Busy at Radcliffe Park.

The lovers of horse racing will know that Chestertown is on the map before the fall racing campaign closes, for elaborate preparations are being made by the management of Kent and Queen Annes Driving Association for one of the greatest race meets and Agricultural Fairs held on the Maryland-Delaware Peninsula for years.

About a year ago a number of gentlemen interested in improving the stock of Kent and Queen Annes counties, leased a tract of 24 acres of land, beautifully located on Chester river, within easy walking distance of Chestertown, one of the most beautiful and wealthy towns of Maryland. A track was laid out and built with no other idea than to hold a number of races during the season for the benefit of local horsemen. The track has proven to be one of the finest and fastest in the country, so experts declare.

The soil is conducive to pleasant going and its shape so symmetrical that it has become one of the fastest half-mile tracks in the country. The first matinee was held last November. It was such a success that a demand immediately arose for the development of an Agricultural Fair and Agricultural company, with James G. Beck as president, and Clifton L. Jarrell as secretary, was organized with a capital stock of \$10,000, and many of the best horsemen of Kent and Queen Annes counties were named as a Board of Directors. The stock of the company sold rapidly and has proven a success. As a result the grounds have been enclosed with a high board fence and ample stables have been erected. A commodious grand stand with compartments underneath will be erected shortly to be used as an exhibition hall.

There never was a more auspicious prospect for a finer fair than at present. The fine track is under the supervision of Joseph Rising, who has campaigned on the Canadian and down the grand circuit for years. Mr. Rising says the track is one of the finest and fastest half-mile tracks in the country, and the climate here is superb for racing. He has a string of some of the finest and most promising racers ever seen in this country. He will leave here in about a month for the Northern circuit.

Star Bingen by Bingen, dam Starlight, 2:15, by Electioneer, owned by five gentlemen of Chestertown, is making the spring season at the track in the charge of Mr. Rising.

He has in training Hal B. Patchen by Hal B., dam Cora Patchen by Poe Patchen, not two years old until June, that is stepping very fast. He can snow halves in 1:08, and quarters at a faster clip; Cora Hal, the same breeding as Hal B. Patchen, a three-year-old, was third in 2:18 last fall, and is working well; Hal B. McKenny by Hal B., dam Bima by McKenny, a five-year-old, and Poney Boy by Belton, Jr., dam Bellinger by Bowbells, that show you a fast shot at any time.

The trotters are Alta Hal by Hal B., dam Altacora by Altamont, not three years old, and has been halves around and the colt that beats her to the wire when she turns for the word will have to be some trotter; Brook Nook Belle by Crusadee, dam Opanox by Alcone; Cleora R. by Aireolite, dam Nobby by Online; Andy Binvolto by Binvolto, dam Miss Andy by Andrieu, M. Tavares; and Gray Eagle by Picknell, dam My Partner by Happy Partner; Beauty of Belton, Jr., and bay gelding by Barnett B.

Mr. John F. Mallaleu, another well-known trainer, is at the track and has a string of horses that will undoubtedly be heard from on the northern and eastern half mile rings during the coming season. He also speaks very highly of the track and conditions here.

Mr. Mallaleu has in training Lady Dewey by Admiral Dewey, dam Lady Lou by Advance, and No. 2, a big bay pacing mare by Melodious Chimes, dam Nunery by Advance. Both of these horses belong to Mr. James Merrick, Jr., of Sudlersville, Queen Annes county. Ariess, 2:20, by Walnut Hall, dam Altagea by Allerton; May Chimes by Melodious Chimes, dam Alice Davis by Allie Wilkes; Nida by Nidian, dam Happy C. by Happy Russell; Fi-Fi by Barnett B., dam Elsie G. by Advance; Happy J., 2:21, by Advance, Jr., dam Happy Partner; Wahnetah by Happy J., 2:10, dam Alice Davis; sorrel stallion by Nidian, dam by Nutwood Prince; Dickey Doodle, a sorrel racing gelding, by Victor Russell, dam untraced, and a brown gelding sired by Prodigal.

