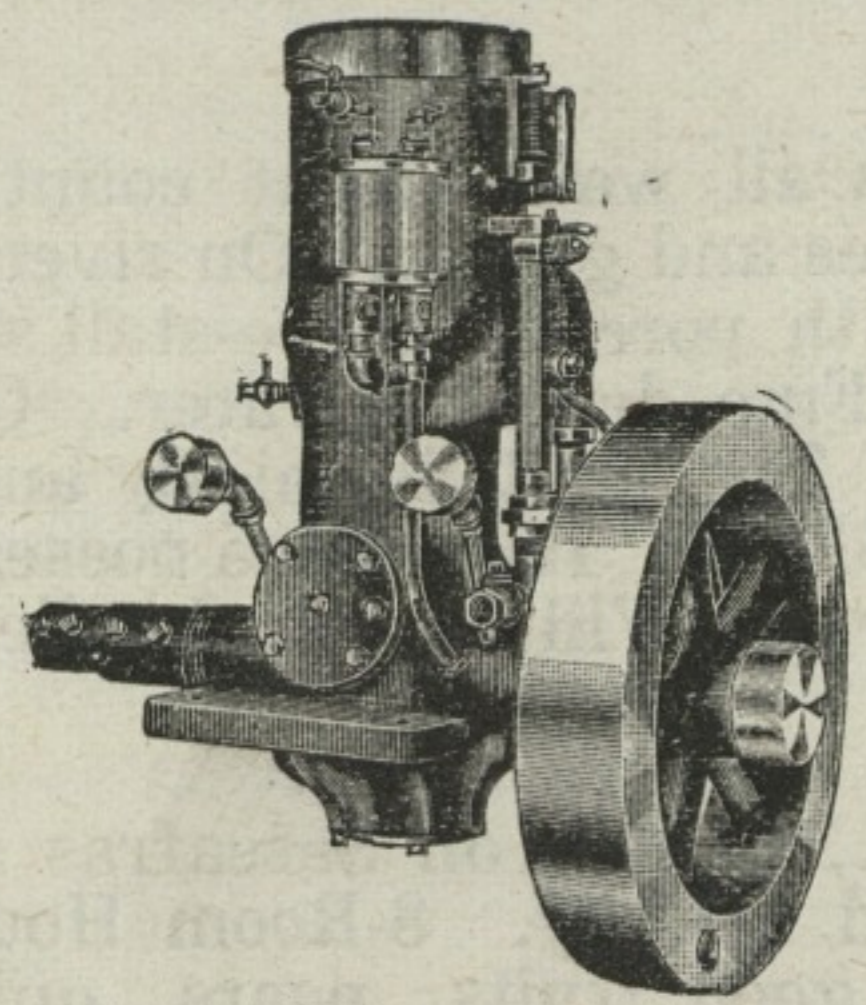

### PLAYING POLITICS WITH COUNTY FUNDS.

Here is an evidence that the Organization forces cared more about playing politics with the county funds and doing everything in their power to embarrass the present Board of County Commissioners than they did about conducting the affairs of the county in an economical and businesslike manner.

The old board of commissioners levied in 1909, \$24,000 in the cash levy for the schools of the county, which money was to be paid in orders. Instead of paying the full \$24,000, they paid only \$20,000. On Tuesday morning the school board made demands upon the Board of County Commissioners for the \$4,000, and the commissioners found that they had not the money to pay it, because it has required every dollar of the county's money with the exception of a balance of about \$2,000, which ex-treasurer Beck passed over to Treasurer Tarbuton on Tuesday, to pay for the bills which the old board had created during the latter part of their term. In order to save the school board from an embarrassing position in not being able to pay the teachers their last quarter's salary, the commissioners were compelled to provide for the payment of this \$4,000 by certificate, which necessitated adding \$366.67 interest for 18 months.

On Friday last the clerk to the commissioners received a letter from the Sykesville Bank, containing a certificate given to the Spring Grove Hospital and assigned by them to the bank. The order for this certificate was passed Jan. 19, 1909, the certificate was issued August 31, 1909, and yet there is ten months' interest added to the certificate, amounting to \$7.50, and begins not from the time the order for the certificate was given, Jan. 19, 1909, but from August 31, 1909, after the 1909 levy was struck to June 30, 1910, after the 1910 levy was struck. And yet the books in the commissioners' office show that this certificate, which was No. 3,498, was included in the 1909 levy.

These are two items of expense that the present Board of County Commissioners knew nothing whatever about, and instead of being provided for in the levy of 1909 they will have to be provided for in the 1911 levy. And yet the Organization organ says that the present board of commissioners has levied \$30,000 or \$40,000 more than is necessary to meet the expenses of the county. The sole purpose of the county indebtedness in levying a tax rate of \$1.85 was to save the county from bankruptcy, and yet it is known that even that enormous rate is not enough to meet the actual indebtedness of the county. Bills like the above are coming into the commissioners' office every week, and there is no telling where it is going to stop.

### Comments for the Transcript.

Mr. Joseph E. George, of Sudlersville, one of the largest land-owners in Queen Annes and Kent counties, is an esteemed subscriber to the Transcript. In renewing his subscription to the paper this week, he stated that he is very much pleased with the paper and likes to read it. Mr. George is one of the largest tax-payers in this section of the county, and he is always appreciative of any efforts exerted in the taxpayers' behalf. He is also one of Queen Annes oldest and most conservative men and takes a deep interest in public affairs. If he keeps on buying land in Kent, we shall surely adopt him as one of our own, and Queen Annes' loss will be Kent's gain.

We have also received numerous congratulations from tax-payers throughout the town and county upon last Saturday's issue of the paper. The people are reading the Transcript and are keeping themselves informed about county finances. And what pleases us most is that all, save the most prejudiced men, are thoroughly in accord with the paper in giving the facts regarding the people's interest.
