## PROCLAMATION

### Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of Maryland.

Whereas, at the January Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, held in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twelve, Acts were passed proposing amendments to Article 3, Section 1 of Article 5, Section 3 of Article 5, Section 3 of Article 5, Section 3 of Article 5, and adding a proposed new section to Article 3, or of the Constitution of this State, which said Acts are in the following words, to wit:

CHAPTER 402.  
AN ACT to propose an amendment to Article 3 of the Constitution of this State by adding a new Section, to be known as 40A; and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of this State at the next general election.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, (three-fifths of all the members of each of the two houses concurring), That the following section be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of this State, to be known as 40A, and to be numbered 40A, and if adopted by the legally qualified voters thereof, as herein provided, said section shall become a part of Article 3 of the Constitution of Maryland.

40A. The General Assembly shall enact no law authorizing private property to be taken for public use without just compensation, to be agreed upon between the parties or awarded by a jury, being paid or tendered to the party entitled to such compensation, but where such property is situated in Baltimore, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, the General Assembly may provide for the appointment of appraisers by a Court of Record to appraise such property, and upon payment of the amount of such valuation, or into Court and securing the payment of any further sum that may be awarded by a jury, such property may be taken.

Section 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said foregoing section hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution, shall at the next ensuing general election, to be held on Tuesday next after the first Monday in the month of November, 1913, be submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof, for their adoption or rejection, in pursuance of Article 14 of the Constitution of this State, and the proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be written or printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law, and immediately after said election due returns shall be made to the Governor of the State for the purpose of ascertaining the result thereof.

CHAPTER 497.  
AN ACT to amend Section 27 of Article III, title "Legislative Department," of the Constitution of this State, and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of this State at the next general election.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, (three-fifths of all the members of each of the two houses concurring), That the following section be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Section 27 of Article III, title "Legislative Department," of the Constitution of this State, and if adopted by the legally qualified voters thereof, as herein provided, it shall supersede and stand in the place and stead of Section 27 of said Article III, title "Legislative Department," of the Constitution of this State, and any bill may originate in either House of the General Assembly, but no bill shall originate in the other, but no bill shall originate in the House of Representatives, unless two-thirds of the members elected thereto shall determine by yeas and nays, not shall any bill become a law until it be read on three different days of the session, unless two-thirds of the members elected to the House when such bill is pending shall so determine by yeas and nays, and no bill shall have been actually introduced or printed for a third reading.

Section 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the foregoing section hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of this State shall be at the next general election for members of the General Assembly of Maryland, to be held in this State, and submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof for their adoption or rejection, in pursuance of Article 14 of the Constitution of this State, and the proposed amendment shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now prescribed by law, and immediately after said election due returns shall be made to the Governor of the State for the purpose of ascertaining the result thereof.

AN ACT to amend Section 21 of Article 4, title "Judicial Department," sub-title "Circuit Courts," of the Constitution of this State, and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of this State at the next general election.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, (three-fifths of all the members of each of the two houses concurring), That the following section be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Section 21 of Article 4, title "Judicial Department," sub-title "Part III, Circuit Courts," of the Constitution of this State, and if adopted by the legal and qualified voters thereof, as herein provided, it shall supersede and stand in the place and stead of Section 21 of said Article 4.

Section 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said foregoing section hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of this State shall be at the next general election for members of the General Assembly of Maryland, to be held in this State, and submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof for their adoption or rejection, in pursuance of Article 14 of the Constitution of this State, and the proposed amendment shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now prescribed by law, and immediately after said election due returns shall be made to the Governor of the State for the purpose of ascertaining the result thereof.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, (three-fifths of all the members of each of the two houses concurring), That the following section be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Section 3 of Article 1 of the Constitution of this State, and if adopted by the legally qualified voters thereof, as herein provided, it shall supersede and stand in the place and stead of Section 3 of said Article 1.

