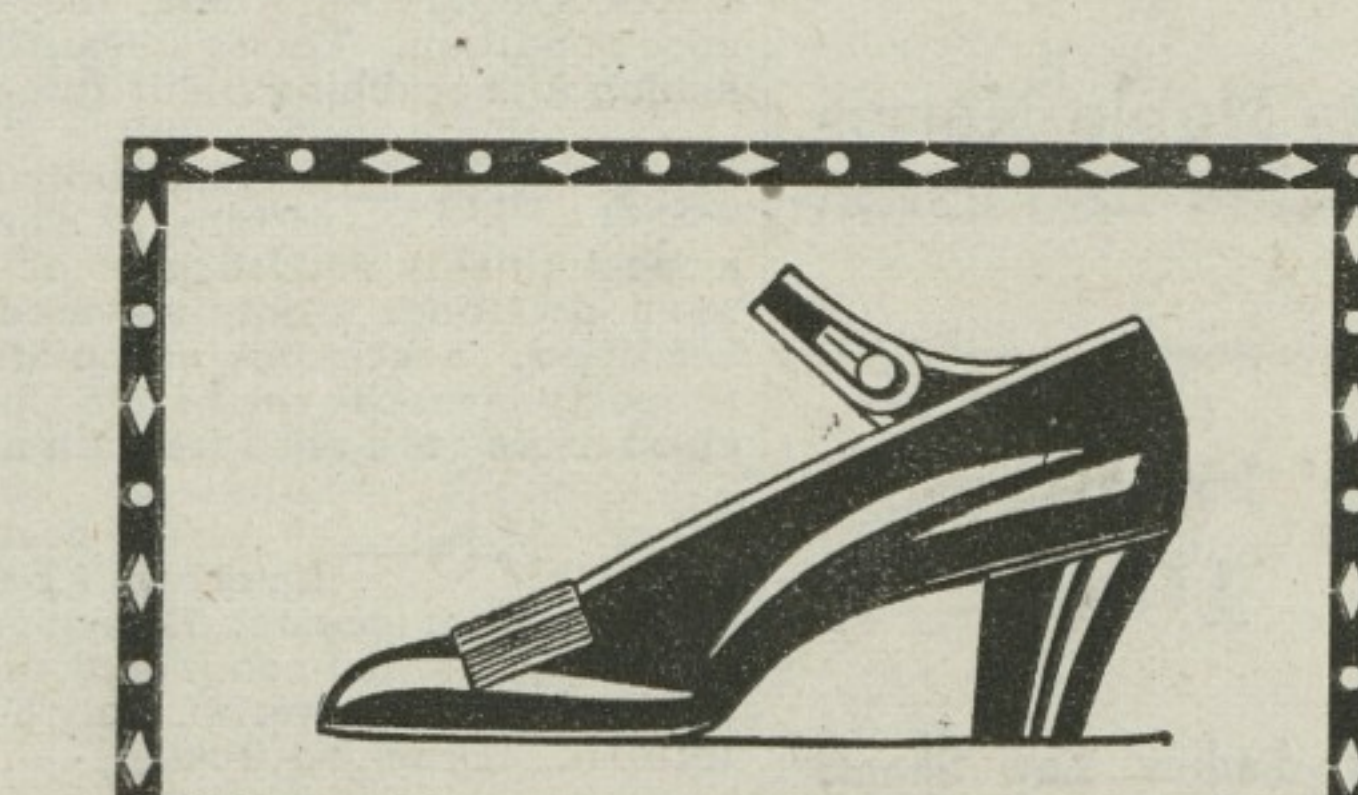

## New Bank Organized.

A meeting of the stockholders of the Third National Bank, which is to succeed the Second National Bank, was held in the Second National banking building room yesterday morning for the purpose of organization. There was a large attendance of stockholders and nearly all the stock subscribed was voted. The meeting organized by naming Mr. Thos. D. Bowers, chairman, and Mr. W. B. Copper was made secretary. The following board of directors was unanimously elected: Hon. James A. Pearce, president; Hope H. Barroll, vice-president; Wilbur W. Hubbard, Garrett Foxwell, Adam F. Huey, T. Benj. Durdin, D. Thos. Hurlock, Geo. D. Lofland, W. B. Copper. Mr. Geo. D. Lofland was elected a director to succeed H. W. Vickers, Sr., Esq., who resigned on account of the condition of his health.

The Second National Bank charter will expire May 6th, and the Third National Bank will be launched with most flattering prospects. The capital stock of the new bank will be \$50,000 divided into 500 shares of \$100 each.
