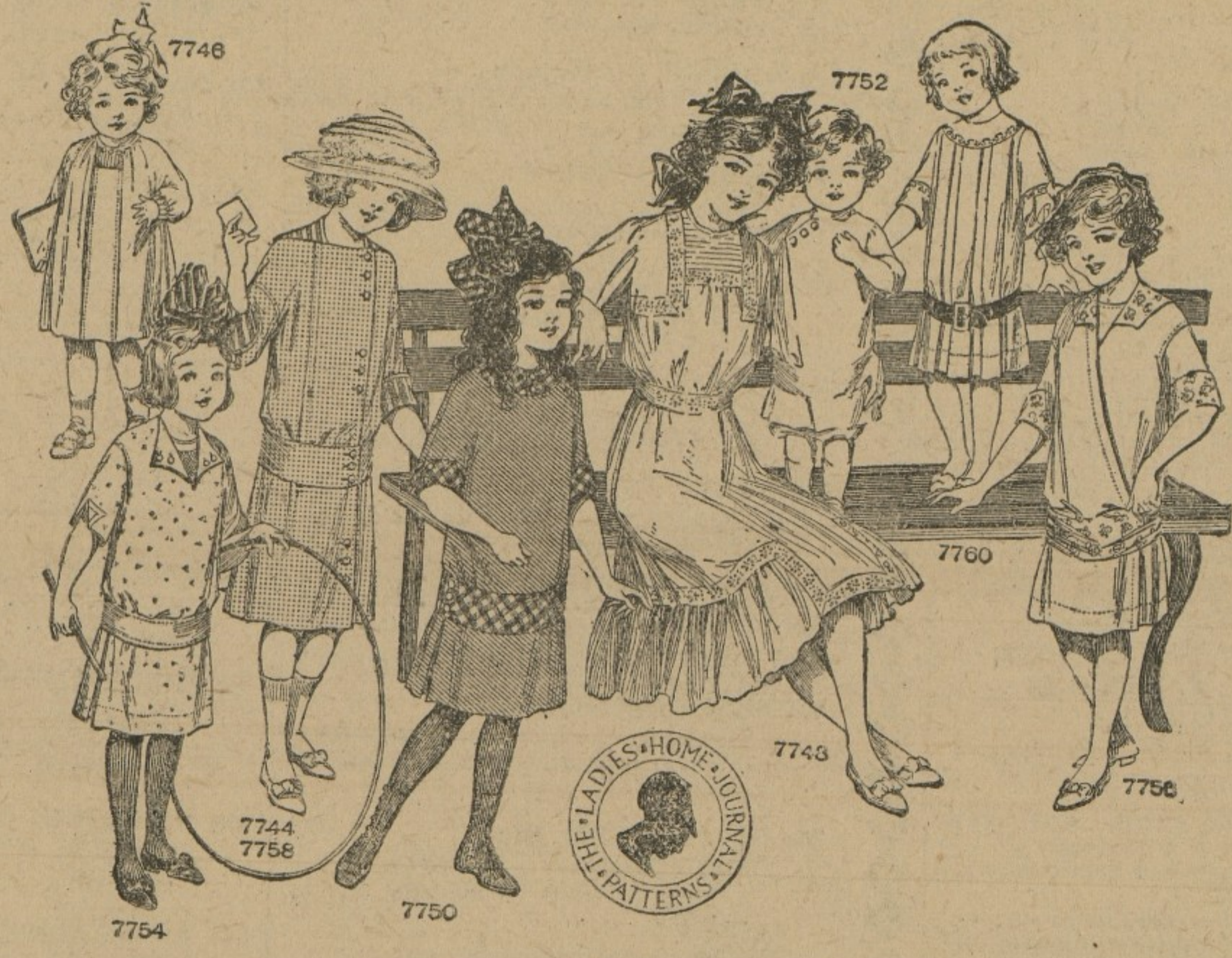

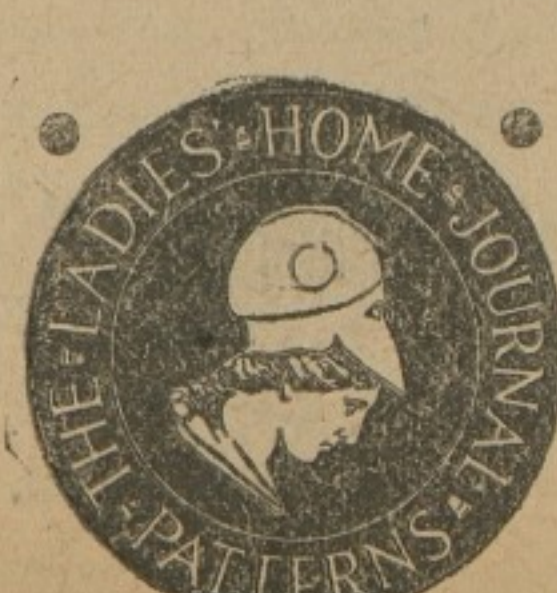

Church, died at her home in Wilmington on Monday after a lingering illness. The deceased was born in Snow Hill, Md., March 31, 1835. Her husband was for 47 years a prominent member of the Wilmington M. E. Conference. She was well-known to many of our older residents.

MRS. MARY REBECCA IRELAND. Died at her home in Chestertown on Sunday, June 16th, of paralysis, Mrs. Mary Rebecca Ireland, in the seventy-eighth year of age. The deceased was the wife of the late John T. Ireland and daughter of the late Samuel I. Comery, of Kent county. She is survived by five children, Mr. William Ireland, of Philadelphia; Mr. Hreman Ireland, of Baltimore; Mrs. John Comery and the Misses May and Halie Ireland. Until her health failed she was always present at roll-call. Bearing all of infirmities and sorrows bravely and with unflinching cheerfulness, she endeared herself to a large host of friends.
