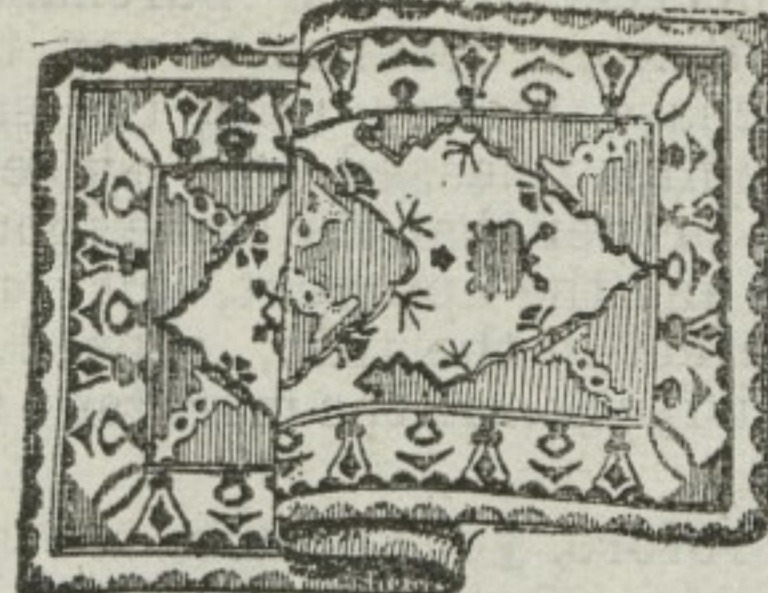

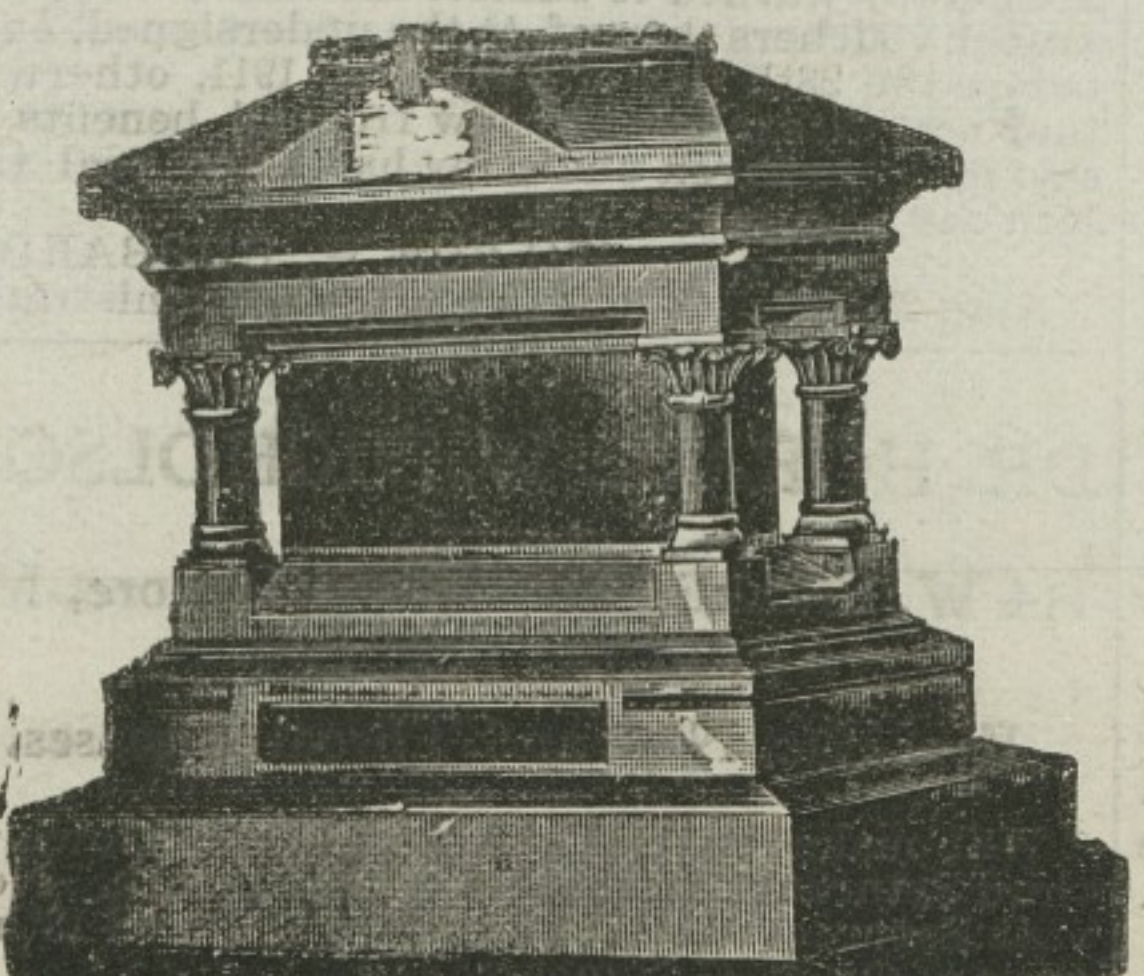

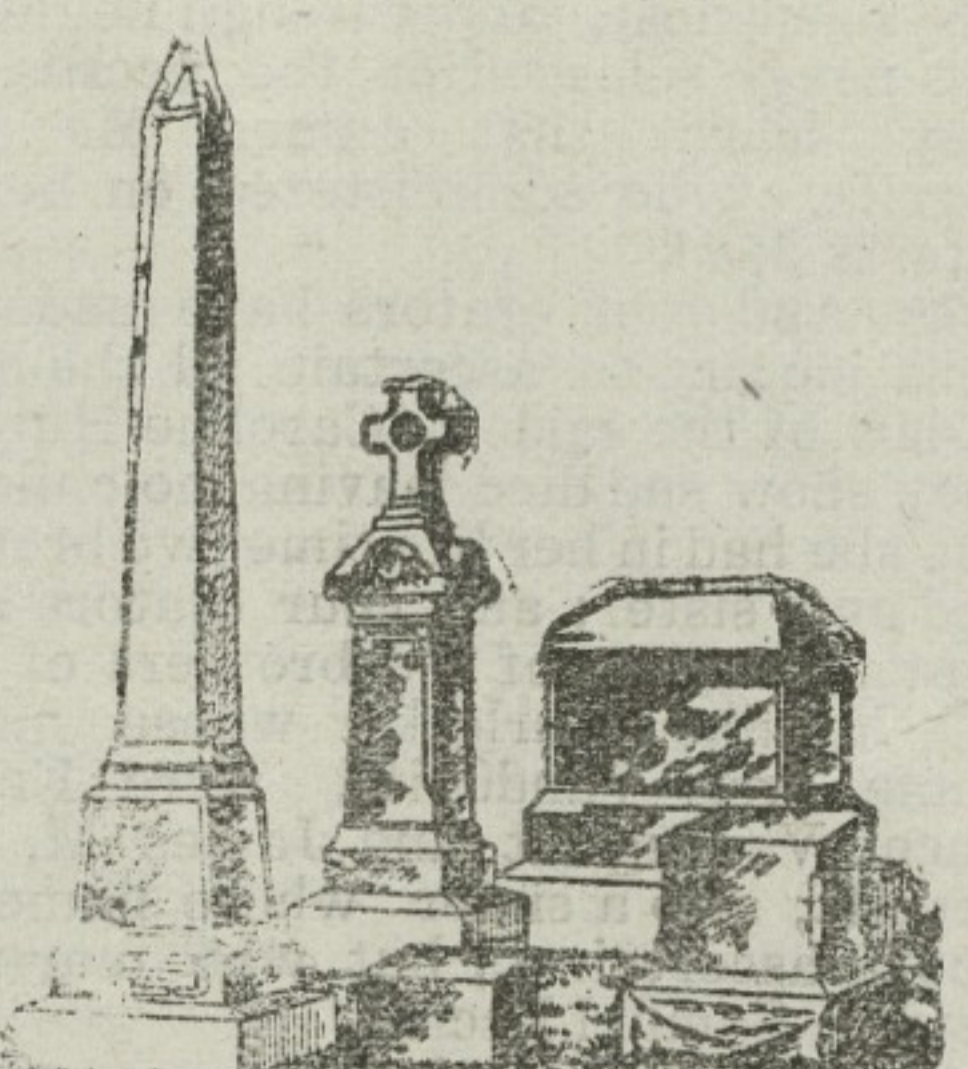

During the heavy wind storm last Tuesday night a small Pungie, an oyster runner, dragged ashore in Rock Hall Creek. No damage was done.

