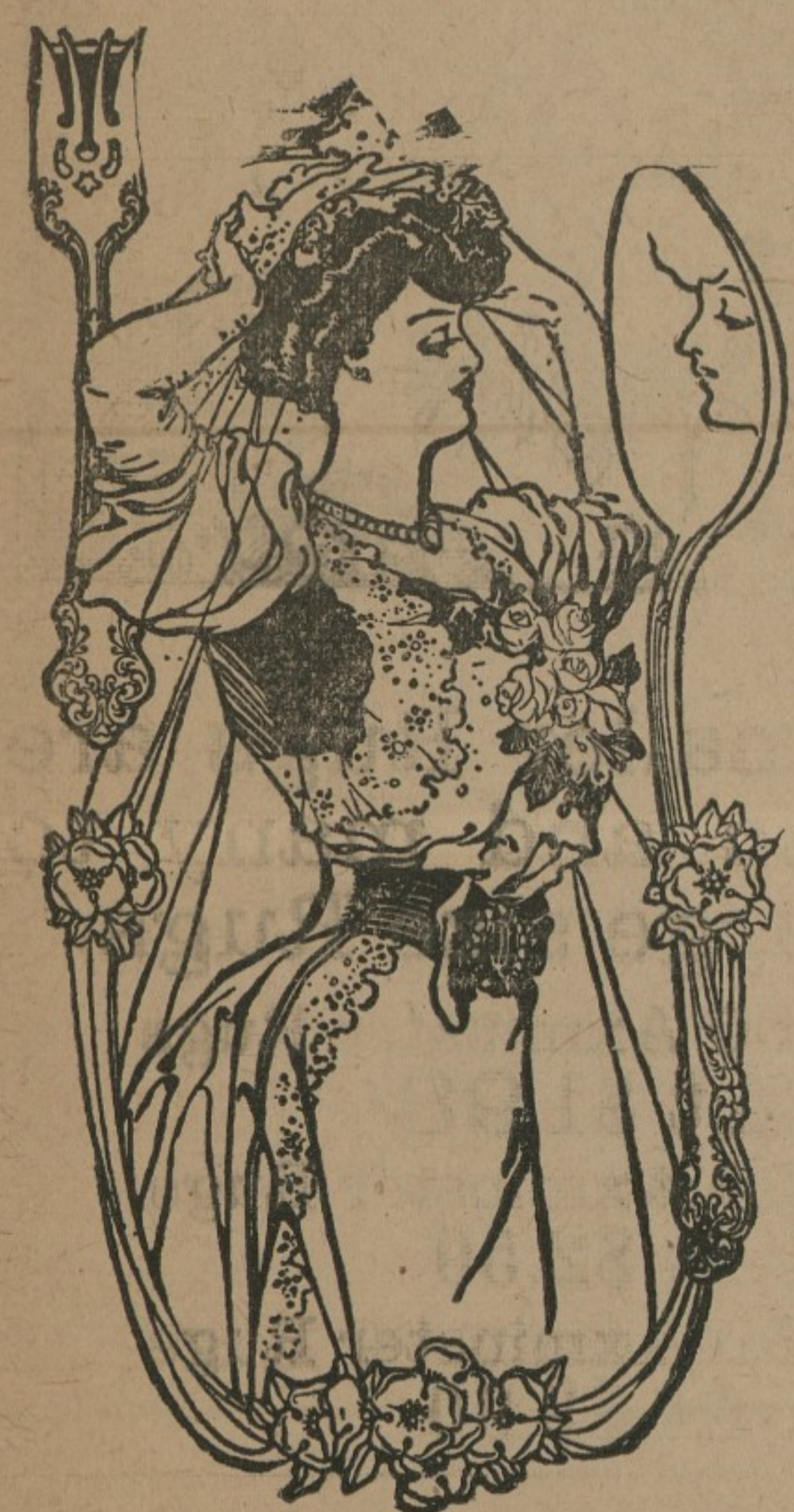

HERMIT CAUGHT IN BEAR TRAP FOUGHT LONG AGAINST DEATH.

Bones of Wealthy Recluse Found Stripped of Flesh by Wild Animals in Mountains.

Denver, Nov. 18.—Caught in his own bear trap while on a hunting trip in the mountains near Embudo, N. M., Henry Severson, 65 years old, a wealthy retired mining man, formerly of Denver, fought against death by starvation and thirst or being killed by wild animals for several days before he finally succumbed.

News of the finding of his body, torn into shreds by the claws of mountain lions and wildcats, has just been received here by friends. His identification is made complete by papers found in a pocket of his coat. Severson, who had innumerable friends in Denver, especially the mining men and earlier settlers, was an eccentric character, living more the life of a hermit than anything else. About eighteen months ago, unable to withstand the call of the wild, Severson went into the hills of Embudo, N. M., and often returned to that point for supplies. The last seen of him was on one of his trips to Embudo, more than two months ago. A few days ago a party of hunters stumbled across the body of a man, stripped of flesh to the bones, lying in the snow. Closer investigation showed that both his arms were caught in a bear trap, and that he had been unable to extricate himself.

The unfortunate hunter was a nephew of Mr. J. M. Severson of this town, and about five years ago visited his uncle when he lived in Still Pond. He was reared by Mr. Joseph Biggs, of Cecil county, and he had many friends here and in Cecil who were shocked to learn of his horrible death.
