Old Reed Rifles are Passing Away.

The diary records kept by Mr. James W. Chapman, of Chestertown, show that there are now living only nine members of the famous old "Reed Rifles" military company, one of the pride and glory of all loyal Kent countians.

The "Reed Rifles" company was organized about 1856, with the late Major Eben F. Perkins as captain. The original enrollment was 60 members, and included the most prominent citizens of the town and county in that day. Mr. Chapman's records show that in 1900 there were still 31 of the original members living. But in the past few years the line has thinned rapidly, until at the present time as far as known only nine remain, as follows: Jas. W. Chapman, Jas. W. Lambert, John W. Dwyer, Milton Baker, Daniel Cox, Alfred L. Benjamin, Freeman Fiddis, Benj. Gardner, William W. Copper. The first seven named are all residents of Chestertown. Mr. Gardner resides in Baltimore and Mr. Copper at the National Soldier's Home.

Mr. Chapman, at the solicitation of the TRANSCRIPT, replied to Mr. Hemmell's inquiry published last week. Mr. Hemmell was at one time drummer boy in the "Reed Rifles." Mr. Chapman has the dress parade cap and helmet which he wore 55 years ago, and it is in a well preserved condition.

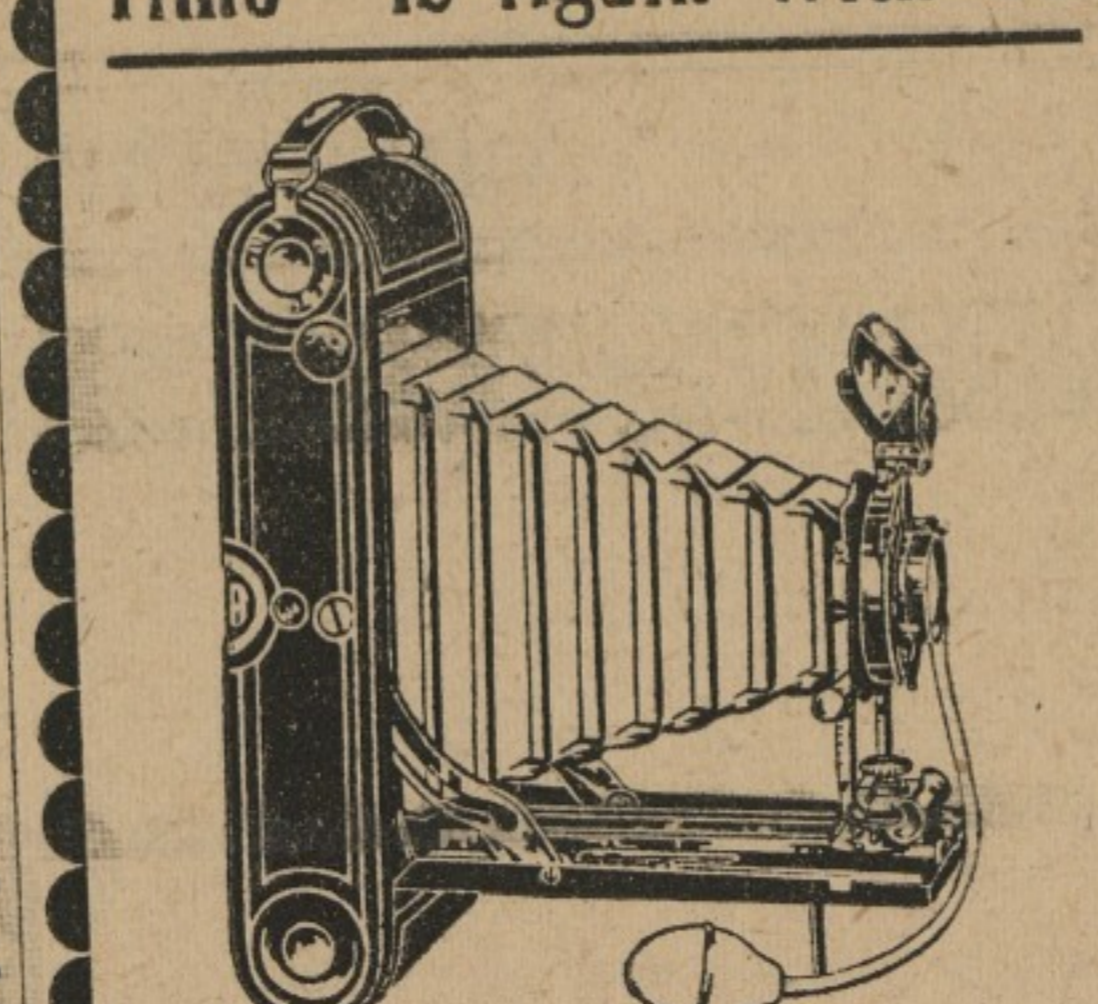
