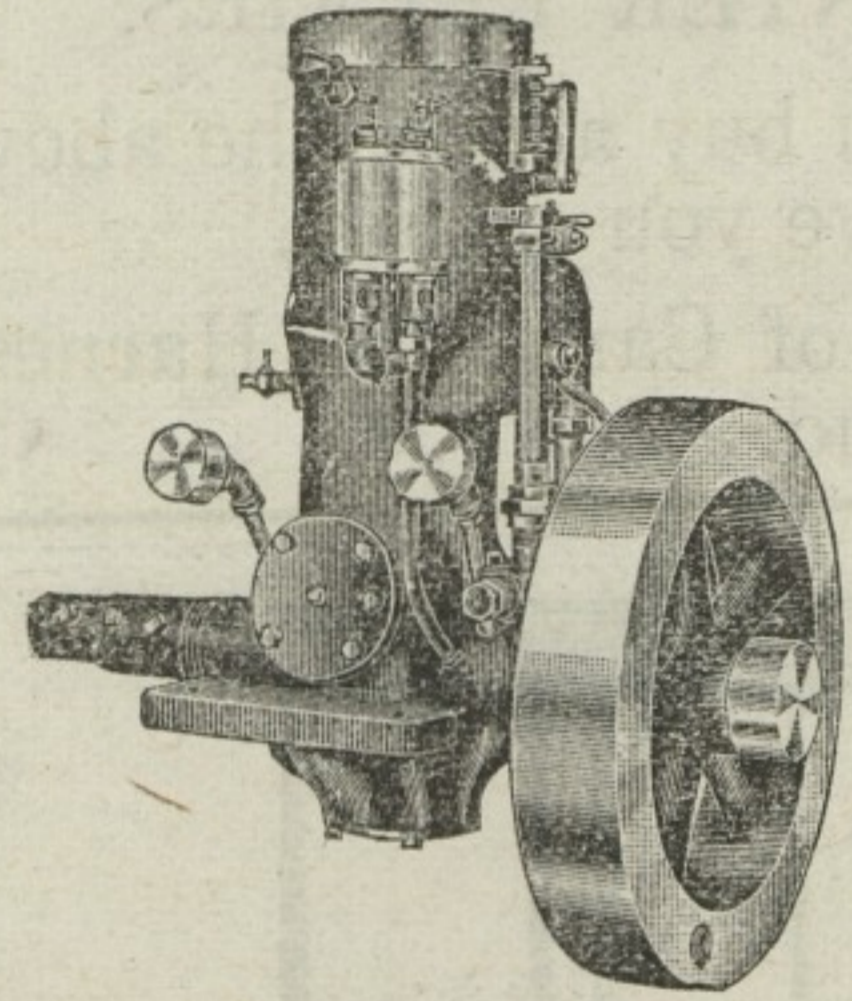

### Cannon-Morris Case Settled.

The case of David Cannon vs. Walter T. Morris for \$5000 for alleged false arrest, removed from Kent court to Centreville, was concluded in the Centreville court on Tuesday evening at 8 o'clock, after five days of sensational trial and argument, when the jury rendered a verdict in favor of Mr. Morris, throwing the cost of the case upon Cannon. This case attracted a large crowd of witnesses and visitors from Kent to Centreville, and its outcome was awaited with considerable interest. It was generally conceded here that Mr. Morris would receive a verdict, and while he was put to heavy expense to defend his cause in a case without the slightest semblance of merit in it from the Cannon standpoint, he will consider his money well invested if the public will lay the blame for the responsibility where it properly belongs for bringing to trial a case that has cast such a reflection upon the dignity and respectability of one of Kent county's most estimable citizens and most conscientious business men. Such cases are a disgrace to our courts of justice, and serve only to belittle the dignity of the trial table. The case cost Mr. Morris nearly \$500 to say nothing of the embarrassment to which he was subjected by the trial's procedure. We understand that the attorneys for Cannon, Messrs. Wm. W. Beck and S. Scott Beck, have filed a motion for a new trial. Hope H. Barroll, Esq., and Thos. J. Keating, Esq., ably defended Mr. Morris.
