And many a happy vision of sweet love upon the stair!

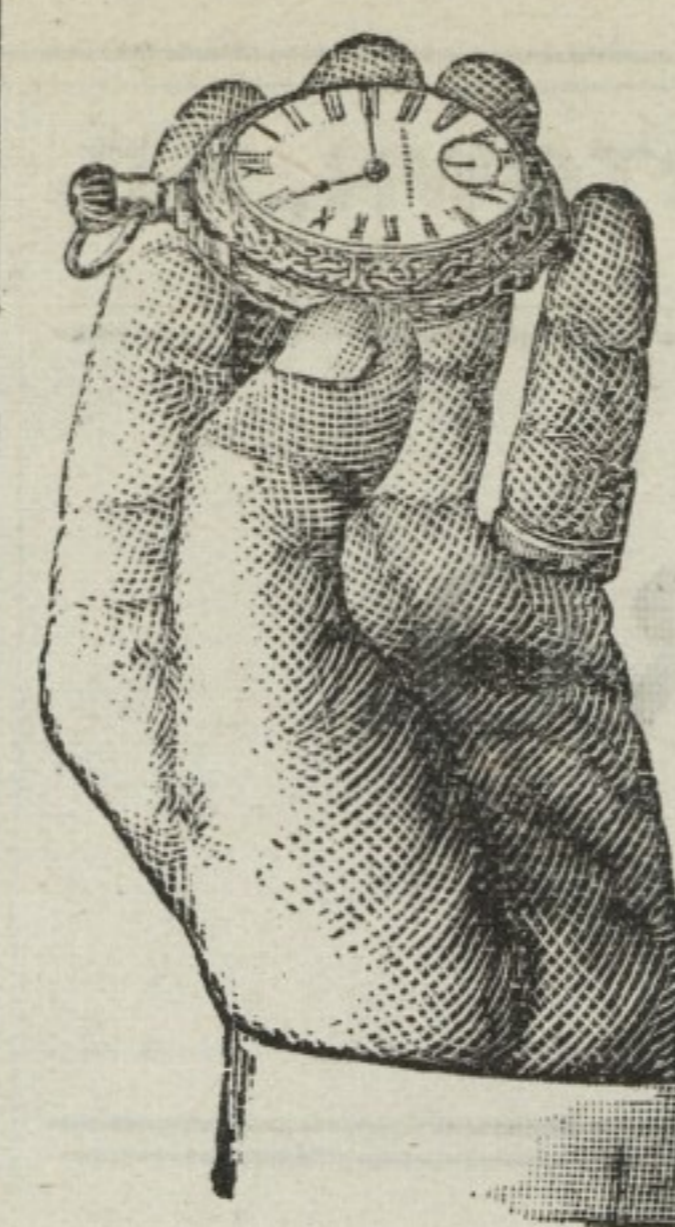
The homes of Kent are calling and the Ford is on her way,

