached a strong temperance sermon in Christ M. P. Church last Sunday evening, which has received much favorable comment during the week.

Bishop Cyrus D. Foss, retired, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, one of the best known clergymen in the country, died Saturday night at the Hahnemann Hospital, Philadelphia, from a stroke of paralysis, which seized him while riding in a street car in that city January 18. He was elected bishop in 1880.

Rev. J. Wilson Sutton, curate of St. Paul's Church, Baltimore, and principal of St. Paul's school, is prominently mentioned as the next rector of St. Andrew's Protestant Episcopal Church, Washington, D. C., to succeed Rev. Geo. Calvert Carter, son of Mr. Bernard Carter, of Baltimore, who has accepted a charge at Bryn Mawr, Pa. Mr. Sutton is a native of this county, being a half-brother to Mr. B. S. Sutton, the bustling black's merchant. He is popular at Old St. Paul's, and his loss would be felt. His promotion, however, would be an ardent honor, and his many friends here hope he will accept, should he be appointed to St. Andrew's.
