MARBURY OUT OF FIGHT.

Announces That He Cannot Afford to Carry on Campaign for Senate.

TOLD PRESIDENT OF HIS INTENTION SEVERAL WEEKS AGO.

Hon. William L. Marbury, who entered the field as a candidate for the Senate nomination for United States Senator last spring against Senator John Walter Smith, Saturday night gave out a statement withdrawing from the race.

Mr. Marbury's action comes as a surprise at this time, although those who have been in touch with his candidacy have felt for some time that the situation was such that he would not continue in the fight.

It is understood that Mr. Marbury had made his mind up to withdraw before he went to Europe and a few days after his return two weeks ago sent to President Wilson, whose sympathy he was known to have in his candidacy, a letter laying before the President the reasons why he decided to do so.

Mr. Marbury's statement is as follows: "I have decided to withdraw from the contest for the Democratic nomination for the office of United States Senator."

"The first, and I am bound to confess, the controlling interest to me is that I cannot afford to carry on the kind of campaign which would have to be carried on in order to be successful for so long a period as a year and a half."

"I began the campaign on that theory. In the month of April or May the amendment was adopted, and thereupon it became evident that there would be no election under the law for the long term until November, 1914. Under existing circumstances that would mean an active campaign for nearly a year and a half."

"To carry on that sort of a campaign would involve the expenditure of time and money, such as I could not afford without the risk of involving myself to an extent which my duty to my family forbids. In order to make such a fight as that, a man ought either to be a man of independent means and not dependent upon his professional labors for the support and education of his family, or else he ought to have no family to support; and I do not belong to either of those classes."

"But there is another reason which has influenced me very strongly in reaching this determination. I am satisfied that if I am not a candidate for any office of any kind, and am asking no favors, I will be in a much better position to aid the cause of Progressive Democracy and to give to the Administration of President Wilson the kind of support which it ought to have than I would be if I were to continue my candidacy."

"I shall render aid in any way which I can, and I do not intend to diminish my willingness to serve those who have heretofore attached themselves to my cause in this State."

"I have always felt a great deal of uncertainty as to how far, in case I were elected to the United States Senate, I would be compelled to abandon the practice of my profession. I could not possibly abandon it altogether, and it has been a source of serious anxiety to me. For that reason my withdrawal involves no personal sacrifice whatever."

"I want to say further that my ceasing to be a candidate for office does not mean the least diminution of my interest in the question of who shall govern and who shall represent this State. I shall render aid in any way which I can, and I do not intend to diminish my willingness to serve those who have heretofore attached themselves to my cause in this State."

"The primary fight was a warm one in the counties and in the city of Easton, more, but it was a fair fight. The successful candidates, both those who were supported by the so-called organization and those who were opposed by the organization in the primaries, are undoubtedly the choice of the Democratic voters who voted at those primaries."

"In the city of Baltimore alone those Democratic voters numbered more than 30,000, and there is to my mind, no reason in the world why all the candidates thus nominated should not receive the unanimous support of Maryland Democrats."

"I feel absolutely sure that President Wilson would give his approval of this sentiment."
