

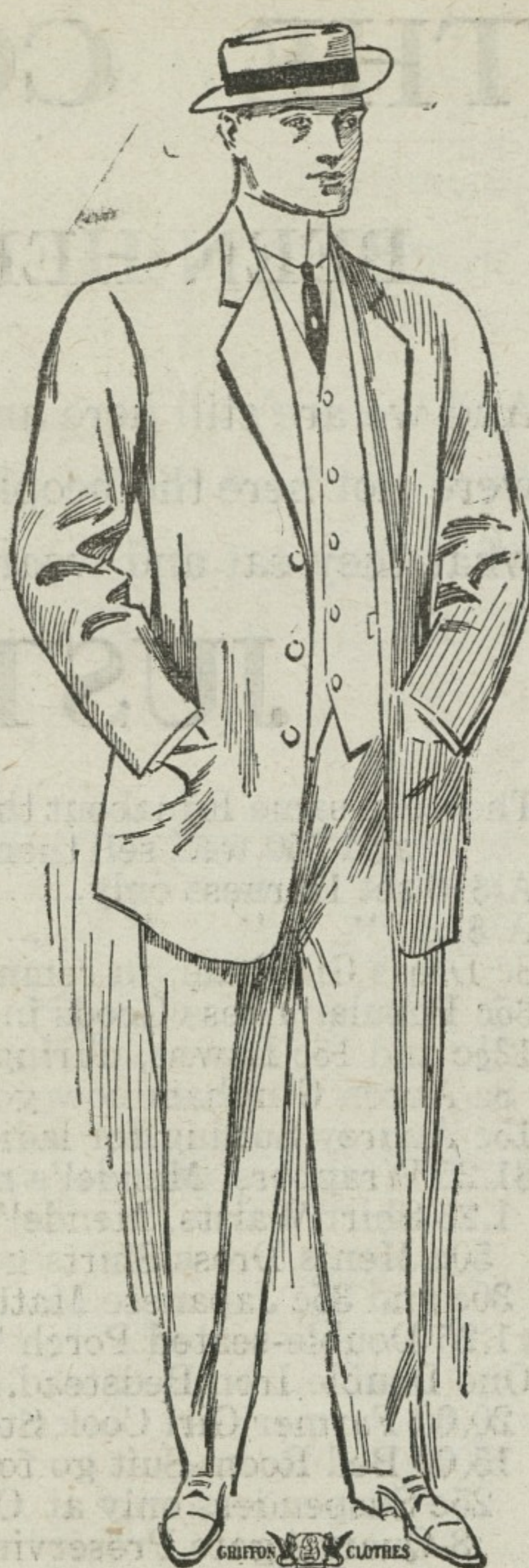

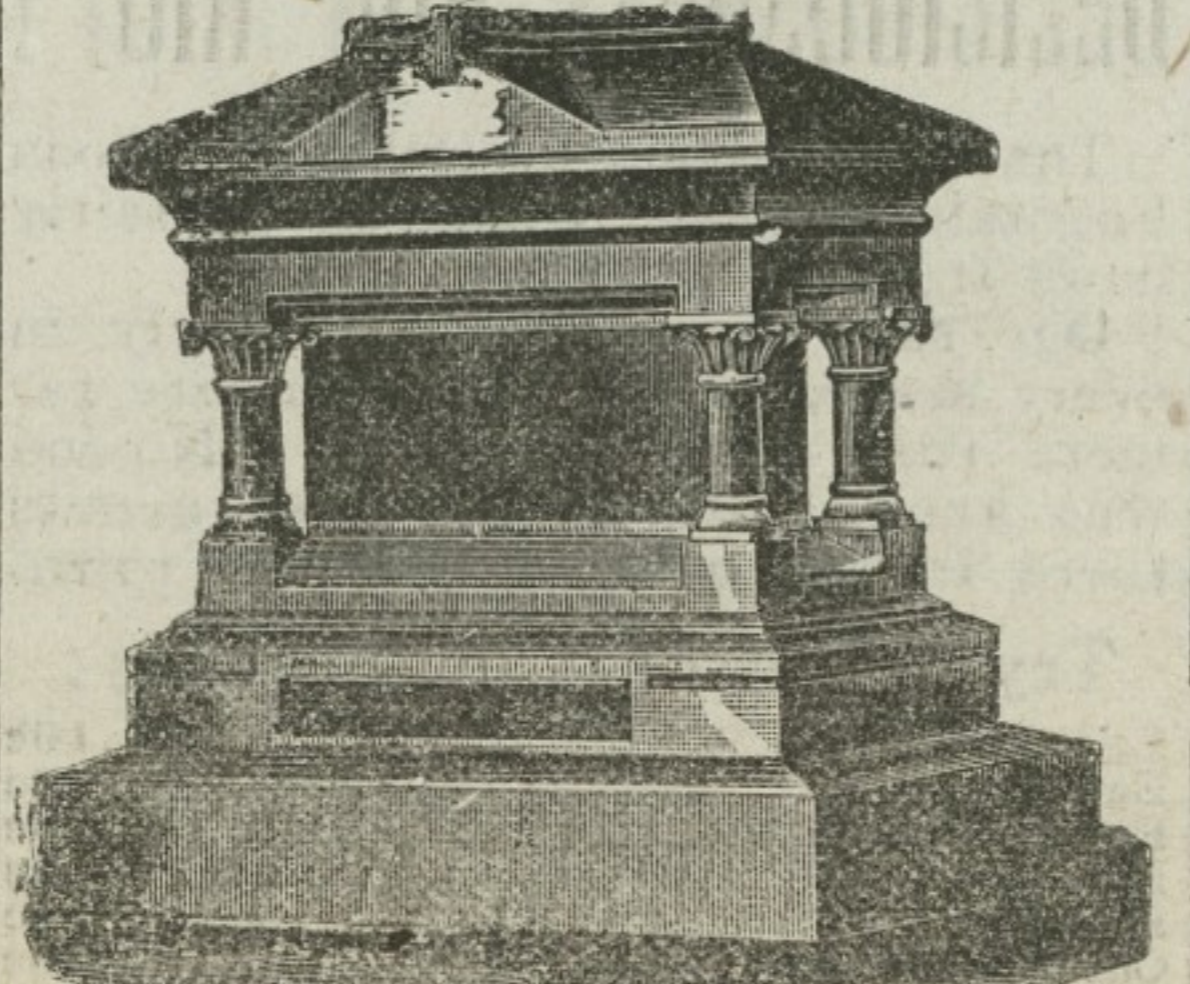

