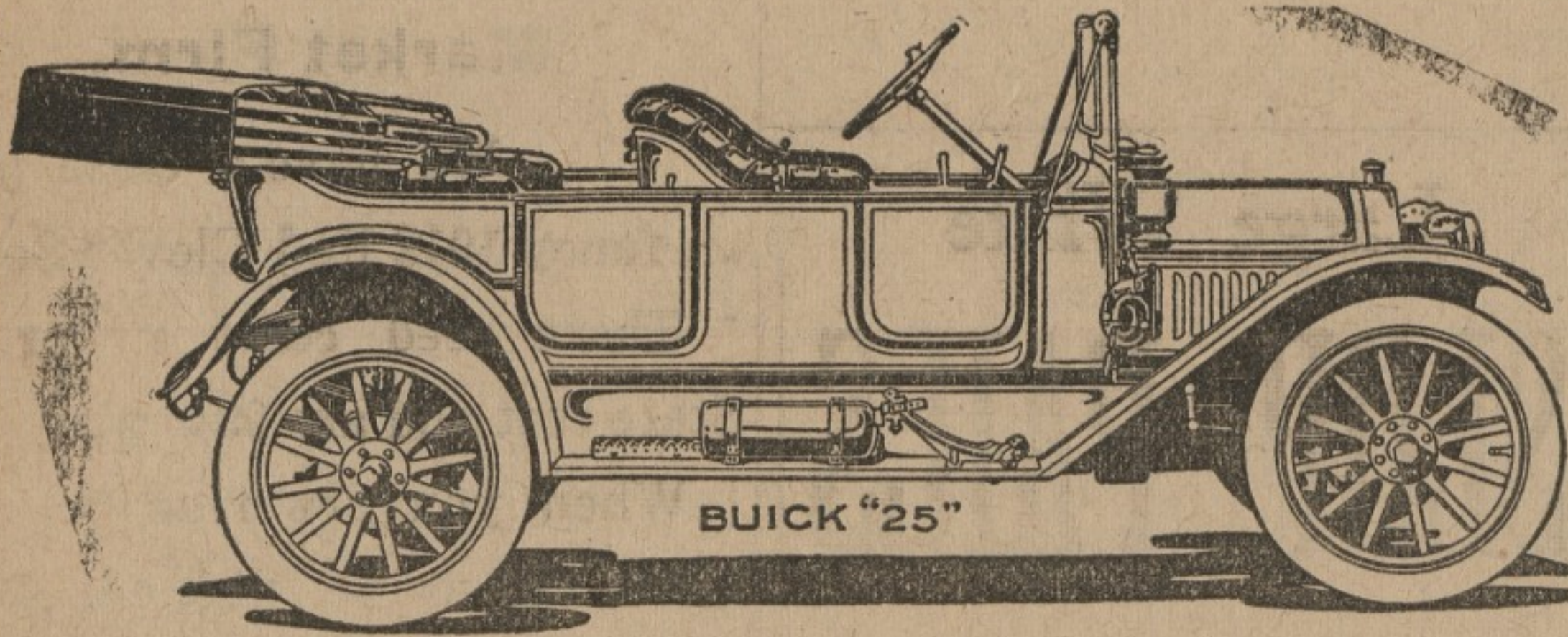

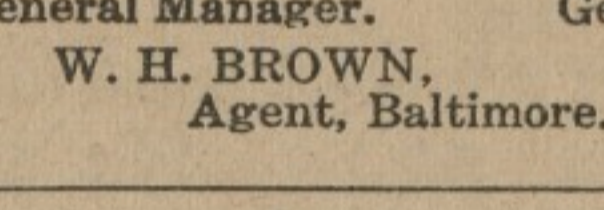

### "PROGRESSIVE" CLUB PUZZLES SOME.

#### League Attacking Marbury Has Straus' Friends In It.

#### DENNIS NAMED ALSO

#### Officers of New Association Say They Are Going to Branch Out "Pretty Soon."

Considerable surprise was expressed Saturday in political circles when the personnel of the officers of the Progressive Democratic Club of Baltimore City became known. This is the organization which has been making attacks upon the democracy of William L. Marbury. Two of the leading officers of the club are employees of the H. R. Linthicum transfer and livery stables. F. I. Savage, treasurer, is a clerk at the stables, and the secretary, according to Mr. Savage, is C. O. Allers, also employed at the place.

STRAUS' CLERK IS SON OF MRS. H. R. LINTHICUM.

Richard H. Stevenson, a youth who was secretary to Isaac Lobe Straus for some years, and is now closely identified with him, is the son of Mrs. H. R. Linthicum. He lives in the block below the stables on Conway street.

Comment turned upon the fact that this organization should be attacking Mr. Marbury's democracy. When Mr. Straus announced his candidacy for the Senate he stated he would not have entered the fight had either Mr. Marbury or former Congressman Joshua W. Miles been a candidate against Senator John Walter Smith.

At the time this was taken by men of all factions of the Democratic party to mean that Mr. Straus looked upon Mr. Marbury as a proper and strong man to make the progressive fight for the long term.

The president of the club, according to Mr. Savage, is Thomas P. Cunningham. Mr. Cunningham is a poultry dealer on Paca street. Like Mr. Savage and Mr. Allers, his associates in the leadership of the club, Mr. Cunningham is unknown to most of the men who have been fighting progressive battles in Maryland in recent years.

S. K. DENNIS' NAME SIGNED IN FREDERICK.

There seems to be some conflict between Mr. Savage's statement that Mr. Allers is secretary of the club and a dispatch printed in The Sun from Frederick. This dispatch states that an attack upon Mr. Marbury's democracy was printed in the local papers of Frederick and by Mr. Savage, as treasurer, and S. K. Dennis as secretary. S. K. Dennis is the name of Senator Smith's private secretary.

