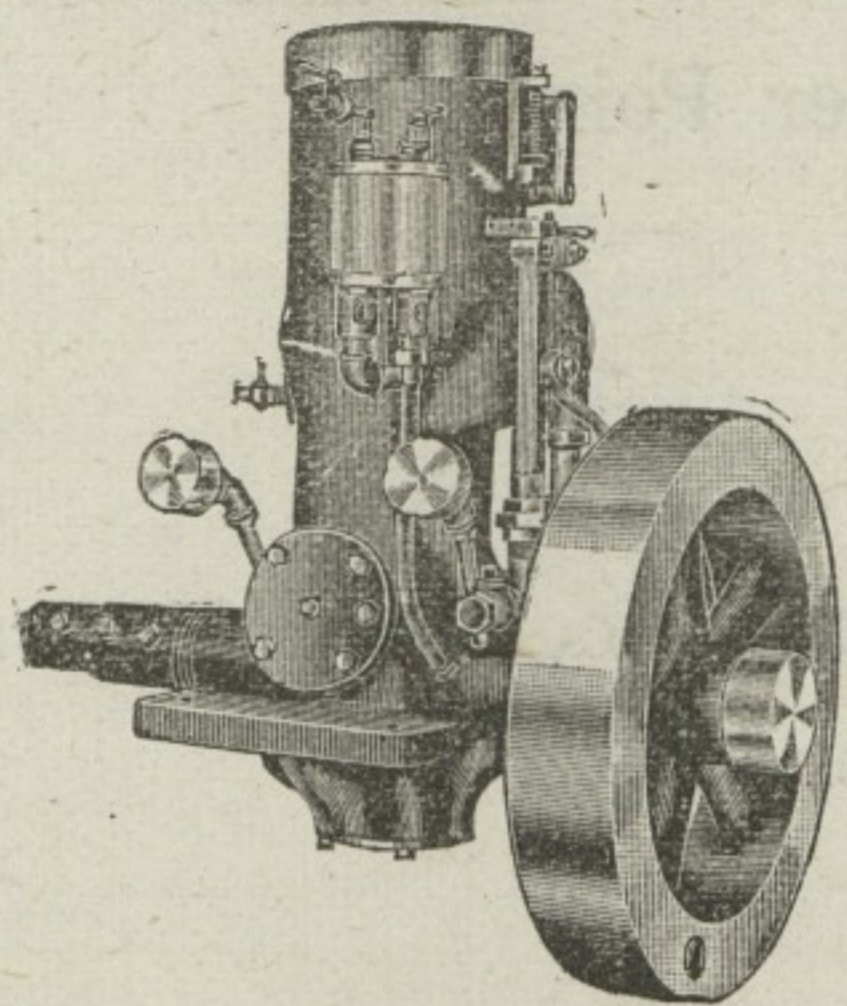

**Oratorical Contest.**

The twelfth annual contest of the Oratorical Association of Maryland Colleges took place last Friday evening in William Smith Hall, Washington College, in the presence of a large and fashionable audience. The address of welcome was delivered by Dr. James W. Cain, president of Washington College, the response being made by Prof. Charles S. Richardson, of Maryland Agricultural College. The four contestants with their subjects were as follows: Russell P. Hartles, St. John's College, "An Unsolved Problem"; Russell Vinton Lewis, Western Maryland College, "Commercialism and its Opportunity"; John Hamilton Hessey, Washington College, "The Degeneracy of the Senate"; and Millard E. Tydings, Maryland Agricultural College, "A Plea for Universal Peace." The orations were well delivered by each contestant, and the thought and diction in each was of a high standard. The judges, Samuel K. Dennis, Esq., and Rev. Henry Branch, of Baltimore, and De Courcy W. Thom, Esq., of Blakely, Queen Anne's county, awarded first prize to Millard E. Tydings, Maryland Agricultural College, and second prize to Russell Vinton Lewis, Western Maryland College. The contest was an exceedingly close one, the average of the first and lowest showing a difference of only a few points. The average of the second prize man was 251, while Mr. Hessey, of Washington College, made an average of 25. The decision of the first prize man by the judges met with the approval of the audience, while there were many who thought the Western Maryland man's voice would deprive him of a prize. The contest was under the direction of Dr. E. J. Clarke, president of the association. The college mandolin club, under the direction of Mrs. James W. Cain, with Prof. Pete at the piano, furnished excellent music for the occasion.

**Water Board Organizes.**

The Chestertown Water Board organized for another year's business on Tuesday evening. Mr. J. D. Bacchus was re-elected president, Mr. Bowers secretary and Mr. Charles N. Satterfield treasurer. Mr. Charles S. Smith was re-elected superintendent at a salary of \$500 per year and John Ringgold was appointed engineer at a salary of \$10 per week. The Board is making preparations to begin the contemplated improvements in strict accordance with the provisions of the committee of the citizens of Chestertown as soon as the bonds are sold and the money is in hand, which should not be later than June 1. The bonds are advertised for sale in this issue.
