TAX RATE 94 CENTS.

The Board of County Commissioners met in special session yesterday and declared a tax rate of 94 cents on the \$100, besides adding \$1800 to the cash levy and \$400 to the appropriation for roads, owing to an increase in the taxable basis. This is a most gratifying condition of financial affairs, and the commissioners are to be greatly commended for their businesslike methods, and for the economy they have exercised in the management of the people's business. They have reduced the county's indebtedness \$78,500 since the old board retired, three years ago, have cut the tax rate of \$1.85 nearly in half, and have by good management and careful business brought the rate practically where it was in 1903, when the old board took charge. The indebtedness of the county to-day is \$32,000, while three years ago under Organization management it was \$110,000, and herein lies the difference between Anti-Organization and Organization management. The rate declared yesterday by the commissioners is 11 cents less than last year's rate of \$1.05. The State tax rate, however, is 84 cents higher than it was last year, but this is chargeable to the State and not to local management.