In some quarters it was assumed that Mr. Allers had been deposed as secretary of the Progressive Democratic Club and Mr. Dennis substituted. This, in turn, was assumed to mean that Mr. Straus' friends and Senator Smith's have banded to make common cause against Mr. Marbury. Again, much surprise was occasioned in view of the virulence of Mr. Straus' attacks upon the Democracy of Senator Smith.

No headquarters have been established by the Progressive Democratic Club. Mr. Savage, when seen at the stables, said they hoped soon "to branch out," but he was unable to state where and when. He was not inclined to be talkative about politics, and seemed anxious to be rid of those who were.

#### Farmers Institute.

A splendidly attended Farmers Institute was held in the court house on Tuesday under the direction of Dr. Richard S. Hill, institute director for Maryland. The morning session was consumed in the discussion of "Dairying and the cost of feeding a dairy cow" by Mr. James T. Anthony, and "growing apples" by F. M. Soper, the apple king of Delaware. Mr. Anthony stated that an average dairy cow fed on rations at a cost of 13 cents a day would give her owner a profit of over \$55 in the year in butterfat, milk and calf, if properly attended to. Mr. Soper said many an old apple orchard could be made to pay a handsome profit, if it were trimmed up, properly tilled and sprayed for scale and codling moth. The afternoon session was consumed in the discussion of "tomato growing" by Mr. Williams institute lecturer, and "Hogs and hog cholera" by Dr. Hill. A very large crowd attended the afternoon session, among whom were a number of ladies. There was also a large attendance at the evening session, which was consumed in the discussion of flies, insects, etc., by Dr. Hill, and an interesting talk by Mr. Soper. The institute was one of the most largely attended in years, attesting the interest of our farmers in learning something of the improved methods of farming.

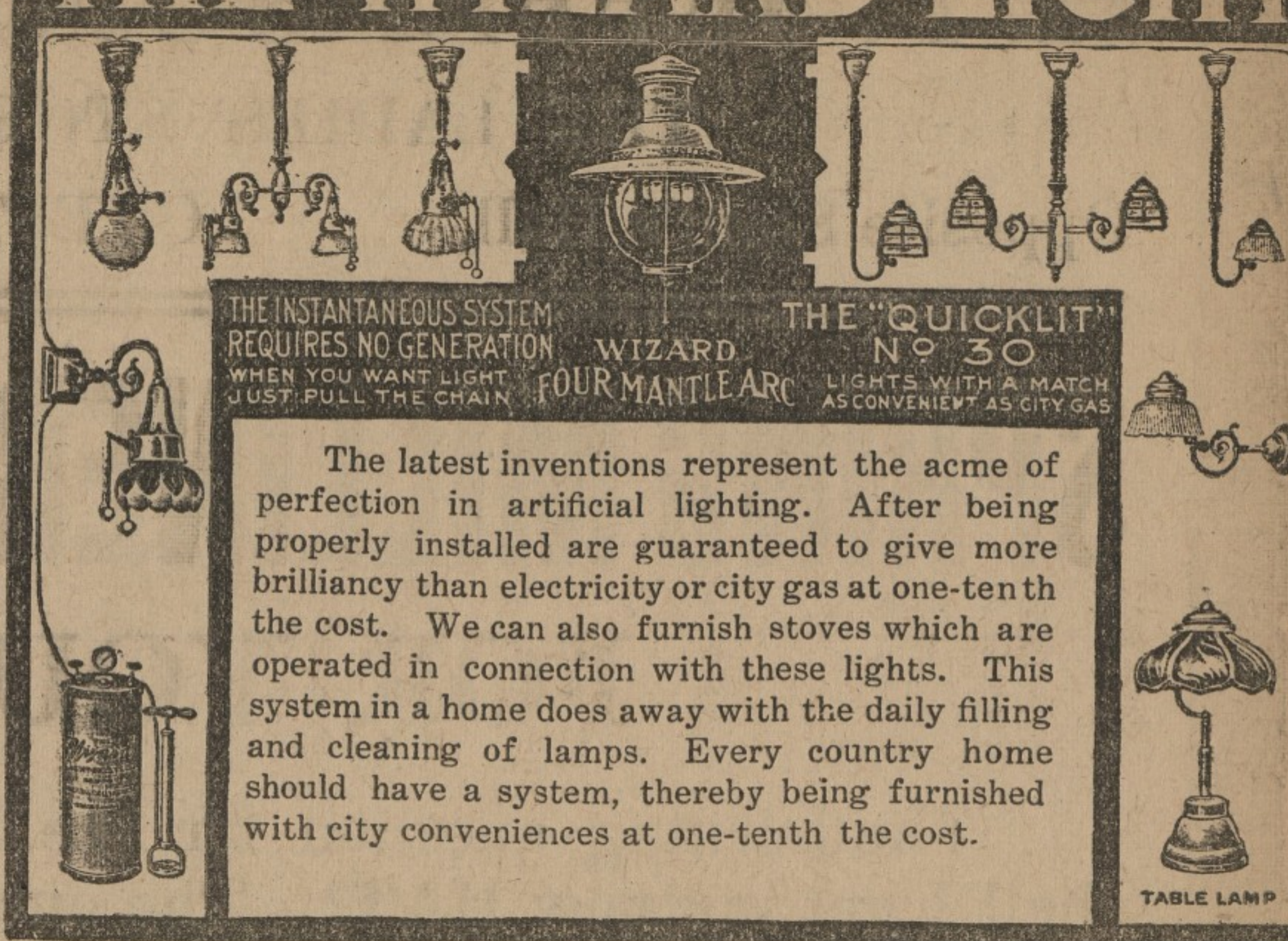
