MR. SILAS L. WELLER.
Mr. Silas L. Weller, a farmer, well-known in Kent and Queen Annes counties, died last Sunday, Oct. 26, at his home on the Elison farm near Pomona, aged 75 years. He is survived by a widow, six children and sixteen grand children. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon from his late home, conducted by the Rev. O. B. Rice; interment in Chestertown cemetery. The pallbearers were Messrs. James Walbert, Chas. J. Reiche, Walter S. Trew, Thos. W. Tolson, John Chaires and Wm. F. Wink. Undertaker Charles L. Dodd had charge of arrangements.

The chimney on a house near James M. E. Church, owned by Miss Ellen Fisher and tenanted by colored folks, caught fire on Wednesday morning and caused the fire alarm to be sounded. The Volunteer Fire Company was on the scene promptly, but it required only one bucket of water to extinguish the blaze. No damage was done.