Besides this there are a number of local owners here who are getting their steeds in shape for the first matinee of the 1913 season, which will be held on Decoration Day, May 30. The management has about finished arranging the classes and purses for the great Fair to be held August 26th-29th, inclusive. All purses will be \$300, except the special on county races and it is expected that some of the finest campaigners of the north and east will test their speed on Chestertown's unexcelled course. The Kent and Queen Anne's Driving Association is a member of the Maryland and Virginia circuit and its dates follow those of Easton, Md.

BASE BALL NOTES.

Rain interfered with all games scheduled for last Saturday.

A hot game took place on Ford's Field on Monday afternoon between the High School team and the clerks. The score was 8 to 2 in favor of the clerks. Both teams put up a snappy game, but Brown, the star pitcher of the locals, had the better of Tucker, who pitched for Centerville. Both teams are evenly matched, and they will put up an interesting game whenever they come together.

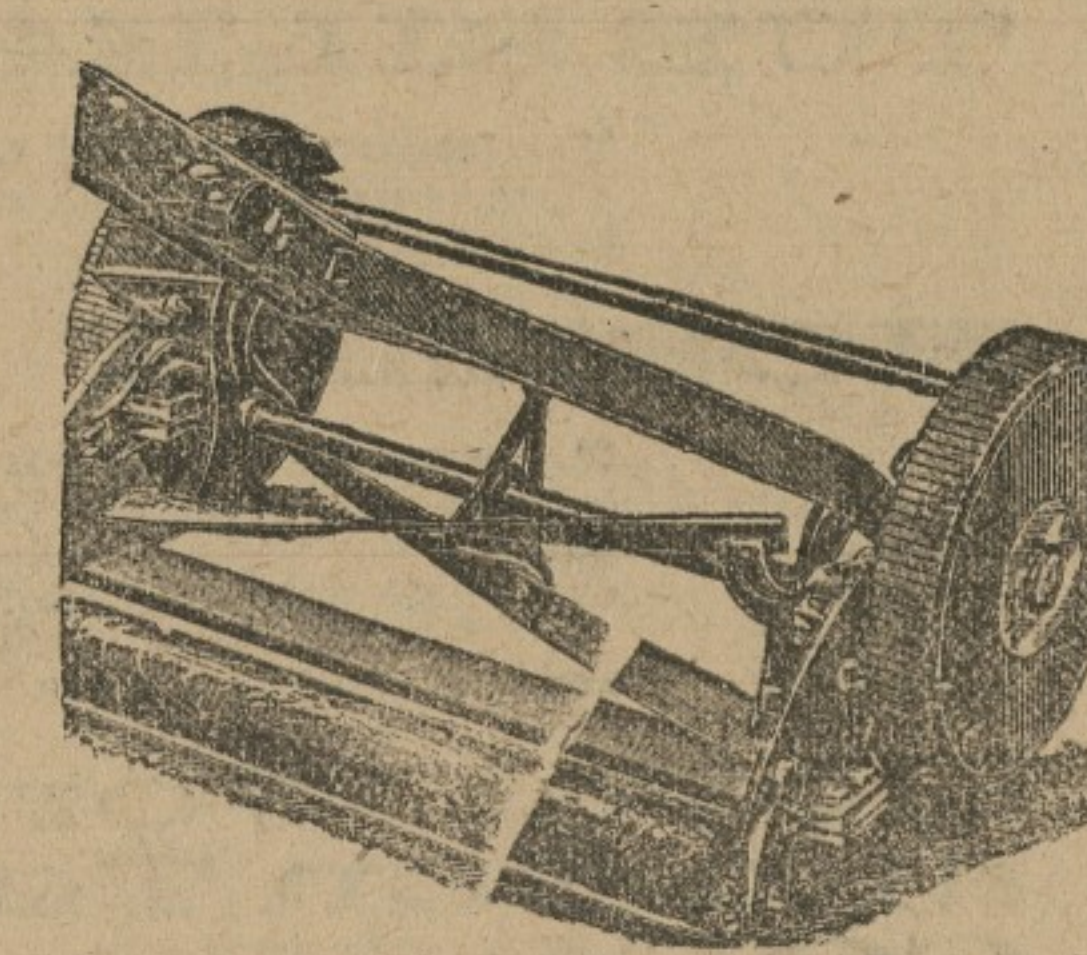

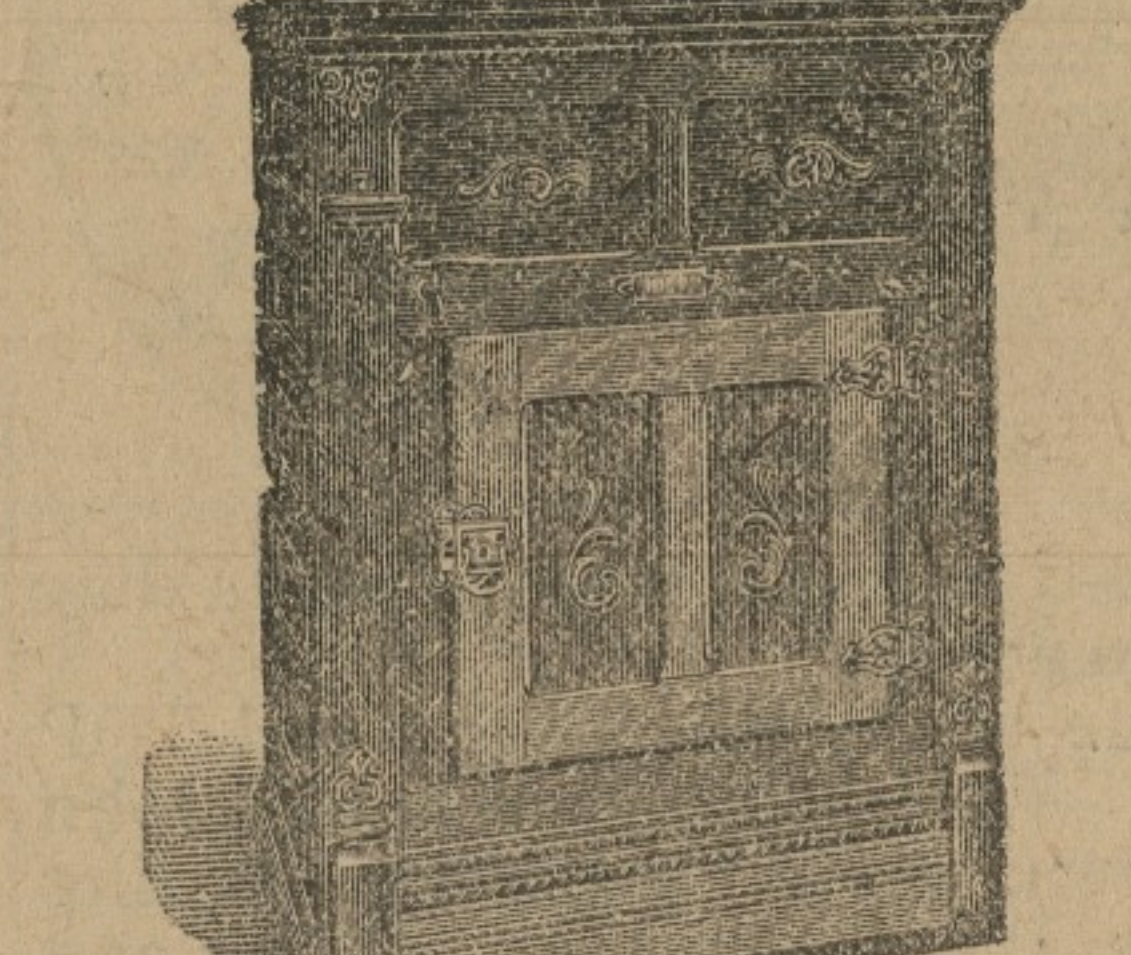

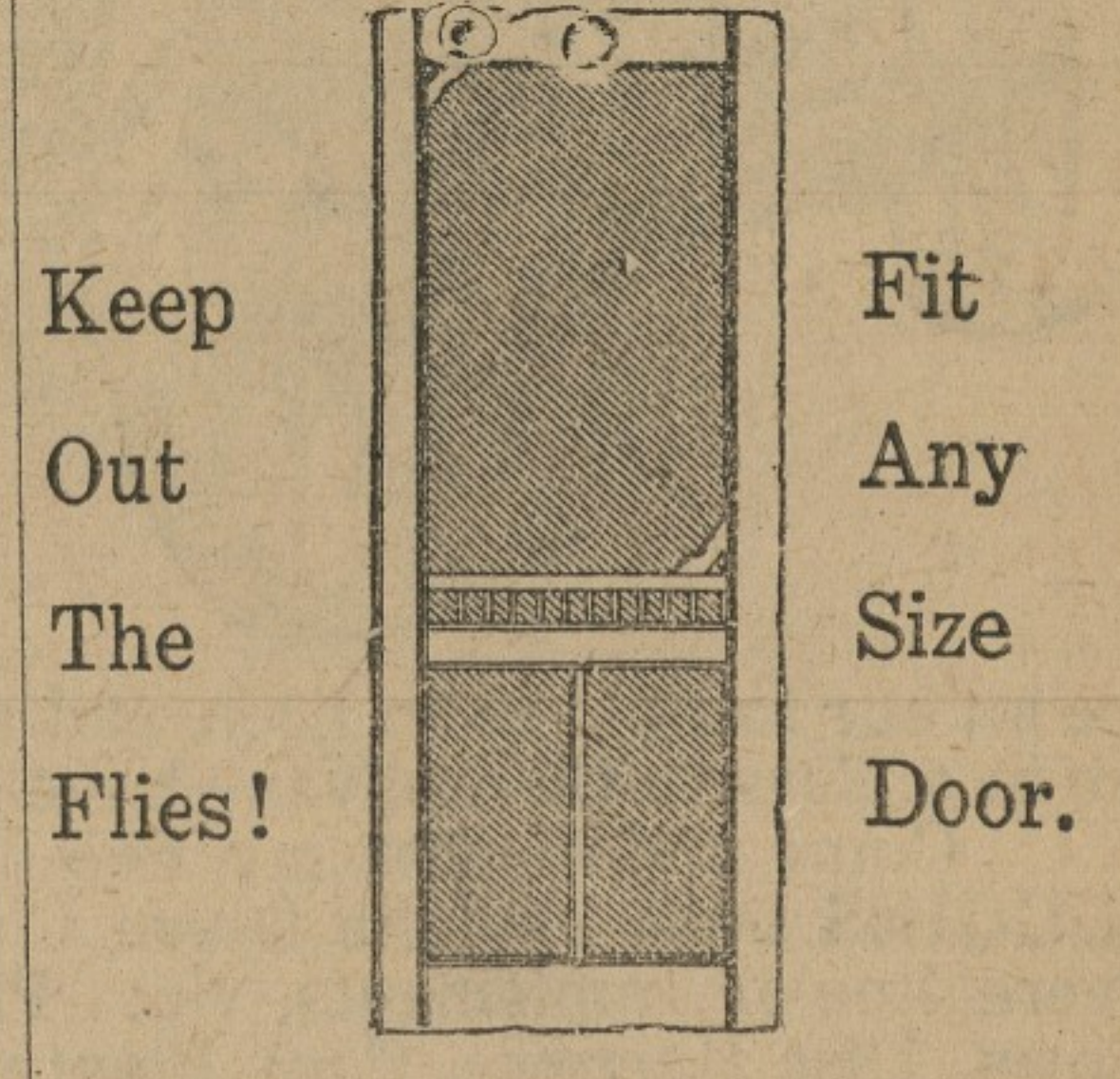