Although peaches were plentiful the growers realized very little profit from them. The markets were full which kept the prices down.

Miss Mary Cambell, of Baltimore, is visiting Mrs. Abe Casey. Last Sunday she encountered a very painful accident. While standing on the porch she lost her balance, fell and sprained her ankle. She was confined to the house for several days.

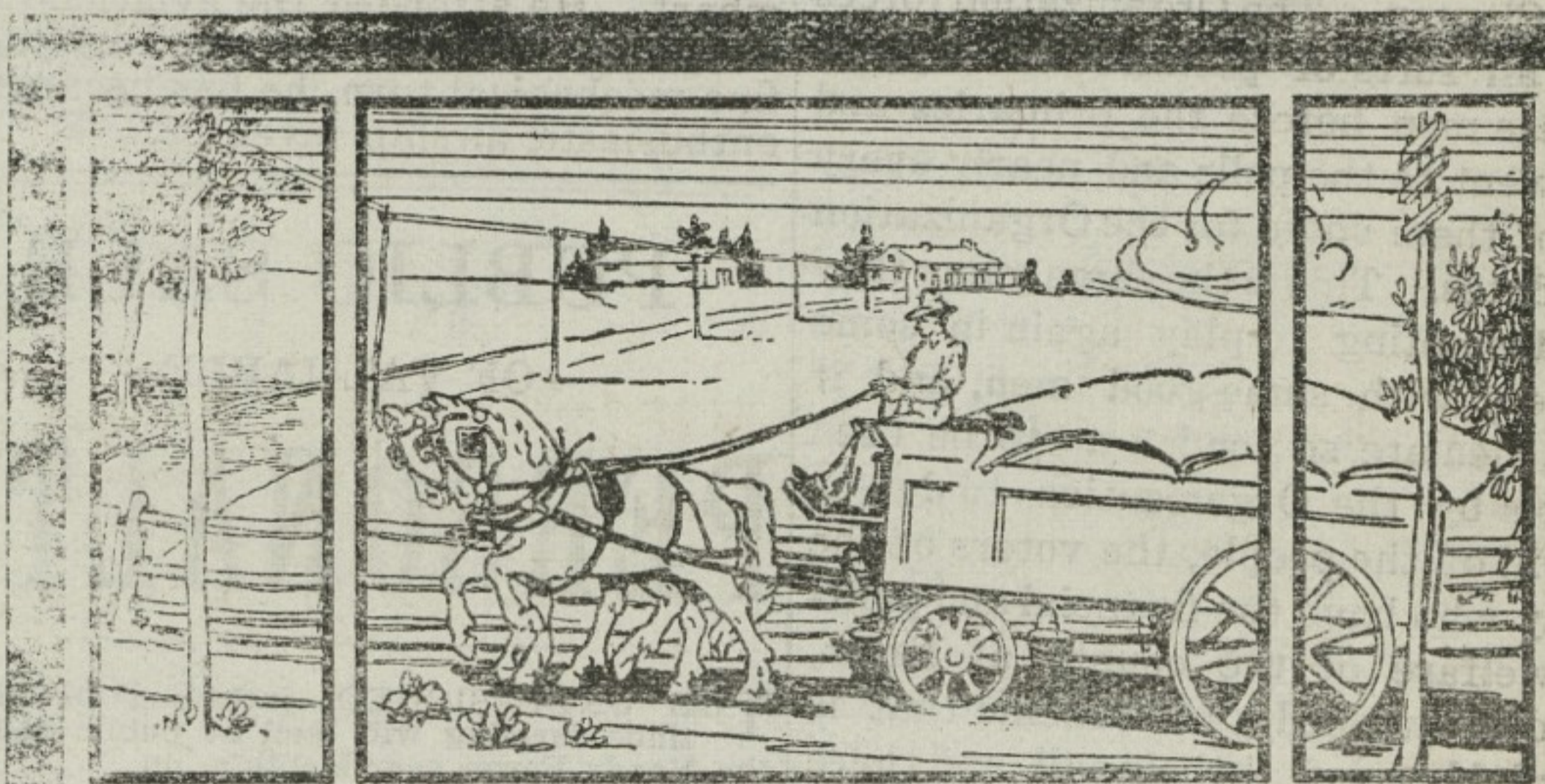
