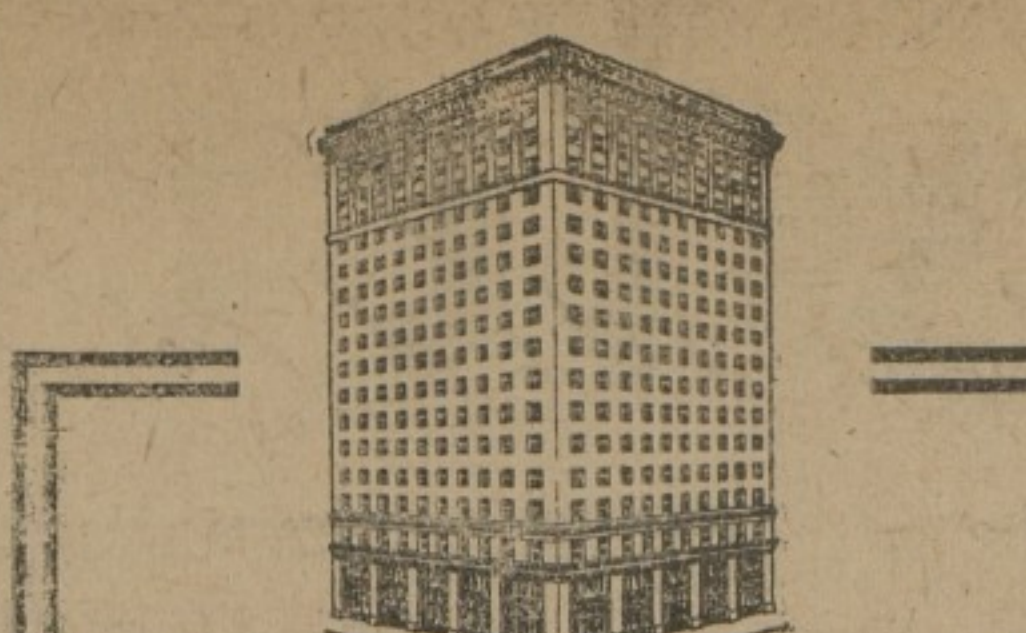
Horse Notes. John White, of Wilmington, was the large money-winning driver in the State fair races last week, with \$400 to his credit.

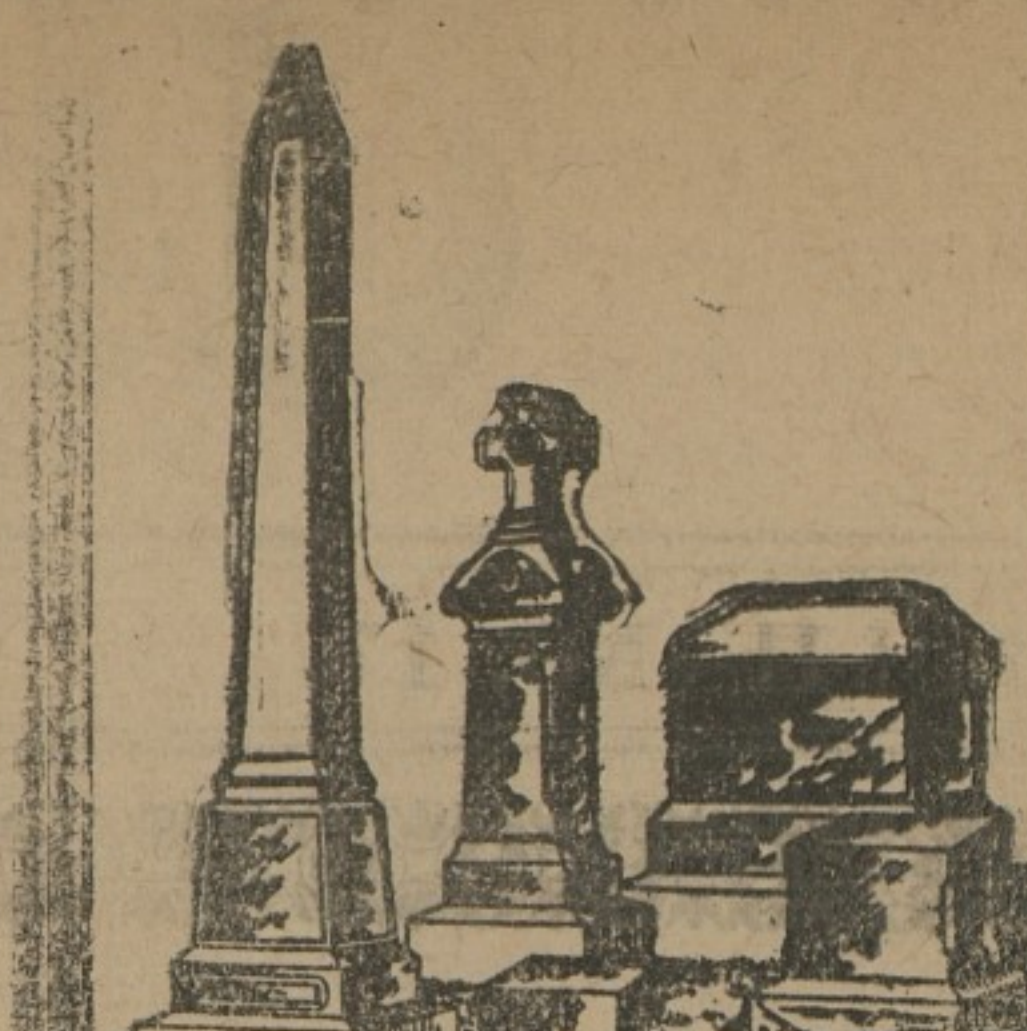
