Atter Road Engineer in Cecil.

That the present road law in Cecil county is a cause for much criticism is manifested by the following statement clipped from the Cecil Democrat last Saturday:

"A number of citizens and taxpayers of the Democratic faith, from the several election districts of Cecil county, met at the Howard House, in Elkton, on Wednesday evening to consider local conditions and looking to the betterment of the same. The conditions of our roads, bridges and taxes were discussed, as well as the unpopular road engineer law. It was the sense of the meeting that the road engineers have not given satisfaction, and that the cost of maintaining an engineer is not justified by the great expense to which the taxpayers are subjected. That any condition, which makes it possible for any road engineer to saddle a verdict upon Cecil county (as was the verdict rendered last week in Kent county) is an intolerable state of affairs, and that steps should be taken at the next session of the Legislature either to curtail the power of the road engineer or to abolish the law. A determined effort will be made at the coming primary to obtain officers who can be relied upon to remedy the conditions complained of."

The same situation exists in Cecil as exists in Kent. Incompetent management is responsible for this condition. It will be remembered that Mr. James G. Harris tried his hardest to secure the repeal of Kent's farical law in the last Legislature, but Mr. Wm. W. Beck, the Organization representative, refused to pass the bill. The Organization is bound to a continuance of Gibbism. They dare not turn Gibbism out, or seek to repeal the law, for fear of their political chances. Turner and Shallcross are bound hand and foot to the road engineer. Messrs. James G. Harris and Chas. W. Kibler, the Anti-Organization candidates for the Legislature, are pledged to the repeal of the Gibb Road Law, which is the only way to rid the county of Gibbism and bad road management.

Effect of Publicity.

Woodrow Wilson is President of the United States. He is the highest executive in our land and this fact alone makes his thoughts and utterances at all times worthy of thought and consideration.

As to publicity and its effect on politics our chief executive says:

"Publicity is one of the purifying elements of politics. The best thing that you can do with anything that is crooked is to lift it up where people can see that it is crooked and then it will either straighten itself out or disappear. Nothing checks all the bad practices of politics like public exposure. You can't be crooked in the light. I don't know whether it has ever been tried or not, but I venture to say, purely from observation, that it can't be done."

"And so many people of the United States have made up their minds to do a healthy thing for both politics and big business. Permit me to mix a few metaphors. They are going to open doors; they are going to let up blinds; they are going to drag sick things into the open air and into the light of the sun. They are going to organize a great hunt and smoke certain animals out of their burrows. They are going to unearth the beast in the jungle in which they hunted before they were caught by the beast instead of catching him. They have determined, therefore, to take an ax and raze the jungle, and then see where the beast will find cover. And I, for my part, bid them Godspeed. The jungle breeds nothing but infection and shelters nothing but the enemies of mankind."

"And nobody is going to get caught in our hunt except the beasts that prey. Nothing is going to be cut down or injured that anybody ought to wish preserved."

"You know the story of the Irishman who, while digging a hole, was asked, 'Pat, what are you doing—digging a hole?' And he replied, 'No, sir; I am digging the dirt, and leaving a hole. It was probably the same Irishman who, seen digging around the wall of a house, was asked, 'Pat, what are you doing?' And he answered, 'Faith, I am letting the dark out of the cellar. Now, that's exactly what we want to do—let the dark out of the cellar.'"
