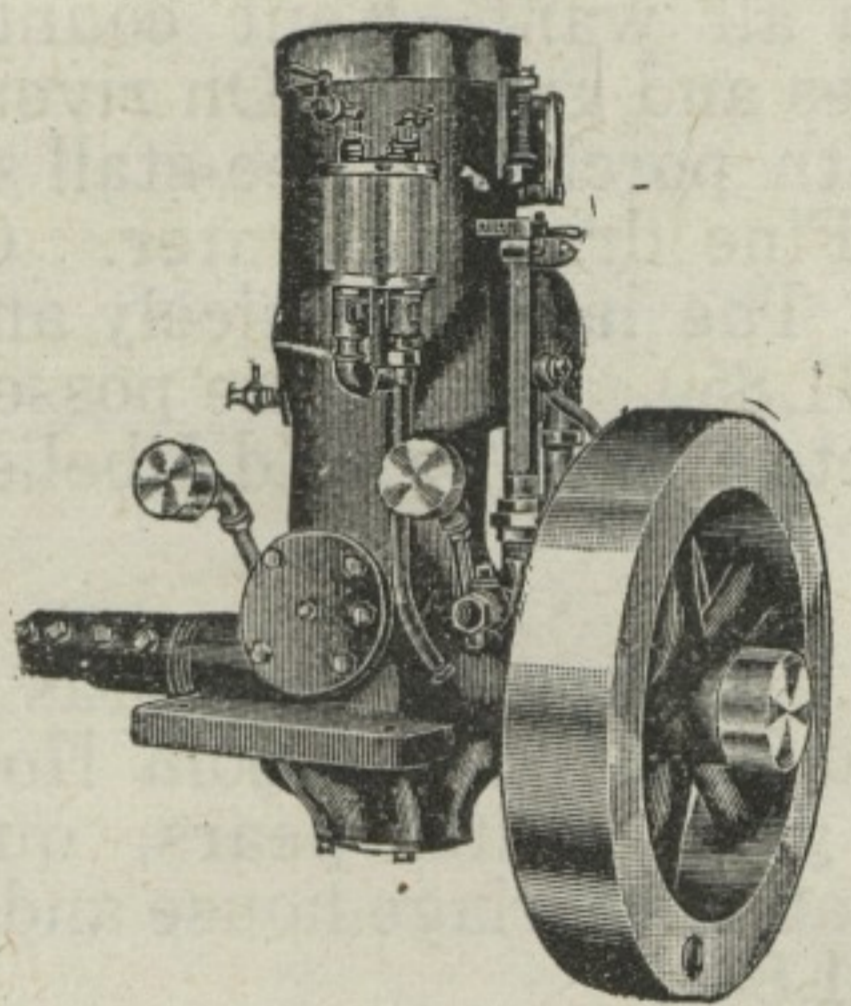

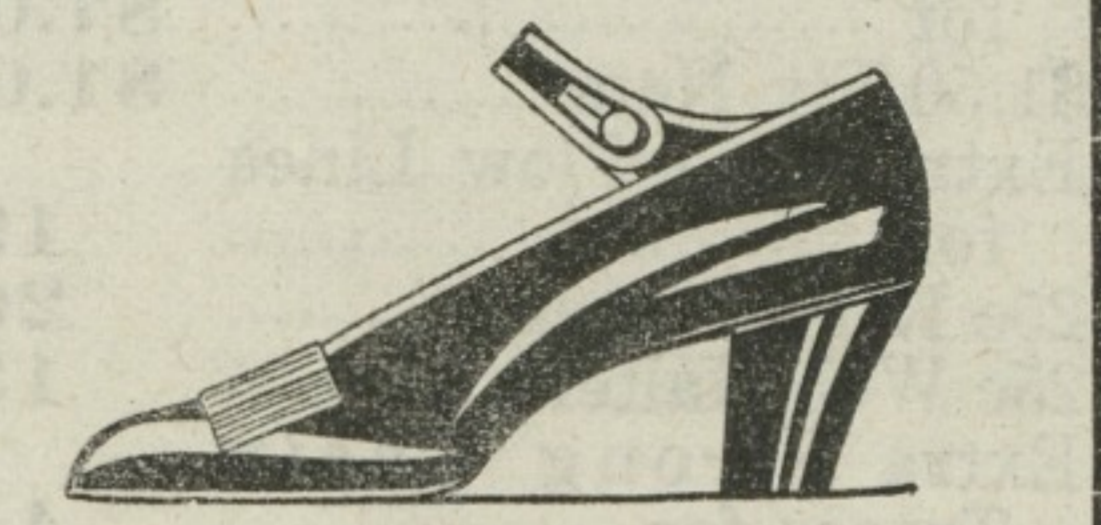

MISS SARAH J. DUDLEY.
Miss Sarah J. Dudley died at her home
in Centerville Sunday night of a com-
plication of diseases. She was born near
Sudlersville in the upper part of Queen
Anne's county, 64 years ago, and was a
daughter of the late James P. and Mary
A. Dudley. About 40 years ago she
went to Centerville. For the past 30
years she had conducted a boarding-
house and was known by a majority of
the traveling men on the Peninsula.
Surviving her are three sisters (Mrs. E.
O. Lynch, Mrs. Mary A. Conegys and
Mrs. Martha McFeeley, of Centerville),
and four brothers (William C. Dudley,
of Wye Landing; Dr. S. C. Dudley, of
Church Hill; Hiram G. Dudley, of Bal-
timore, and Eugene L. Dudley, of Queens-
town). She was an aunt of County
Commissioner Bradford C. Dudley.
