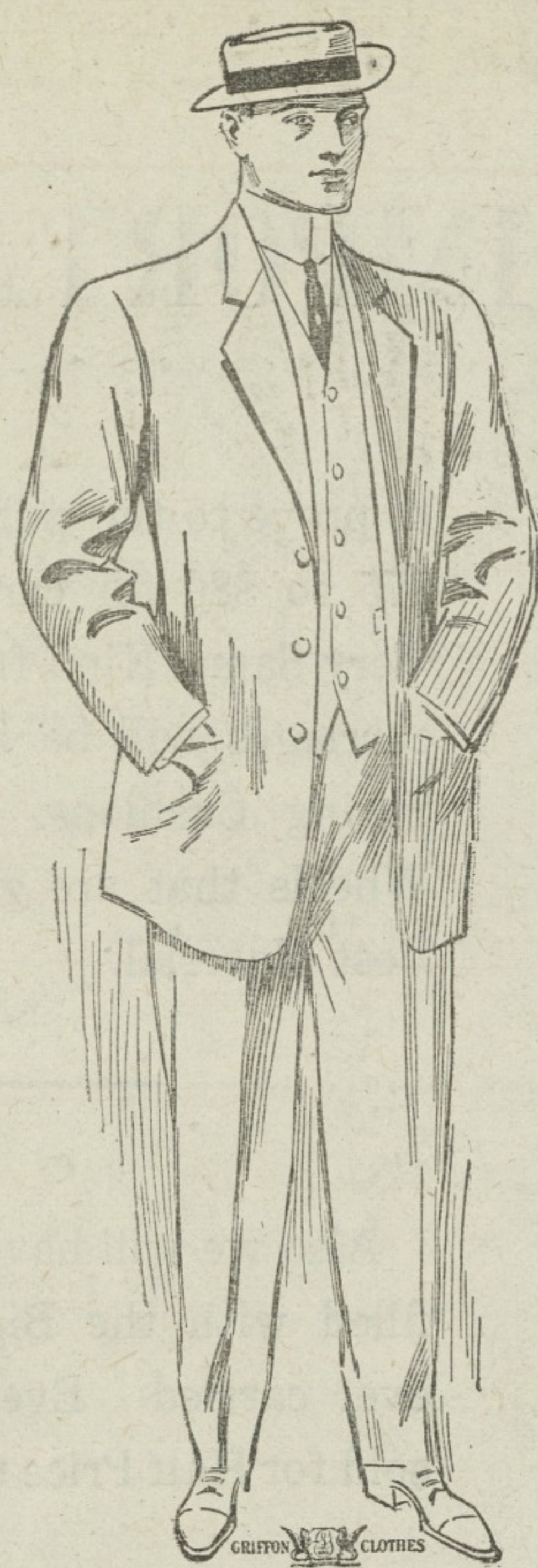

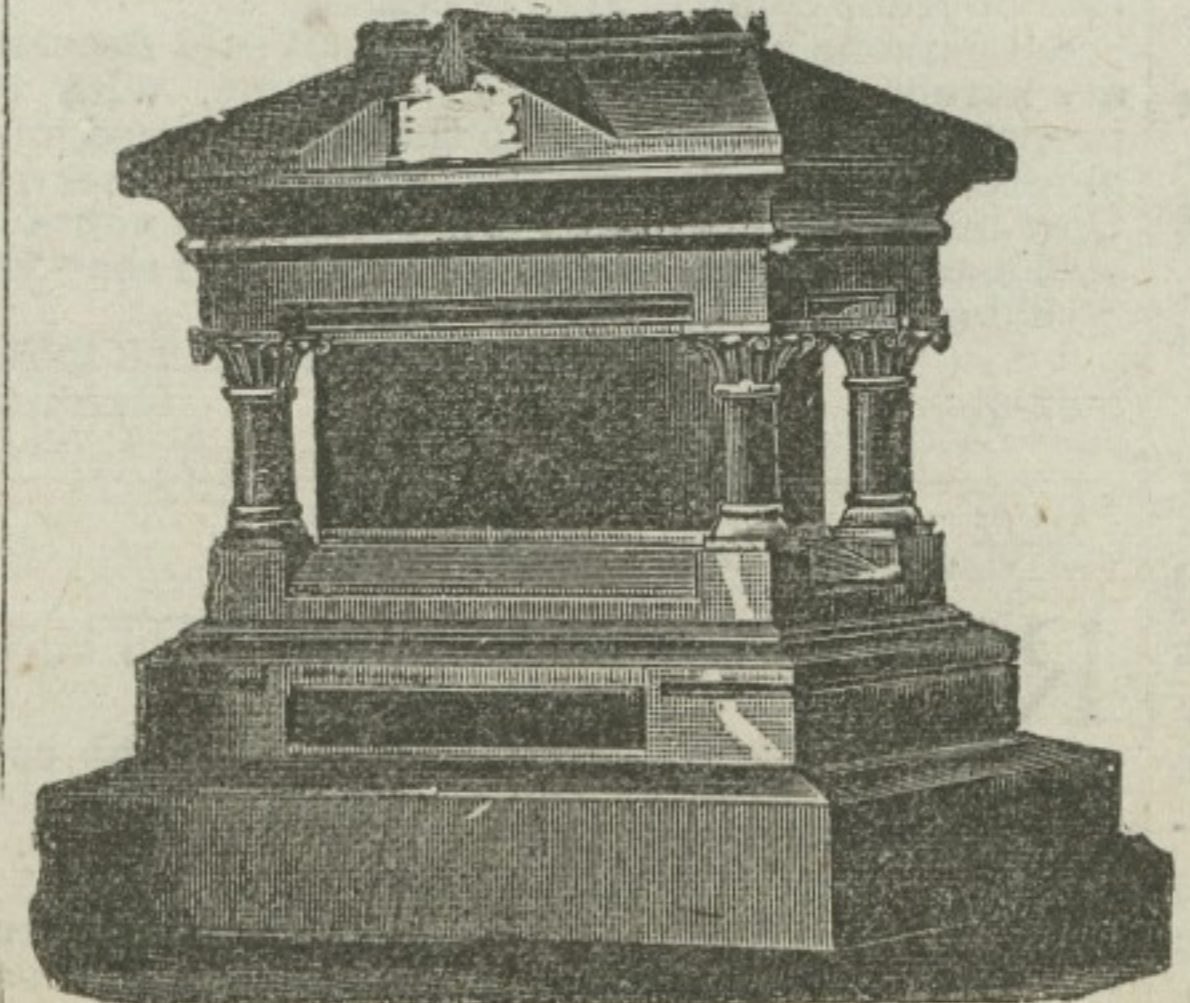

A CASE OF MISTAKEN IDENTITY.

Among our many departed citizens few, if any, have left a more enduring memory than Mr. William Henry Legg, popularly known as Bill Henry Legg, originally of Kent Island, the well-known politician and good fellow whom death claimed a few years ago. Everyone knew "Bill," and no matter what company he was in, "Bill" never shut his eye nor his heart to the claims of friendship. To know him once was to know him always; to meet him once was the same as to meet him a million times, as "Bill" had but one face—and that was a good one—which he wore every day in the week, including Sunday, and which left the impression that its owner was a whole-souled, upright, square good fellow, who left sunshine and laughter in his back, and because of which it might be said, "He left the world better than he found it." If a man who has made two blades of grass grow where only one grew before is accounted a philanthropist, how much more justly can the man be so termed who makes two smiles grow where none existed—who brings even the approach of a smile to the sad and melancholy hypochondriac, and all who cannot laugh are hypochondriacs. Few realize the value of laughter, which is dynamic common sense. It is Kinetic Faith, Hope and Charity. In it, as in the poet's flower from the craned wall, lies implicit all the