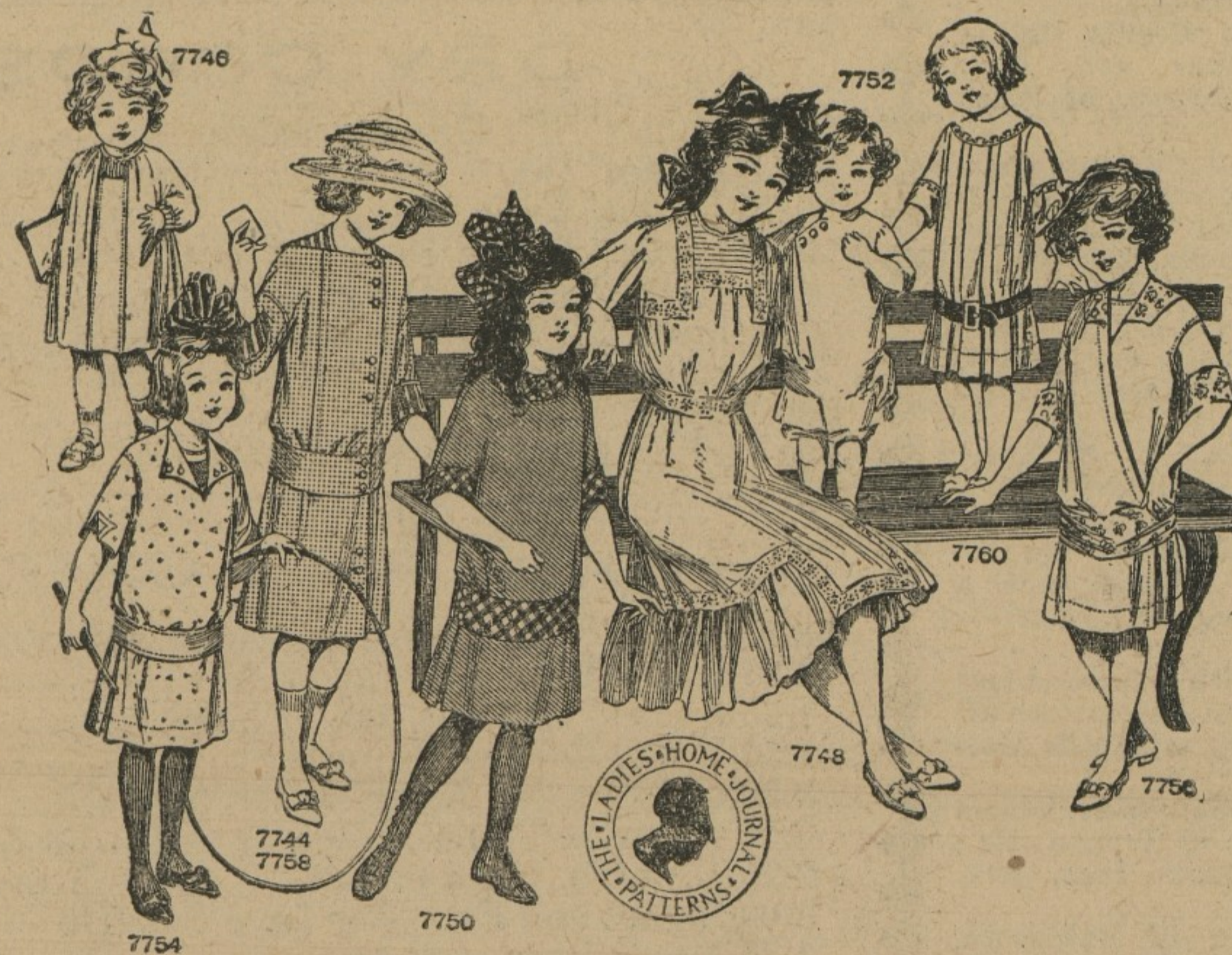

WEIGHED IN THE BALANCE.

From 1903 to 1909 the people of this county placed the Organization faction in control of the county affairs. They gave them every opportunity to practice economy, and to conduct the county affairs in the interest of the people. They made a dismal failure. They wasted the people's money, ran the county heavily in debt, and went down to ignominious defeat, leaving the people burdened with an enormous tax rate. It was through the magnanimity of Hope H. Barroll, Esq., the man whom the Organization has lost no opportunity to abuse and malign, that the Organization was placed in control of the county finances. Mr. Barroll's friends carried the primaries after an interesting fight. They had it within their power to name the entire local ticket, but Mr. Barroll insisted that the Organization faction be given recognition on the ticket, and it was through Mr. Barroll's advice that the Organization was given the clerkship in the person of Mr. James T. Dixon, and every member of the Board of County Commissioners except Mr. Harry Davis, while Mr. Barroll and his friends took the legislative ticket, the treasurer and register of will. The Organization was put on its honor. The county was about to emerge from the extravagance of a Republican administration, and it was believed that the Organization would conduct the commissioners' office in an economical and businesslike manner. Those six years, from 1909 to 1909, were the bitterest years in the history of the tax-payers of this county, and instead of the Organization proving faithful to the trust that was reposed in them by Mr. Barroll and his friends, and the people generally, they were so utterly reckless of their duty to the tax-payers that Mr. Barroll and his friends were compelled to take the control of the county finances out of the hands of the Organization and place it in the hands of the Antis, and the change has proven a blessing to the people's interests. The Organization has been weighed in the balance and found wanting. They had the opportunity to make good; they failed miserably. The Anti-Organization was given the opportunity to make good, and they have done so. It is the unkindest cut of all for the Organization to accuse Mr. Barroll of bossism. He gave them a free hand in the conduct of the county affairs from 1903 to 1909, and though he had control of the delegates in the Legislature he did not have any laws passed to take money out of the tax-payers' pockets, or to embarrass and harass the people. He and his friends acted in the interest of the people. And the only reason in the world that the Organization don't like Mr. Barroll and the TRANSCRIPT is because they took the control of county affairs from them, through the help of the voters, and placed it in the hands of those who have proven their competency and ability to give the people an economical administration. This is not only recent history but a fact which cannot be contradicted, and it has been demonstrated beyond the question of a doubt that the financial and political interests of this county are far safer in the hands of the Anti-Organization than they proved by actual experience to be under the Organization. The Organization has absolutely no claim to the votes of the people of this county because they proved faithless to the trust reposed in them when they had every reason and every opportunity to conduct the county affairs in the interest of the people. The Anti-Organization on the other hand have been economical, they have proven their interest in the welfare of the people by reducing the tax rate from \$1.85 to 94 cents in three years, and the Antis should be and will be continued in power because of their interest in the tax-payers. Give us Kibler and Harris in the Legislature so as to prevent the Organization from legislating the Board of County Commissioners out of office so they may get control of the county finances by the passage of a law to that effect, and in the next primary contest after this we will nominate a Senator to whom we were justly entitled two years ago, and if you put this county on a sound financial basis, and give the people the kind of road management to which they are justly entitled, then we shall be willing to let the Anti-Organization control, and leave the conduct of county affairs to somebody else. We must nominate and elect KIBLER and HARRIS to the Legislature this year in order to prevent the great danger that threatens the tax-payers should Turner and Shallcross be nominated.
