## TREASURER'S NOVEMBER SITTINGS.

In pursuance of an Act of Assembly passed at the session in 1891, Chapter 252, the undersigned, Treasurer of Kent County, hereby gives notice that for the purpose of receiving the

## STATE AND COUNTY TAXES

In said county for the year 1915, he will sit for the November sitting in the several Election Districts between the hours of 10 A. M. and 3 P. M., on

Wednesday, November 24, Pomeroy—Wm. C. Townsend's Store, Rock Hall—Chesapeake House.

At all other times will be at the Treasurer's Office in Chestertown. The Treasurer's Office in the Court House will not be open on the above days.

The Treasurer's Office in the Court House will be open every day except on the above dates from 9 A. M. to 3 P. M. for the receipt of Taxes. Tax-payers will please take notice that taxes will be due and payable Sept. 1st, and that on bills unpaid on January 1st, interest will be charged and collected from Sept. 1st. On the first day of January all taxes unpaid are declared by law to be in arrears, and delinquents will be warned that unless settlement in full is made before April 1st, the claims against them will be placed in the hands of the Treasurer of the county, who will proceed to seize and sell their property to pay the taxes due with charges and all costs of sale. The Treasurer would, therefore, respectfully urge all tax-payers to pay promptly.

## A CHANCE FOR INVESTORS

### A New Cat and Rat Industry Which Promises Fat Financial Returns.

A well-known financier in Chestertown received the following letter from a prominent New York promoter the other day, a reply to which is appended:  
New York City, Oct. 26, 1915.

MR. \_\_\_\_\_  
Chestertown, Md.

DEAR SIR:  
Knowing that you were always interested in a good clean money making proposition, I take the liberty of presenting to you for your careful consideration what seems to me to offer wonderful money making possibilities, and in case you are not personally interested, I would like for you to take up the matter with some of your friends and capitalists.

We have organized a company under the laws of the State of Texas to operate a large cat ranch on Cat Island.

To start with, we will collect, say about one hundred thousand cats. Each cat will average twelve kittens a year. The skins run from 10 cents each for the white cat to 75 cents for the pure black. This will give us twelve million skins a year to sell at an average of 30 cents a piece, making our revenue about \$3,600,000 a day.

A man can skin 50 cats a day at \$2.00; it will take 100 to operate the ranch and, therefore, the net profit will be about \$9,800.00 daily.

We will feed the cats on rats and will start a rat ranch next door. The rats multiply four times as fast as the cats. If we start with one million rats we will have, therefore, four rats per day for each cat, which is plenty. We will then feed the rats on the carcasses of the cats from which the skins have been taken, giving each rat a fourth of a cat.

You will observe that one source of revenue has been apparently overlooked, that is the dispositions of the skins of the rats: We have under headway negotiations with one of the warring nations of the world to supply all of these rat skins for sausage casings. They are particularly well adapted for this use where sausages are supplied to the soldiers in the trenches during the winter months, as the hair can be left on the skins, keeping the contents warm.

The proposition has been passed on favorably by the War Council. Consider the possibilities for the future in the development of this wonderful undertaking. You will see that the business will be self-acting and automatic all the way through. The cats will eat the rats and the rats will eat the cats, and we will get the skins and the money.