wisdom of the sages and the seers and a balm for every ills. Cultivate healthy, hearty laughter if you would be happy and spread happiness around you. This was Bill Henry Legg as all remember him. Consequently he held public office nearly all his life, and if he was living now would be still "holding on." To his credit are two terms in the Legislature; Custom House, Baltimore, four years; Cattle Scales four or five years, &c. Those who knew "Bill" Henry Legg will joyfully join with us in saying "Requiescat in pace," and they will also join with us in joyfully extending a welcome to Chestertown, and in extending the glad hand to his double, Mr. Rider Haggard.

If Mr. Legg was not dead, no one who has seen Mr. Haggard would doubt he was in town, such is the striking resemblance, and if any lingering doubt remained it would be at once removed by hearing Mr. Haggard laugh. Nothing it is proclaimed could be so similar as the appearance of both, except it be their healthy, hearty laughter. This has now become a familiar song with Mr. Haggard, as in many places on the Eastern Shore he has been taken for Mr. Legg. So when Mr. Clough, the well-known Chestertown heryman, asked him a few evenings ago if he knew "Bill" Henry Legg, Mr. H. told him he was his brother, to which Mr. Clough made answer: "If he wasn't dead I'd believe you are Bill himself," and he introduced him as Mr. Legg's brother to some of his friends.
