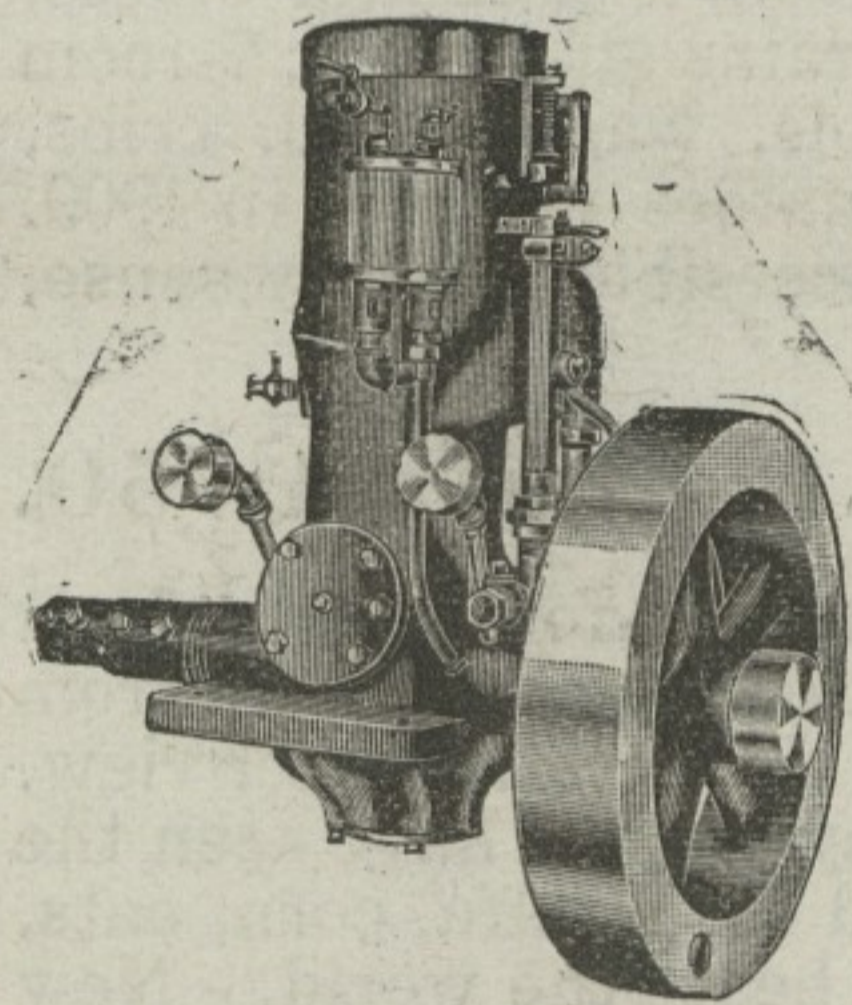

Scramble Among the Banks For County Funds.

The Chestertown Bank and the Kent
County Savings Bank through their
attorneys, Lewin W. Wickes, William
W. Beck and John D. Urie, on Saturday
last filed a petition for a mandamus
against William J. Tarbuton, Treasurer
of Kent County, asking the court to
compel Mr. Tarbuton to deposit equally
in each of the three banks of Chestertown,
according to the Act passed at the
last Session of the Legislature, all funds
which come into his hands as Treasurer.
Mr. Tarbuton has declined to deposit
these funds except in The Third National
Bank, because when he was elected
Treasurer his duty as prescribed by law,
was to keep two bank accounts only,
one for the funds of the State of Mary-
land, and the other from the funds be-
longing to Kent County. Now if he is
compelled to keep accounts in each of
the other banks, it will mean in all six
bank accounts. One for the State of
Maryland and one for Kent County in
the Chestertown Bank, and one for the
State of Maryland and one for Kent
County in the Kent County Savings
Bank. The Treasurer is thereby liable
to make just three times as many blun-
ders in banking as he was before this
law was passed.

It is an unseemly struggle for the
banks to get into. When the Treasurer
was Mr. Keyser, no one complained
about his depositing all the funds in the
Chestertown Bank. When the Treasurer,
Mr. Charles S. Smith, no one complained
about his depositing all the funds in the
Kent County Savings Bank. Now if
Mr. Tarbuton is compelled to keep six
accounts, and none of his predecessors
was compelled to keep more than two,
the people of the county will understand
the influence which seek to compel
these changes in the Treasurer's office.
It will impose such duties and liabilities
upon him, if the Court grant the Man-
damus prayed for, as would be a hard-
ship and injustice to him. His private
fortune is pledged for the safety of
these funds. He gives the Bond and
should be permitted to deposit in the
strongest bank which he may select,
the Third National Bank.
