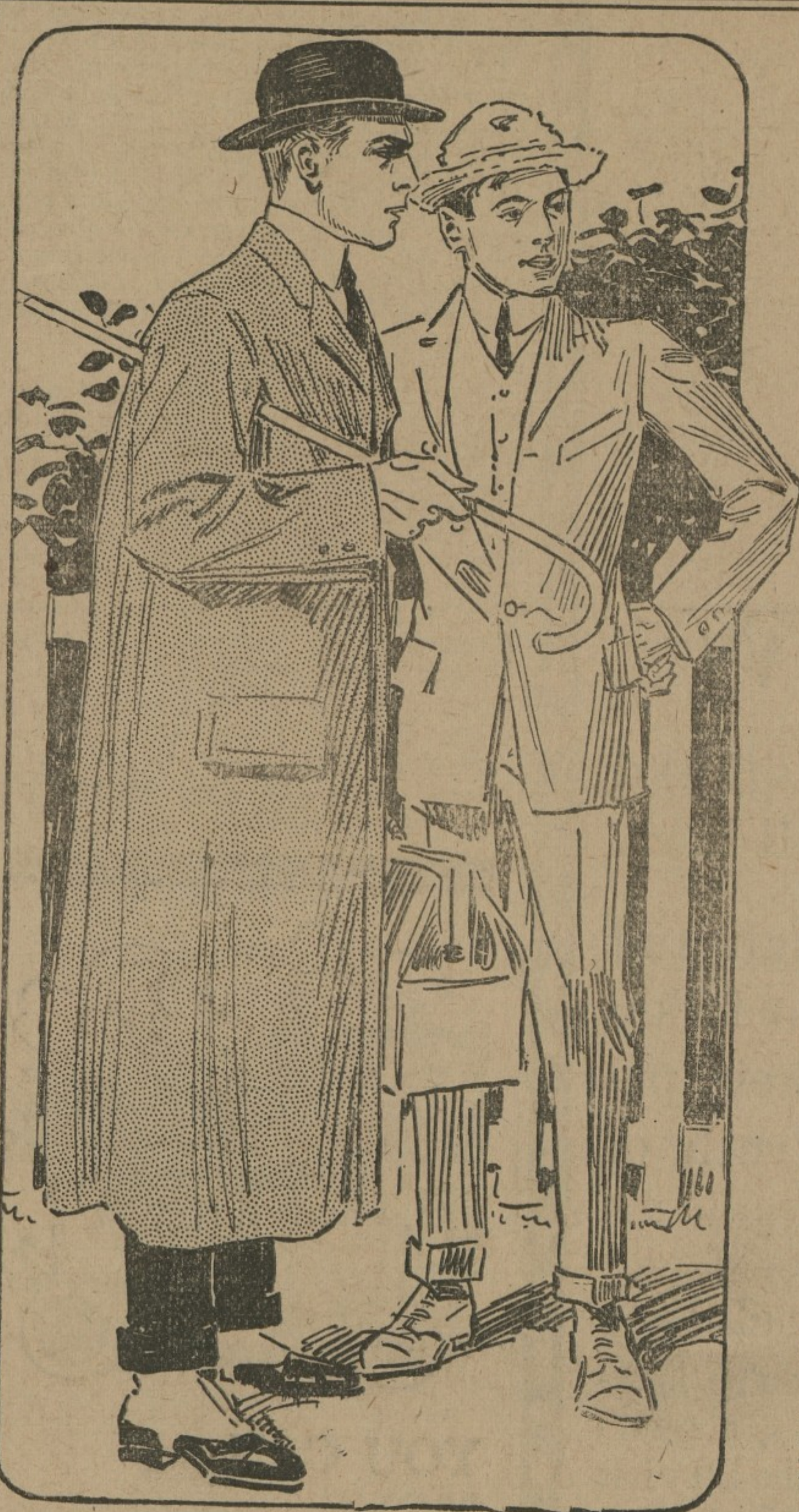

Pushing the Hospital Plan.
The Woman's Relief Society, composed of a number of Chestertown's public-spirited women, are pushing the plan to establish an Emergency Hospital and Aged Woman's Home in Chestertown, and during the week they have been engaged in the work of arranging the plans by which to raise the necessary funds. The management of the Kent and Queen Anne's Driving Association has very generously offered to hold a matinee for the benefit of the Hospital fund at Radcliffe Park on Wednesday, Nov. 13th, of which the ladies will have complete control. There will be four good races and the general admission with no extras will be 25 cents. The ladies of the Relief Society have also asked the assistance of the Ladies Town Improvement Association and of the Federated Club, in raising funds, and it is likely that they will hold a big bazaar for three nights shortly. Besides this the Relief Society will ask our representatives in the next Legislature to use their influence to secure an appropriation from the State for the maintenance of the institution. Several places are under consideration for the location of the hospital, but the place that seems to appeal to most people is the property on High Street owned by the late Alexander Crew, which it is believed can be purchased and made a most admirable building for the purpose. The supper held on Tuesday evening was a success, and about \$75 was realized by the Society. The Society is determined to make a success of their undertaking and they should have the cooperation of the people of the town and county for the benefit of whom the movement is being pushed. Let everybody push.

The contest for the \$400 piano which is being held at the store of Mr. Arlington L. Sparks, is being watched closely by the public and is drawing forth earnest efforts on the part of the participants. The six highest numbers to date are: No. 36, 147,500; No. 72, 141,130; No. 30, 128,310; No. 52, 98,385; No. 25, 72,960; No. 21, 58,000.
