PASS THE BANKING BILL

Editorial form the Baltimore American, Feb. 17, 1910.

That Maryland has suffered comparatively little from failures of financial institutions is by no means to be attributed to the vigilance of the State in safe-guarding the public by rigid and supervisory legislation. Quite the contrary is true, for Maryland's banking laws are far from adequate. Thanks, however, to the high character of men engaged in the banking business in this State and to local disapprobation of any but the most conservative of methods financial institutions of Baltimore and the State have won a well-deserved reputation for stability, efficiency and truthworthiness.

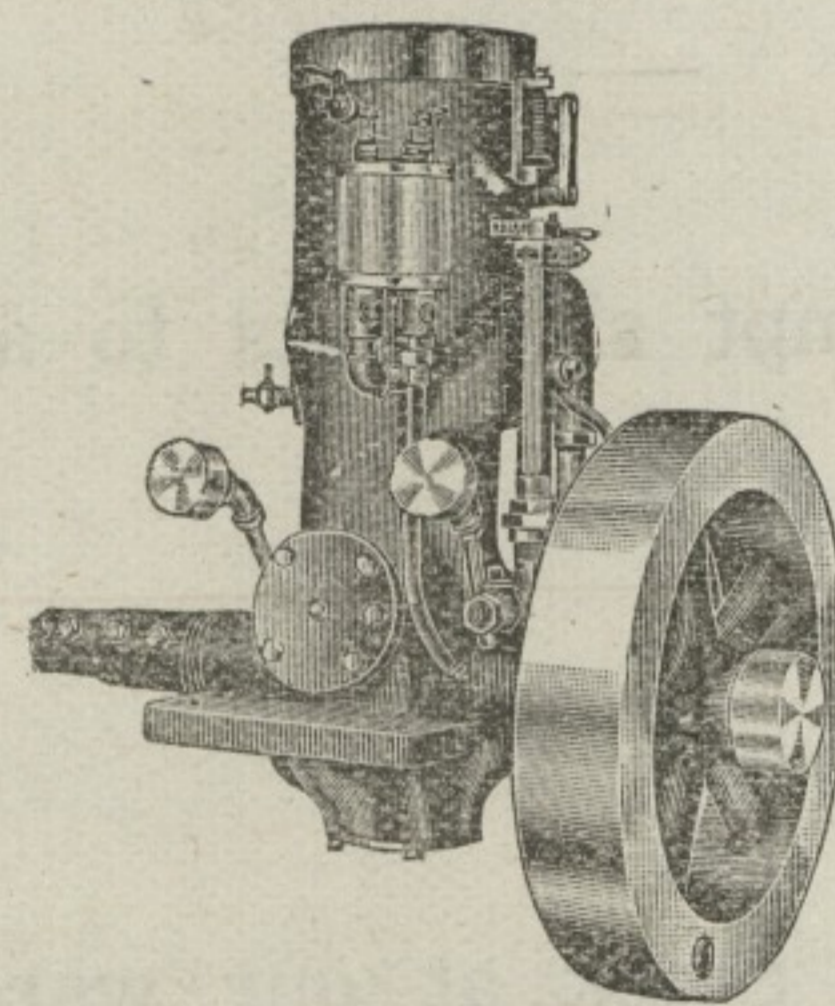
But Maryland has no assurance that this satisfactory condition of affairs will always exist, and it is unsafe to assume that it will. Competition exists in banking as well as in other lines of activity, and it is far easier to transgress a tradition than an actual legislative act behind which is the compelling power of a supervising banking commissioner. Hence the necessity of passing some such bill as that drawn up by the Banking Commission and now before the Legislature. In brief, this provides for appointment of a banking commissioner empowered to make periodical examinations and the keeping of a specified reserve fund by banks chartered by the State; in other words, such financial institutions are to be under supervision similar to that exercised by the national government over national banks.

As the measure is clearly in the interest and for the protection of the public, there does not seem at this time any good reason why it should not be made a law. Maryland is among the last of States to modernize their banking laws, and progressive action should be taken by the present Legislature.

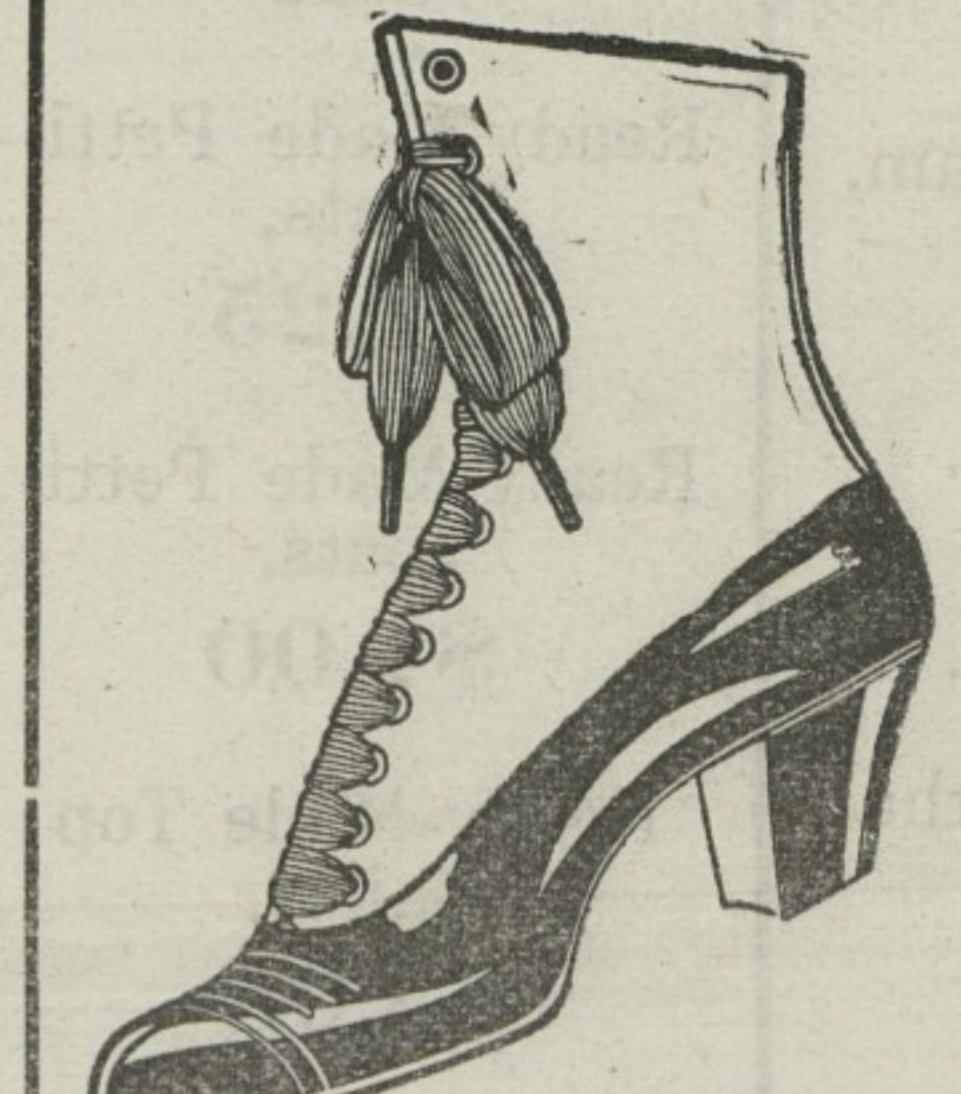
