OBITUARY.

JAMES A. RUSSELL.

Mr. James A. Russell died at his home on Mill street, Chestertown last Sunday morning, Jan. 30, aged 71 years and three months. He had been in failing health for several years but was confined to his room for about two weeks only, and his death, while not unexpected was rather sudden. A few minutes before the end came he had expressed a feeling of improvement in his condition, and indeed seemed brighter and better than for several days previous.

The deceased was a life-time resident of Chestertown and was well-known throughout the county. In his early life he learned the trade of shoe making, and worked for some years with the late James A. Shaw. Later he became interested in the treatment and management of horses and acquired a knowledge and skill in this particular, exceeded by few persons. For more than 30 years he conducted a stage line between Chestertown and Tolchester Beach inaugurating the service in 1877 when the steamer Sarah K. Taggart made irregular stops at what was originally known as Ree's wharf, later Tolchester.

He leaves six children: one daughter, Miss Nettie, who has been his contant and devoted companion since the death of her mother, which occurred Feb. 1st., 1900, to the very moment of the ebbing of his last breath, a period of exactly ten years less two days; L. Bates, the publisher and editor of the Enterprise; James L., a decorative painter, for the past 20 years employed in Washington, D.C.; John A., a printer, employed in the office of the Daily Times, Chestertown; and Carl M., a printer employed in a large job-printing office in Baltimore.

He is survived also by three brothers and two sisters, namely, John Hamer Russell, of Baltimore; Mrs. Clinton Cook, of Denton, Md.; William George, Lewin L., and Miss Hester Russell, of Chestertown.

Funeral services were held from his late residence Tuesday afternoon conducted by the Rev. Dr. F. T. Little. During the services a quartette composed of Mrs. F. G. Usilton, Mrs. J. Hyde Thompson, Mr. Arlington L. Sparks sang "Jesus Lover of My Soul," and "Crossing the Bar," with pathetic effect. The interment was in Chester cemetery, the pall bearers being the five sons and Mr. W. W. Clayton, nephew of the deceased. Undertaker Wm. T. Hicks had charge of funeral arrangements.

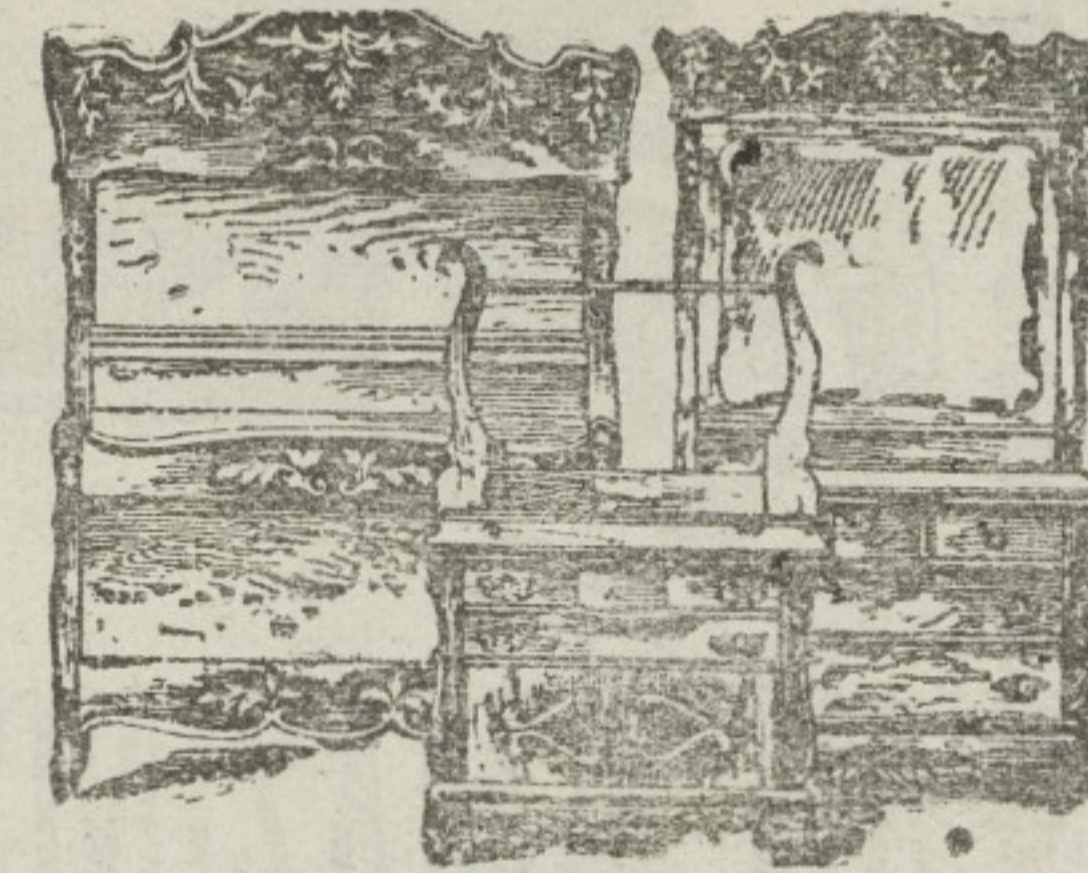
The plan of putting the roads out to the lowest bidder, the present expensive method, and the Caroline County Law was discussed by the members. The following resolution was adopted unanimously, and the secretary will forward copies of the same to our Senator and Representatives:—

"In view of the excessive cost of working the roads of this county, it is resolved by the Grange in meeting assembled that we petition through our secretary, our Representatives in the Maryland Legislature to adopt for this county the provisions of the Caroline County Road Law, which in our judgment is the most practical and economical method of working county roads now in use in the State."

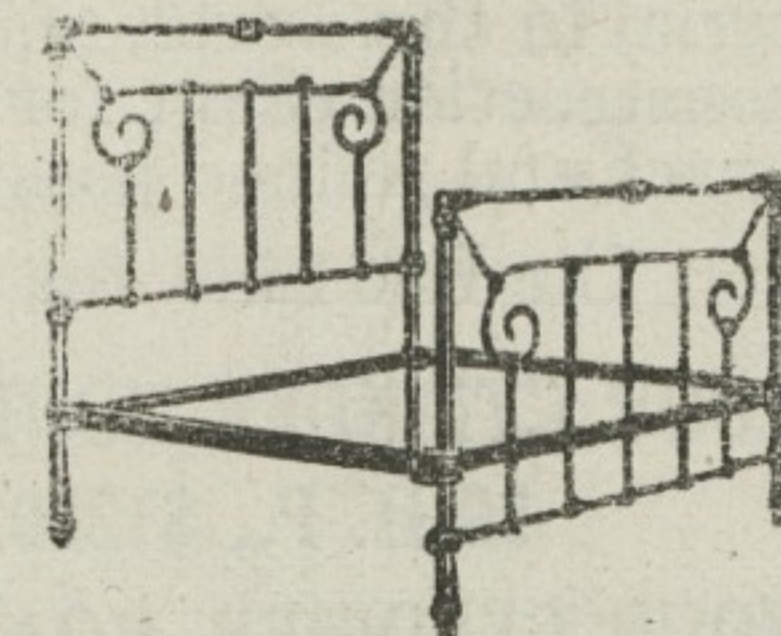
S. H. Tattersall, Supreme Secretary of the Order of Heptasophs, died suddenly of heart failure at his home in Baltimore last Sunday.
