AN ACT to amend Section 21 of Article 4, title "Judiciary Department," of the Constitution of this State, and to provide for the submission of the proposed amendment to the qualified voters of this State for adoption or rejection.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, three-fifths of all the members of the two houses concurring, that the following section be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Section 21 of Article 4 of the Constitution of this State, and if adopted by the legal and qualified voters of this State, and if adopted by the legal and qualified voters of this State, it shall supersede and stand in the place and stead of the section therein contained.

Section 2. For each of the said circuits (excepting the eighth and third) there shall be a chief judge and two associate judges, to be styled judges of the Circuit Court to be elected or appointed as herein provided.

Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of Maryland. Whereas, at the January Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, held in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twelve, Acts were passed proposing amendments to the Constitution of this State, and adding proposed new sections to Article 3, of the Constitution of this State, which said Acts are in the following words, to wit:

CHAPTER 42. AN ACT to propose an amendment to Article 3 of the Constitution of this State by adding a new Section, to be known as 40A, and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of this State for adoption or rejection.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, three-fifths of all the members of each of the two houses concurring, that the following new section be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of this State, and if adopted by the legal and qualified voters of this State, and if adopted by the legal and qualified voters of this State, it shall supersede and stand in the place and stead of the section therein contained.
