



Growing Four-Eared Corn.

William H. Booth, a successful farmer of Cecil County, who has had considerable success in recent years at raising big crops of corn, has a new variety of the maize this season which he expects to break all records regarding big yields. He has only one acre of the corn planted having bought only enough seed to plant that much ground, paying \$8 per bushel for it. It is known as Four-Eared Corn, and each stock is expected to bear from three to seven ears. According to sworn statements, the corn from which the seed was taken, yielded 2263 bushels per acre. Mr. Booth would not predict what would be his yield, but expects to break all records in this section. In speaking about the new variety of corn he said that the only fault he could thus far see with it, was the enormous height of the stalks, some of them being 12 to 13 feet. They would therefore be more likely broken down by a heavy wind than a variety not so tall.
