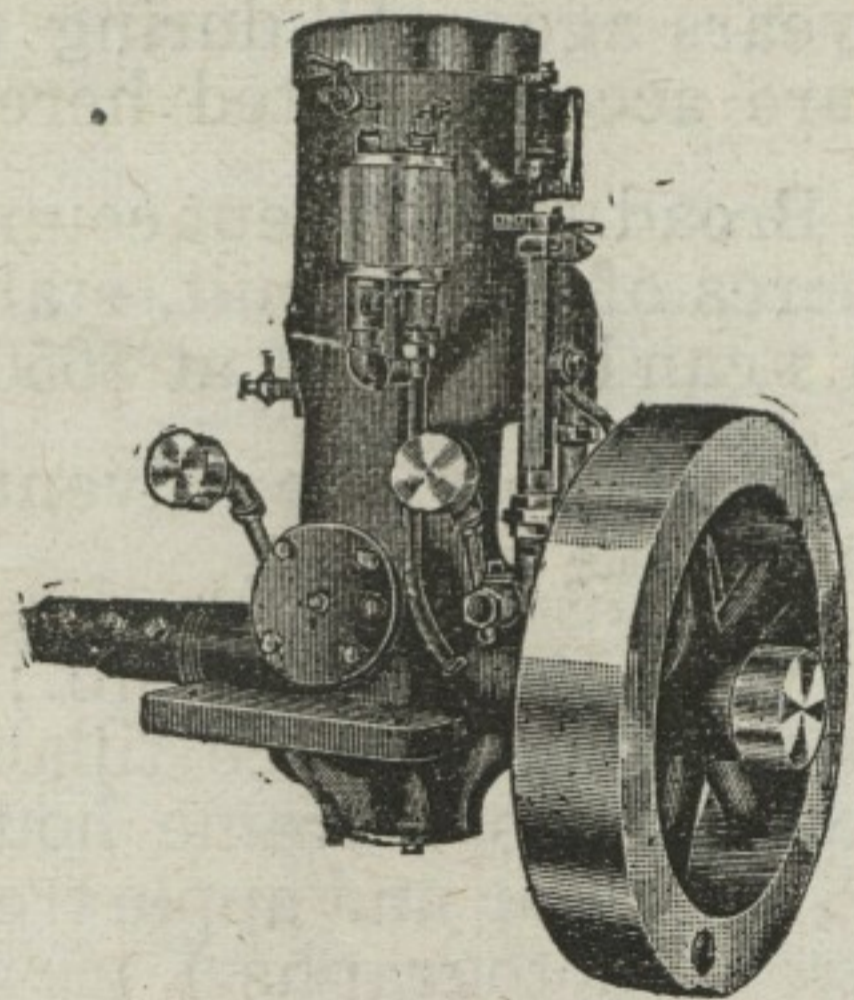

The commencement exercises of the Piney Neck High School, Prof. Charles Wheatley, principal, will be held on Wednesday evening, June 22d. Mr. L. Bates Russell will deliver the address to the graduates and Supt. Milton Melvin will award the diplomas.

The School Board at its meeting on Tuesday established in the Chestertown High School a Department of Domestic Science, and appointed Miss Annie Copper, the present efficient secretary to Supt.
