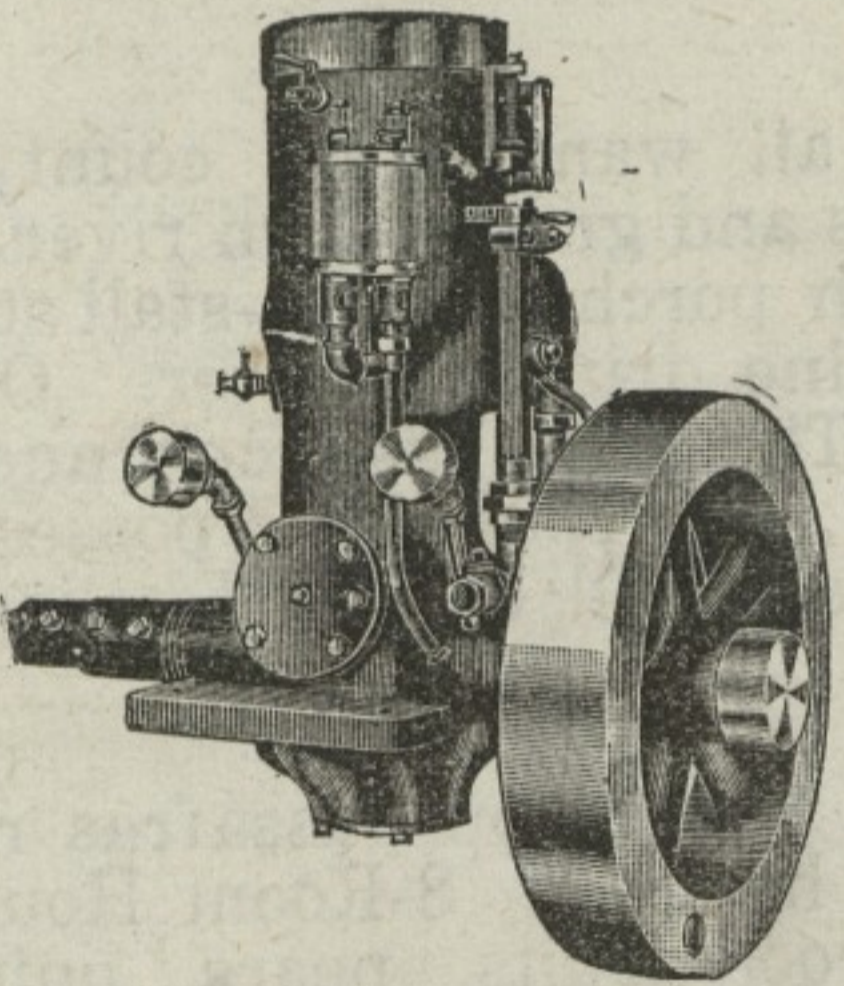

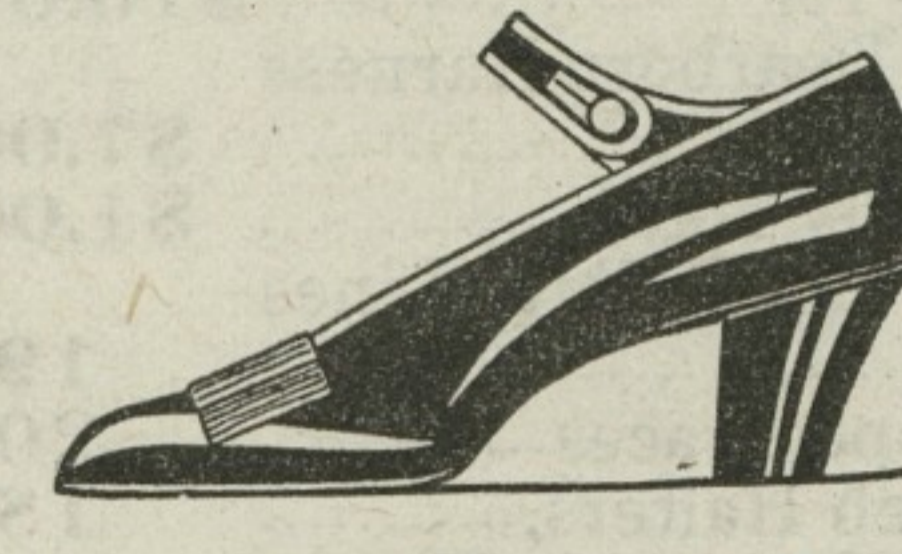

## Good Business Methods.

Mr. Samuel Hicks, the efficient clerk  
to the Board of County Commissioners,  
is proving his worth as a business man  
by the careful and systematic manner  
in which he is conducting the affairs of  
the office. He has everything so sys-  
tematically arranged in his office that it  
is not the slightest trouble for business  
men to get any information they desire  
upon a moment's notice. Mr. Hicks is  
at present engaged in keeping a monthly  
type-written record of every item of  
expense to the county, so that it is pos-  
sible to-day to know exactly how much  
money has been issued by the Board in  
orders and certificates since the striking  
of the levy for the month of June and  
July. The record prepared by Mr.  
Hicks gives the name of every man re-  
ceiving money from the county for work  
done on roads and bridges, salaries of  
all officials, court and jail expenses,  
pensions issued, and every other item  
necessary for the tax-payer to know.  
Any one interested may see these items  
simply upon inquiry at the office. Mr.  
Hicks has suggested the publication of  
these monthly records, and states that  
he is now preparing for August a record  
that will be so condensed and yet so  
clear that it will be in form to publish.  
We will gladly give such a report space  
in our columns for there is no better in-  
formation for the tax-payer. Mr. Hicks'  
report for June and July shows the  
total number of orders and certificates  
for every item of county expense to be  
as follows:

Total Number of Orders - \$4,112.08  
" " " Certificates 1,680.69

Total Expenses for June and July \$5,792.77  
The orders included \$1375 in interest  
on bonds, \$112.71 on roads and bridges,  
while the certificates include commis-  
sioners salaries, \$401.60, road engineer's  
salary, \$266.66, court house and jail,  
\$652.48, State's Attorney's salary  
\$326.95, thus showing the tax-payers  
that the money has been expended for  
absolutely necessary and legitimate  
purposes. The County Commissioners  
are to be highly commended for the  
economy they are using in the expendi-  
ture of the people's money, and Mr.  
Hicks, their efficient clerk, is to be  
congratulated upon his systematic and  
business-like conduct of the office.

## Telephone Trouble.

If the patrons of the telephone can-  
not find the numbers of those they wish  
to call they should ask for "information  
clerk." It is the duty of the company  
to furnish numbers through the "in-  
formation clerk." If this be not done then  
the company is liable in a suit for dam-  
ages for each time it refuses to give  
prompt service through "information"  
and furnish any number. Any lawyer  
in town will take such case and will  
make no charge if the company will not  
comply with such request of the patron  
if made at the time.

Many persons whose servants cannot  
read are put to great inconvenience