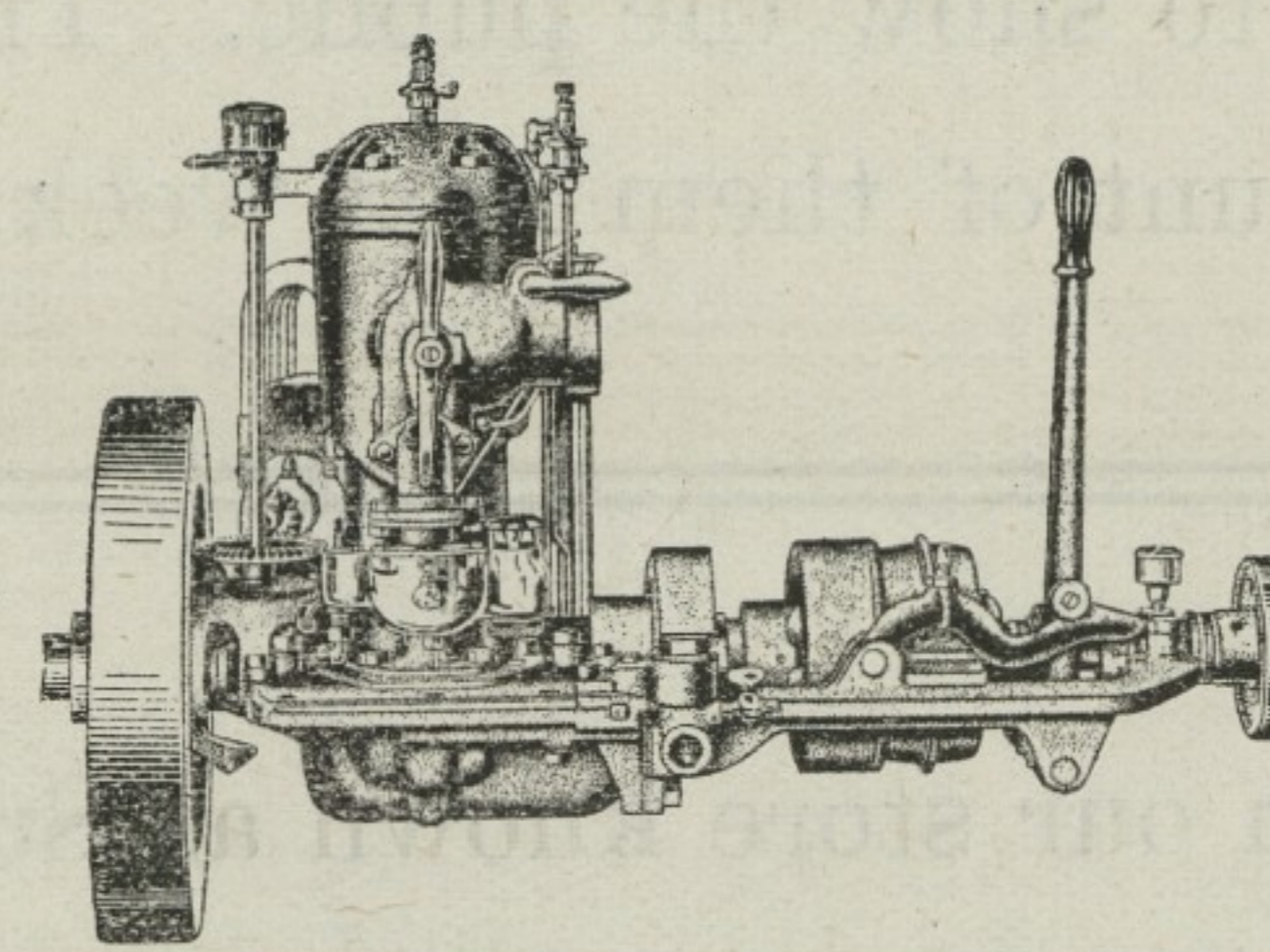

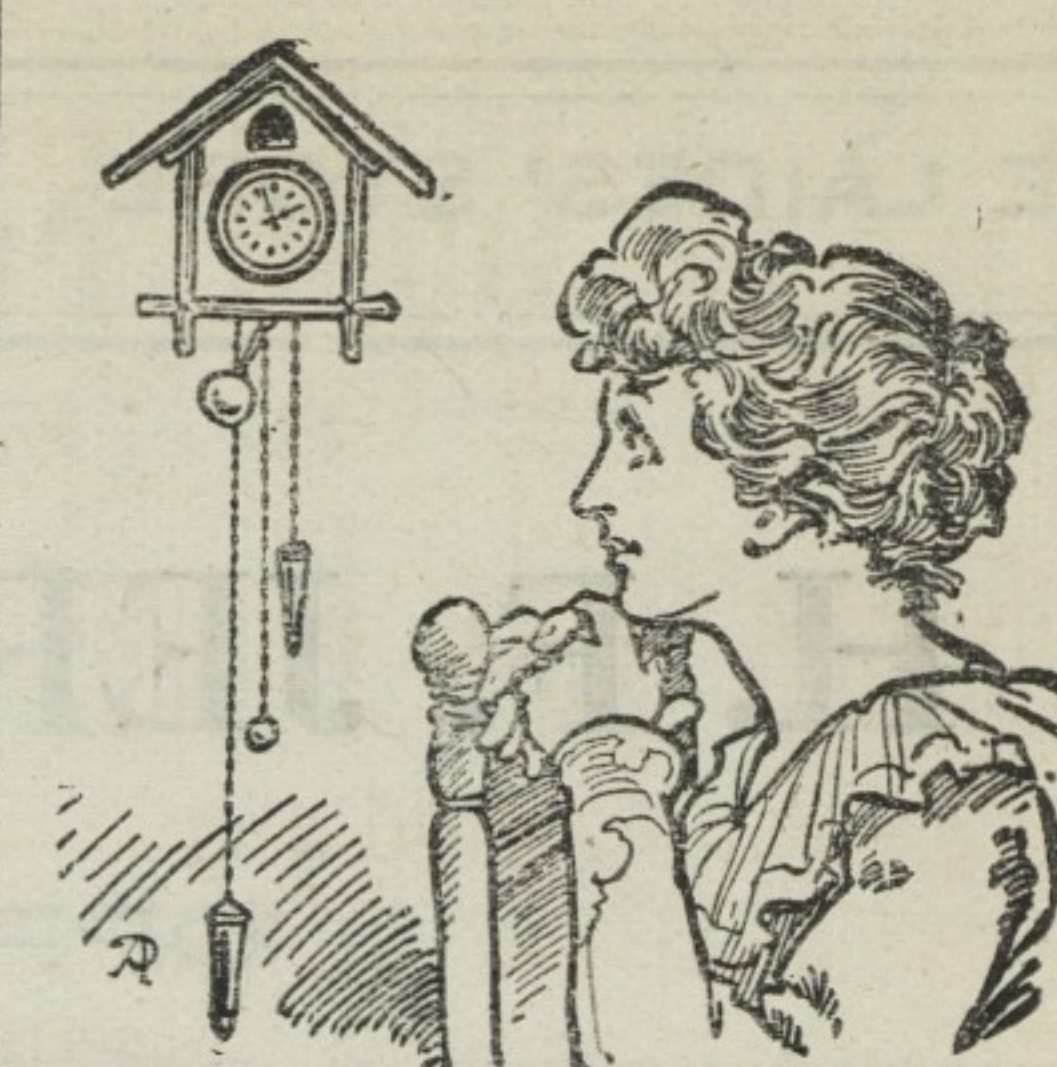
