A large contingent of town and county folks attended the Easton fair on Thursday.

Mr. C. Romie Skirven has shipped to date 2,100 baskets of peaches for which he has received good prices. County Commissioner T. Benj. Crew has shipped between 5,000 and 6,000 baskets and Mr. James G. Harris nearly as many.

Mr. A. K. Heller has resigned as superintendent of the laundry, and a Mr. Jones has succeeded to the superintendency.

Mr. A. L. Sparks will soon inaugurate a piano voting contest that will appeal strongly to his patrons and all careful buyers in his line.

Quite a number of John Russell has installed a new 60-horse power boiler in the laundry, and the business will go with a rush from now on.

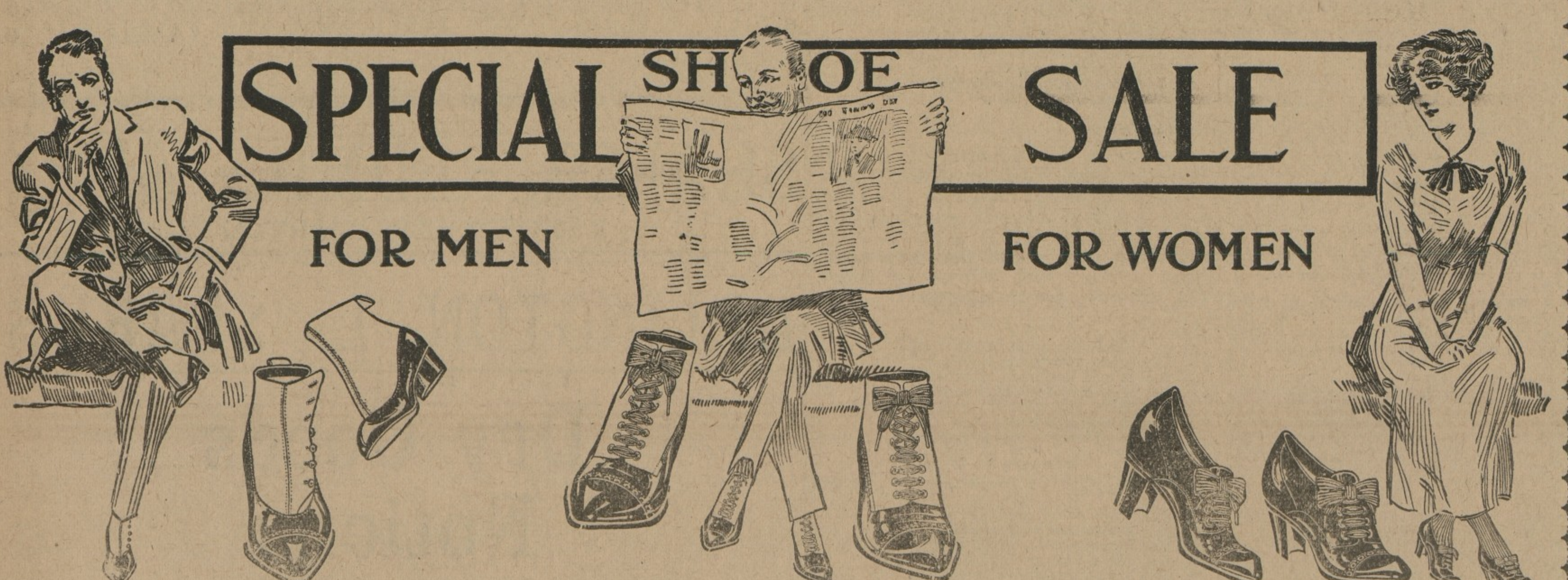