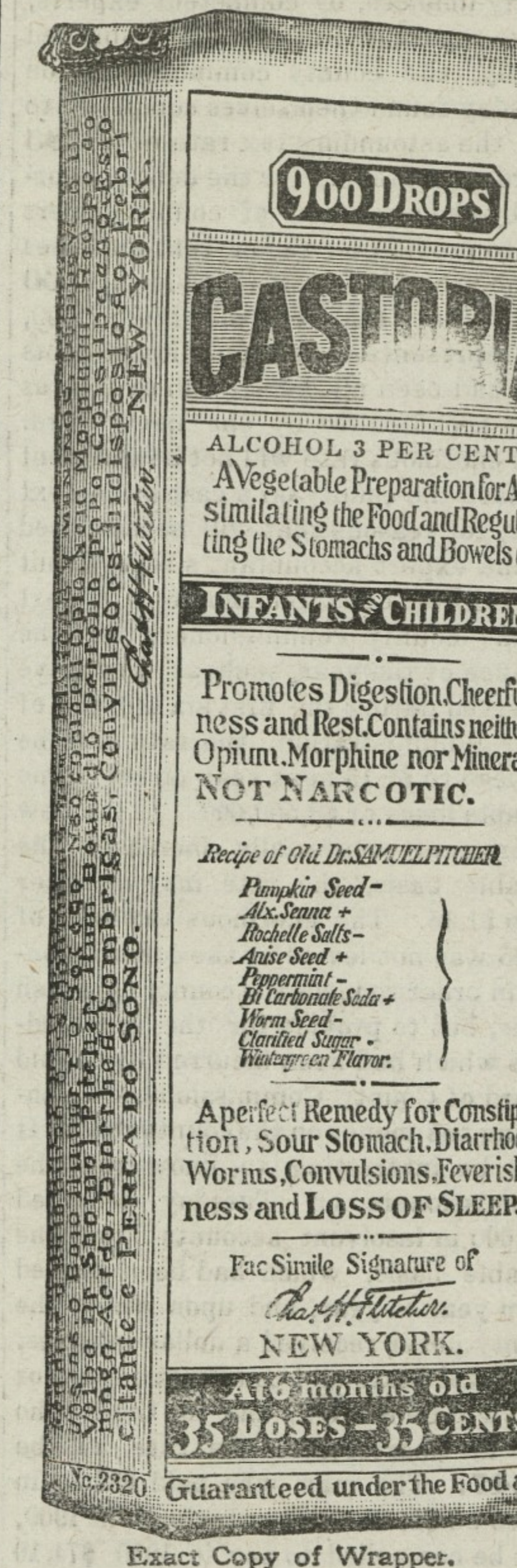
SCHOFIELD—GROGAN.

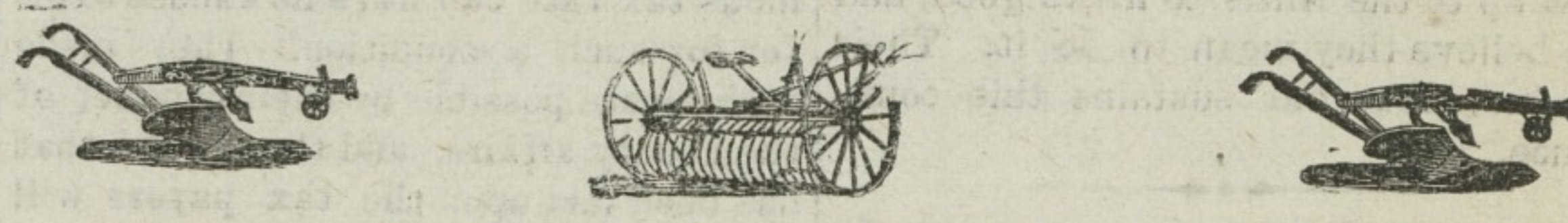
