**OUR DEATH RECORD.**

**MRS. ANNIE S. GALE.**  
 Mrs. Annie S. Gale, widow of the late Wm. R. Gale, of this county, but for some years past a resident of Baltimore city, died at the home of Mrs. George W. Hatcherson on High street last Saturday evening of a complication of diseases, aged 85 years. The deceased was the daughter of the late George Stephens of this county, and was born and reared in Kent. Those who knew the deceased intimately loved her for her beautiful traits of character, and for the humility and sincerity of her disposition. She was a dutiful daughter, a devoted and self-sacrificing wife, and in every sense of the word she was an ideal mother, sacrificing her life for the comfort and pleasure of her loved ones. For some years past she and her children had lived happily in Baltimore, and though some weeks ago she came to visit Mrs. Hatcherson and her sister, Miss Ida Stephens, hoping that the change would benefit her health, she bore her sufferings with patience and fortitude, and passed to the Great Beyond in the fullness of a noble Christian spirit. She is survived by 3 children, one son, Mr. Clarence Gale, who is supervising engineer of State roads with headquarters in Easton, and two daughters, Misses Dannie and Helga Gale, of Baltimore. She also leaves a brother, Mr. Geo. Stephens, and 3 sisters, Miss Ida Stephens, Mrs. Marr and Mrs. Bramble. Funeral services were held from the residence of Mrs. Hatcherson, on High street on Tuesday afternoon at 3 o'clock, conducted by Rev. Thomas O. Crouse, of North Baltimore M. E. Church, pastor of the deceased, assisted by Rev. Dr. W. R. Graham, of Chestertown and Rev. H. P. Jester, of St. James. Mr. Crouse paid a most beautiful tribute to the deceased. Interment was made in Chester cemetery. The pall-bearers were: Messrs. Wm. T. Nicholson, Frank Skirven, Walter R. Gale, John C. Nicholson, Frank C. Crow, and Wm. B. Willis. Undertaker Chas. L. Dodd had charge of the funeral arrangements.

 Mrs. Anna Green, wife of Mr. Thos. Green, formerly of Baltimore, died at the home of her son-in-law, Mr. Owen C.