Section 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said foregoing section hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of this State shall be at the next general election for members of the General Assembly of Maryland, to be held in this State, and submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof for their adoption or rejection, in pursuance of Article 14 of the Constitution of this State, and the proposed amendment shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now prescribed by law, and immediately after said election due returns shall be made to the Governor of the State for the purpose of ascertaining the result thereof.

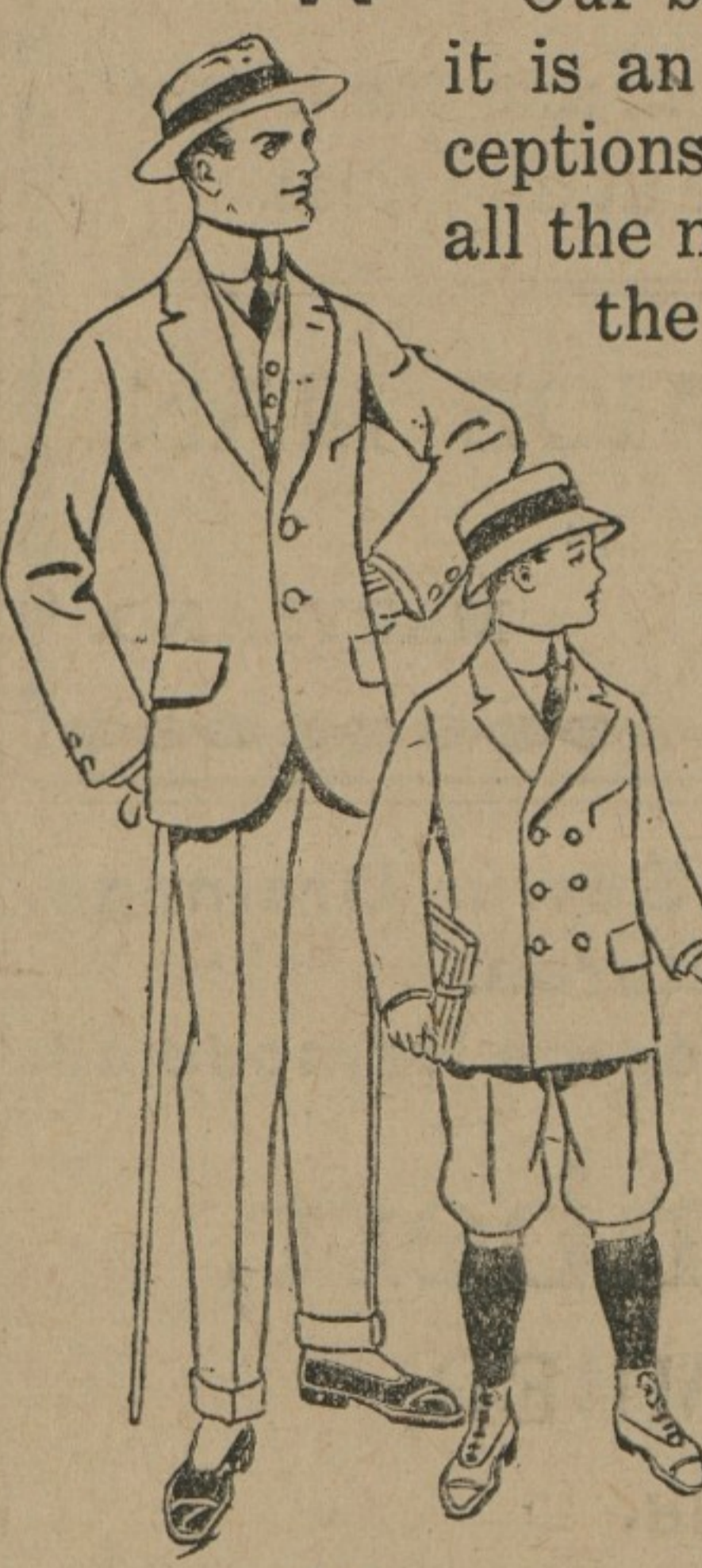
